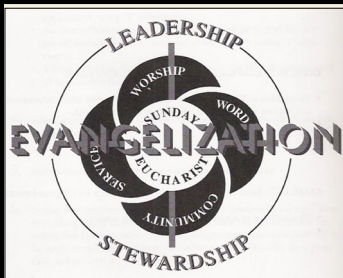

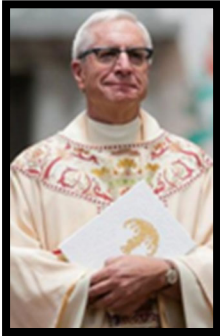

## A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

It could be that our whole lives are directed to answering two questions: “Who am I? ... and how do I fit in?” From our youngest days to our life’s end, these two are ever before us. At birth, parents and grandparents make us the reason for their life. With time the tide changes; sibling rivalry, team mates, teachers, even parents but not so much grandparents tell us: “Look, you aren’t the Messiah /the king, or the daddy, and don’t behave like a princess/queen/or mommy, you can’t play with us, we had you last time go to the other side now, and sometimes hurtful words; “Just who do you think you are? Don’t you get too uppity!” So, like the black swan, we are left to discover who we are and how we fit in. When the going gets tough, and we feel as if we are a fish out of water, many shrinks describe our condition as an “identity crisis.”

St. John the Baptist understood that he was not the headline act. Nope, he was the warm-up show. Never stealing the spotlight or any part of the show, John points away from himself to the guy who was to follow, Jesus the Savior. We admire him for knowing and keeping his place.

Then Jesus came along - the bright light shown on him. Today he understands his place from that heavenly voice and the lights of his birth: “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.” Yet this Messiah is identifying himself with sinners. He is not a sinner, but is among sinners, shoulder to shoulder with sinners. Once again divinity enters into the chaos of humanity. Mercy has been defined as entering into the chaos of other people. Jesus’ first public act is almost as bad as it gets.

When I was in priest-school, with the “t” pronounced clearly, for fear of being thrown out, I was prudent. I kept my mouth shut thinking that if I didn’t ask too many questions nobody would know how dumb I was or which matters of faith I didn’t understand. And really from my splendid education of sisters, brothers, priests and learned professors, there wasn’t much that I did not already understand! I did continually wonder why, if he knew that he was God, why Jesus would need to bother to be baptized. Didn’t he know? Humorously, in the carpenter’s shop did Jesus tell Joseph a different, more perfect way to make mitered corners? Did Joseph ask: “Just who do you think you are?”

Most likely not. Jesus keeps telling us who **we** are and how **we** fit into God’s plan. Jesus is the source of our identity. From the beginning the Good News to the baptized is: “God has come in the person of Christ to forgive our sins. With baptism, **You** are chosen, **You** fit in the Kingdom of God. **Your** joy is complete. Live life fully! No matter what anyone says of you; **You** have been chosen for eternal life.”

As a seminarian I began to question Jesus’ baptism less and live mine more. Maybe that’s what we should all do. On this Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, develop the single conviction that you are chosen by God to be His child and fit in with all of creation with the single vocation of building the Kingdom of God on Earth.

Coming out of the waters of your Baptism; Who are you and how do you fit in?

Psst! You are called to be a prophet in your neighborhood, your business, and your school.

What, if not the sacraments and friendship with the Lord, makes a difference in your life?

Today’s feast closes the Christmas season and opens the season of your chosen role and Christian vocation to be the one who proclaims God’s mercy to those who surround you.



## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION - THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Merry Christmas! Share that cheerful greeting with some folks today. They may wonder if you have had any Elvis sightings lately, attended Star Trek conventions, or were Cleopatra in a previous lifetime. Despite the skeptics, today is solidly within the Christmas season. In fact, in some strands of the Christian tradition it represents the clearest manifestation of the mystery of the Incarnation. On Christmas Day, for example, the Gospel reading is the Prologue of John’s Gospel, which reveals the glory of Christ shining through our humanity precisely in his baptism.

At any rate, this is an ancient feast, celebrated first in Egypt sixteen centuries ago. More than most other ancient people, the Egyptians understood the life-giving properties of water. On this day, they drew water from the Nile, so central in the history of their people, and reserved it in honor. Many other places copied the custom, so that St. John Chrysostom wrote of people in Antioch gathering at midnight to collect flowing water into vessels they brought from home since “today there is a blessing on the water.” At home for dinner tonight, decorate the table with beautiful bowls of water and white candles, toast one another with goblets of sparkling water, and light a Christmas candle in the window one last time.

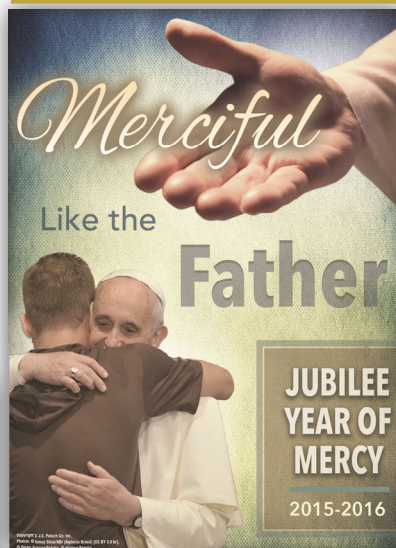

**Feast of the Baptism of the Lord**  
Fittingly, this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* is also the Lectionary's Year of Luke, for Luke's Gospel highlights God's mercy in finding the lost, healing the sick, restoring the broken, comforting the sorrowful, forgiving the sinner through Jesus' ministry. But before *doing*, Luke's Jesus is always *praying*. As practical moderns programmed to measure worth by productivity, we instinctively appreciate the Jubilee's call to

embrace the practical challenges of our baptism. But today, Luke focuses not on Jesus being baptized, but on Jesus praying after baptism. So must we pray to become the disciples we are called to be, that the Spirit empower us to do what disciples are called to do. Imitating Jesus' openness to the Spirit will enable us to cooperate with the grace that transforms us into "beloved sons [and daughters] . . . in whom the Father is well pleased," living out, in this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, the extraordinary potential of our baptism.
