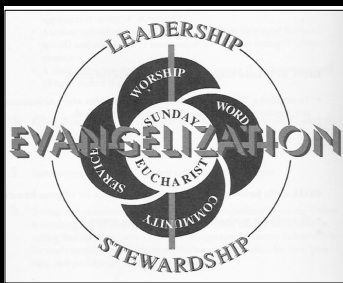

From the Pastor ~

Every weekend I usually end the parish announcements at Mass with these words: "Please take home a Sunday bulletin as you leave church. An usher will be happy to hand you one. After you have read it, please share it with a neighbor." This reminder emphasizes the importance of having access to information needed to not only be informed but also to be active in parish life. If you leave Mass sometimes without a bulletin, please consider taking one every Sunday. It means so much to me, knowing that you have the information necessary to be an active parishioner. Also consider going onto our church website at www.stjulianachurch.org ~ this website has recently been updated and provides valuable information regarding flourishing ministry events, faith formation activities, various meetings and community gatherings happening in our parish and school.

Many were disappointed that the *Thriving Marriage* mini retreat last Saturday had to be cancelled because of Dr. John Yzaguirre's sudden illness. Dr. John and his wife Claire currently co-direct the California Prosocial Institute in Irvine. Every year over 30,000 people from all over the United States involved in marriage and family life ministries participate in their formation programs.

We celebrate Catholic Schools Week beginning next Sunday, January 29th to February 5th. To kick-off this week of celebration our children and parents will participate in the 9am and 11am Masses. There will also be a second collection at all the Masses for the school. Your gift will be set aside to assist with tuition costs and to maintain our school's financial stability. At the 11am Mass our new school board will be installed. St. Juliana Falcon Gala Auction and Derby is just around the corner on Saturday, February 4, 2012. This year's Theme is "Run for the Roses." The evening begins at 5:30 pm with the silent auction and then continues with dinner, dancing and live auction. It is my hope that the Gala will be an opportunity for the parish and school communities to support one another and continue to be one family.

Our Respect Life committee under the direction of Barbara Legas and Claire McKellogg has been an influential force in implementing the Catholic Church's position in protecting the life of the unborn. St. Juliana parishioners have been very supportive of our efforts to do our part in helping to overturn Roe v Wade. This weekend we celebrate the 39th anniversary of Roe v Wade on January 22nd. In observance of this anniversary that legalized abortion in the United States, Bishop Brown invites all the Catholic community to observe January 22nd *Day of Reparation* through fasting, abstinence and prayer. be an evening prayer service at Holy Family Cathedral on Monday, January 23rd at 7:00pm.

St. Juliana parishioners have participated in dinners for the homeless for many years. In addition to the FIES (Fullerton Interfaith Emergency Services) program for homeless working adults, there is ISN (Interfaith Shelter Network), which is sponsored by American Family Housing. The ISN offers temporary housing for homeless adults who are working or seeking jobs and saving for independent housing. 10-12 adults are housed and offered job skills, training and interviews, if needed for several months. Members of St. Juliana's parish, particularly from the Small Christian Communities, have been providing dinners when needed, as we do not have facilities for overnight stays. Perhaps you have heard of *Retrouville* (pronounced *retro-vi*). It is an international peer ministry originating in the Catholic Church and a lifeline for troubled marriages. *Retrouville* helps couples through difficult times in their marriages. It is designed to provide tools to help get your marriage back on track. This program has helped tens of thousands of couples experiencing marital difficulty at all levels. *Retrouville* has met here at St. Juliana's a number of times. Every year the Diocese of Orange sponsors *Priest Study Days* usually in January. This year I will be attending two of the three days this Monday and Tuesday, January 23 & 24 at Santiago de Compostela Church in Lake Forest. The theme this year is "Growing In Wisdom, Age and Grace." Monday's topic is *Appreciative Inquiry*. This day will address the essential role of priestly leadership in building a culture of life and hope within parishes and other ministries. Tuesday's topic is *Emotional Intelligence*. Practical guidelines will be given about when and how to express emotions in appropriate ways, improve communication, enhance self-esteem, deepen empathy and increase self-confidence while coping with life's challenges. I look forward to learning and practicing the insights and knowledge I hope to attain. The goal of these study days is dedicated to "Being Happy, Healthy, Holy Priests."

Thomas McSweeney's book *Better to Light One Candle* makes some suggestions "just for today." He says: "Just for today: Be friendly and pleasant to all you meet, try to focus on the good in every situation, do all you do to the best of your ability, find something to praise in another rather than criticize, be grateful to be alive. Just for today: Don't complain about anything, don't compare yourself to anyone else, don't gossip. Just for today: Let another's opinion be more important than your own, try to include others in conversation, reach out to relieve another's loneliness or pain. Just for today: Take the time to visit Jesus in prayer, listen carefully to what he says to you and allow your conversation with him to revisit you throughout the rest of the day and night."

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY JANUARY 10, 2012 MEETING

The Council reviewed the Christmas season attendance, Mass schedule, and effective use of our facilities and practices. A few lessons learned will be incorporated into next season's planning. Mr. Hizon would like us to know that a primary complaint against lawyers is that they do not timely return phone calls or that when clients call the lawyer's office, they only speak to a receptionist, secretary, or paralegal, not the lawyer. As a sole practitioner, he focuses on corresponding with clients directly as much as possible and as soon as possible.

Most of us drive cars and the law requires that all the drivers carry automobile liability insurance. Having handled automobile accident cases for over 20 years, very often he finds that potential clients/clients who consult his office are underinsured and do not have the proper coverage on their policies. Bluntly put Mr. Hizon says that they do not know what they are paying for when they make their premium payments. As a seasoned lawyer he can explain in layman's terms what coverage applies to what type of loss, how the coverage interacts with each other, how automobile insurance interacts with health insurance, why every insured should carry a specific type of medical payments coverage and uninsured motorists coverage, etc. Each insured should understand this and act before being a victim of an unexpected accident. 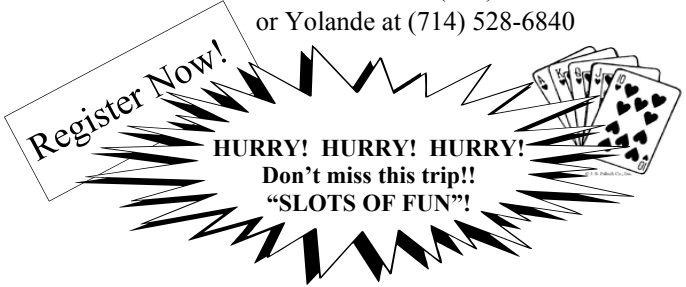

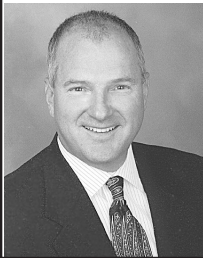

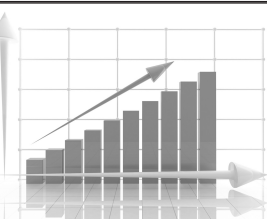
