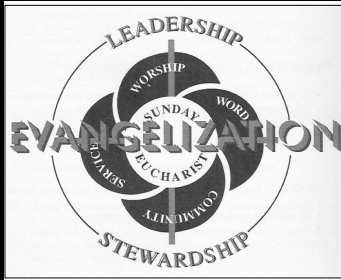

From the Pastor ~

As I look back on 2011, I ask myself what will be different for me personally this year 2012? I have a list of concerns I want to address. Some are easily fixed. Others will take a great deal more intentionality. I'll need to work harder to live fully and not let the trivialities that sometimes distract me get in the way. I know this much, I want every year of my life to be a little better than the previous year. Does that make sense to you, too?

My quest reminds me of a quote from the great Jesuit teacher, retreat director, and spiritual guide, Father Anthony De Mello, S.J. He said: *"Both what you run from---and what you yearn for---are within you."* I believe that and I have spent a good portion of my life examining what that quote means for me.

In his book *Taking Flight* he tells a story which is humorous on the surface but deeper in meaning. *A couple of hunters chartered a plane to fly them into forest territory. Two weeks later the pilot came to take them back. He took a look at the animals they had shot and said, "This plane won't take more than one wild buffalo. You'll have to leave the other behind." "But last year the pilot let us take two in a plane this size," the hunters protested. The pilot was doubtful, but finally he said, "Well, if you did it last year I guess we can do it again." So the plane took off with the three men and two buffaloes. But it couldn't gain height and crashed into a neighboring hill. The men climbed out and looked around. One hunter said to the other, "Where do you think we are?" The other inspected the surroundings and said, "I think we're about two miles to the left of where we crashed last year."*

I found "Next Year's Plan" by an unknown author helpful. The author suggests eight steps to setting and achieving your New Year's goals. This plan seems to be consistent with the process our pastoral council has employed to develop goals for the parish and strategies for action. What we plan corporately, can also apply individually.

The author of this plan lists eight steps we can take: *Step One: Write down your goals. Make them specific; make sure you can measure the goals. Track your progress to that goal. Step Two: Write down why you want to achieve the goal. List all the ways you will personally benefit from achieving the goal. Step Three: Analyze exactly where you are now in reaching that goal. Note the strengths that will help you, the weaknesses that could hurt you, and the opportunities you can use to attain what you want. Step Four: Write down what you'll need to invest to achieve your goal. Whether it's time, money, or something else, know what reaching this goal could "cost" you. Step Five: Determine what you need to learn in order to reach the goal. Will you need to take classes to learn a new skill? And what kind of information do you need access to? Step Six: Identify all the people who can serve as your support group. This may also include organizations that can help you. Step Seven: Develop a game plan. Set deadlines for achieving your goals. List specific dates on which you want to complete the various steps of the plan. Step Eight: Celebrate. Give yourself a reward for achieving the various steps in your game plan and a final reward for achieving the intended goal.*

Perhaps you may wonder what all this has to do with you. That is perfectly understandable. It makes more sense when you

understand that every single person in our parish is gifted. The more committed we are to growing not only in our Catholic Faith but also in those aspects of our life that determine our health, happiness, joy, peace and comfort, to that extent our parish will thrive. Keep this in mind as you think about your contribution to the life of the parish and our future. You might say setting goals is also a form of accountability and good stewardship.

You may remember that this Sunday afternoon Dr. John Yzaguirre and his wife Claire will be presenting a mini-retreat from 12:00 noon until 3:30pm in the Parish Center based on their *"Thriving Marriages"* program and book. Everyone is invited. While there is a small fee, please come even if you cannot pay the \$10. So far the response has been minimal and I am afraid this will be a missed opportunity. Remember this is not about troubled marriages, although the topic will be treated. The program is to highlight strategies for strengthening marriages. The subtitle to their book reads: *"An Inspirational and Practical Guide to lasting Happiness."*

This weekend we bring our week of prayer for vocations to priesthood, ministry, and religious life to a close. The presentation at Mass this weekend is intended to help us become aware of the necessity of prayer and encouragement in helping to foster vocations to the church but also to our Servite Order. We hope to have an information night for those interested in joining the next formation class for the Order of Secular Servants of Mary (OSSM) here at St. Juliana.

St. Juliana Junior High program under the direction of Scott Kambak has some really fun programs planned. Last Wednesday our Junior High students heard a presentation by an historical interpreter portraying Father Junipero Serra, founder of the California Missions. Next Sunday, January 22nd the annual Ice Skating Party will take place from 1pm to 3pm at Anaheim Ice in Anaheim. What a great winter activity even if its 70 degrees outside. Scott has been the director of this program for over thirty years and has given a great deal of time to planning activities and keeping the interest of our young students.

St. Juliana parish has been blessed with hardworking and devoted deacons: Deacon Gerhard Stadel, Deacon Bill Schlater, and Deacon Jay Milam now ministering at St. Boniface. Deacon Bill is retired but is available on a need basis to help in our ministerial needs. Deacon Gerhard is now the lone full-time deacon for the parish. Gerhard and Bill have been invaluable these past years not only for their expertise but also for their devotion to duty and ministry. I have asked the Diocese to appoint another Deacon to the parish but so far I have not heard anything.

However, I am happy to announce that parishioner Pete Lauder has been accepted into the diaconate program for the Diocese of Orange. Recently Peter e-mailed me: *"Jan and I have completed our first year of classes...We have also completed our detention ministry training and will begin to work in the OC jails this month, doing communion services....Both Jan and I are enjoying the process...and have made many friends...and would ask for your continued prayers and support."*

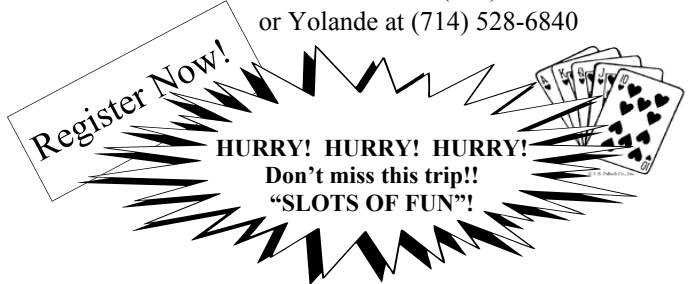

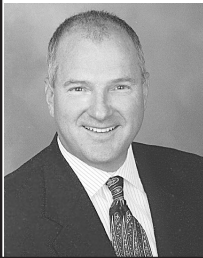
