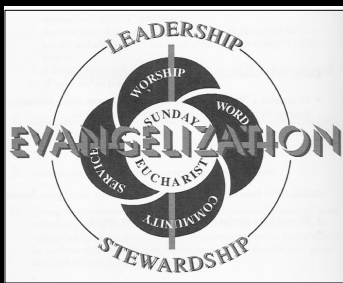

From the Pastor ~

Dale Evans Rogers wrote a phrase often quoted about Christmas that seems right as we celebrate our yearly Christmas festival this weekend. She writes: "Christmas, my child, is love in action. Every time we love, every time we give, it's Christmas." While

that seems so obvious and unaffected, the practice can be challenging. This leads me to say how grateful I am for those of you who sent me a Christmas card. Some had a short note inside with kind-hearted sentiments. Thank you for the gifts you sent, for the plants and food, for remembering our Servite community here at St. Juliana.....may you be blessed.

The writer Henry Van Dyke has some Christmas thoughts that lift us beyond the familiar story of the birth of Jesus as the Christ. He writes: "Are you willing to forget what you have done for other people, and to remember what other people have done for you...to remember the weakness and loneliness of people who are growing old...Are you willing to believe that love is the strongest thing in the world...stronger than hate, stronger than evil, stronger than death...Then you can keep Christmas! But you can never keep it alone."

These past weeks St. Juliana parish staff, school community and outreach ministry have devoted hours upon hours to "keep" Christmas and elevate it above the ordinary and familiar. Prayers have been prayed; Masses celebrated; children educated; the homeless fed; the sick comforted; the needy consoled; sins forgiven; gifts exchanged and blessings received. Yes! We are a "willing people."

The Christmas trees, the sparkling lights, the lovely poinsettia plants, the burning candles, the smell of incense, the nativity scene realistically portrayed, and the liturgy proclaimed in word and song, by their very nature at Christmas time place us in the embrace of God who chose to be "one like us in all things except sin." For us to pave the way for this to happen here in our parish, we needed to be "intentional" people, that is, people who deliberately choose to make wonderful things happen. No, we are not a mega church! No, we are not perfect! No, we do not have all the answers! But I say, for the most part, we are faithful. Mary, the Virgin Mother of God, whose "yes" faith opened the way for Jesus to enter into our human condition, teaches us that when we spend our days saying "yes" to God, there is no time to be saying "no" to God. So let us continue to be a willing people, an intentional people, a yes people. The well known commentator Eric Sevareid summed up all this when he said: "As long as we know in our hearts what Christmas ought to be, Christmas is."



A little humorous story I read some time ago brought a smile to my face because it is so true. We have an innate ability to get ourselves off the hook. The story is entitled: "You Better Be Good." Sarah, a headstrong 2-year old, had been fighting a lot with her 13-year old sister. "I'll just have to tell Santa about your misbehavior," her mother said to the toddler, as she picked up the phone and dialed. Sarah's eyes grew big as her mother described to "Santa" (really, Sarah's uncle) how the 2-year old was acting. Then Mom handed Sarah the phone.

"Santa," in a deep voice, explained to the little girl how there would be no presents Christmas morning for children who fought with their sisters. He would be watching, and he expected things to be better from now on. Sarah nodded solemnly at each of Santa's remarks. When Sarah hung up, Mom asked, "What did Santa say to you?" Sadly, Sarah told her, "Santa said he won't be bringing toys to my sister this year."

Hopefully this coming week will be a slower paced week for you. There will only be one morning Mass at 8am this week. Enjoy the Christmas season until the Baptism of Our Lord which we celebrate on Monday, January 9<sup>th</sup>.

The pew cards in Church were purchased for your use to enable a better response to the invitations at Mass. My observation from the altar is that not many parishioners are using the cards and seem to be satisfied with no response or a very weak one. I would encourage you to use the pew cards and practice the responses when you are present for Mass.

As you will no doubt observe, we have added extra Eucharistic Ministers at all the weekend Masses. The intent is to help shorten the time it takes to administer the consecrated body and blood of our Lord. While we have definite assignments for the ministers, there may be times when we will need extra Eucharistic Ministers when the assigned ones cannot come. If you are an EM and you are at Mass, I ask you to help when there is a need.

After parish life returns to Ordinary Time, that is, at the end of the Christmas/Epiphany season, St. Juliana Parents' Club and school community will be encouraging you to support the yearly school auction and dinner dance. The date in 2012 will be February 4<sup>th</sup> and it will be held again in the Parish Center. This is a major fundraiser for the school and its success will impact the school budget. I hope you will participate in this exciting and festive affair.

As year 2011 comes to an end, it is customary for parishioners to think about year-end giving to the parish either through the building fund or PSA. St. Juliana parishioners have been very generous in response to our financial needs, especially in paying down our debt.

The Nicene Creed we pray at Mass has a series of statements that we ascribe to our faith. Christian D. Larson has written a secular Creed which is a fitting preparation to the closing of year 2011. He writes a Creed: "To be so strong that nothing can disturb your peace of mind; to talk health, happiness, and prosperity; to make your friends feel that there is something in them; to look on the sunny side of everything; to think only of the best; to be just as enthusiastic about the success of others as you are about your own; to forget the mistakes of the past and profit by them; to wear a cheerful countenance and give a smile to everyone you meet; to be too large for worry, too noble for anger, too strong for fear, and too happy to permit the presence of trouble."

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

An old joke asks, "What time is Midnight Mass?" The answer is not really obvious, since Christmas is unique in having several distinct celebrations. Vigil Mass hinges on the family heritage of Jesus and his origins. The concept of "midnight" predates clock time, and really has to do with a celebration in the hours of darkness. Years ago, it was not possible to receive Communion without fasting for a full day, so the late hour of this Mass made it possible for the people to receive. The first Mass after sunrise, the Mass at Dawn, was once known as "The Shepherds' Mass," and later Masses set aside stories of Jesus' birth to focus on the key to the day's celebration: John the Evangelist's majestic theology of Christ's identity as the Word made flesh, dwelling among us. One feast, four separate Masses. Only monasteries manage the whole round. Parishioners typically take just one entry point into the mystery. Yet there is much to savor and celebrate in the coming of Christ into the world. Christmas is not a day, but a season. You still have two weeks to send those Christmas cards before you're officially late!

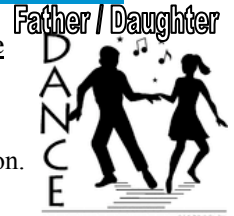

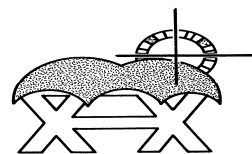

## PSA 2011 - A GREAT YEAR GETTING BETTER!

We are most grateful to all of our parish families who have pledged to this year's Pastoral Services Appeal campaign. We have set records in number of donors and number of pledges. 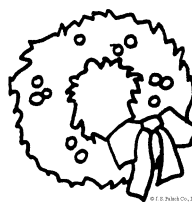

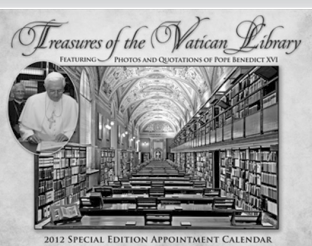

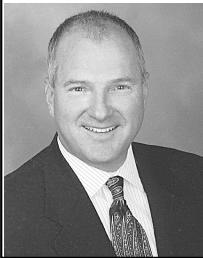
