From the Pastor ~

The writer Joseph Wood Krutch wrote this statement: "Cats seem to go on the principle that it never does any harm to ask for what you want." While we can chuckle at the truth of that statement,

I believe each one of us struggles with the ability to ask for what we need. We can go for years with unmet needs. Others may seem distant from our yearnings. It can be lonely if the distance between contentment and insufficiency widens.

During this past year we have made many sacrifices together in order to help accomplish our vision of a parish where needs are met. We continue to do a good job taking care of our facilities' needs. We now have a new sound system, a state of the art digital electronic organ, church doors that after repairs work reasonably well, new outdoor church carpeting, high efficiency LED lights replacing the aging incandescent spots in church and new sacristy carpeting to mention a few. Our financial needs have been met with plausible success. This past year we have had an increase in PSA involvement, a steady offertory collection, a modest increase in year-end giving and recently, we hired a full time Advancement Coordinator to plan for future financial needs. With a new director of Faith Formation our spiritual needs are being met with a revitalized SRE program, a promising adult education and speaker series, a yearly Parish Mission, an engaging worship committee and a reconnection between the parish and the academic and faith activities of the school community. Our newly elected pastoral council continues to find ways to meet our leadership needs by revising the structure of the council, establishing a one year and five year strategic plan based on a new mission/vision statement and introducing a structure for accountability.

On a personal note, I believe that the ministry of our Servite community, now reduced to two full-time parish priests, Fr. Paul and myself, has been faithful to our call to serve and lead. While noting that leadership styles may vary, essentially our life among you has exhibited both loyalty and availability. I believe that many appreciate and support us. We are especially grateful at this time of year for those who were kind to send us a Christmas card or gift.

These are just a few reflections looking backwards. We have more work to do. Thankfully, God isn't finished with us yet. We will know how far we have come when we can make the words of St. John the Baptist ours" "prepare the way of the Lord." Everything is for the Lord and His purposes.

I have never found New Year's resolutions to be very helpful. If I were to choose one resolution to work on, I would choose the ability to be more confident. In a publication called *The Office Professional* the writer has a few suggestions on how to develop more self confidence. He writes: "In business---and in life---it's important to be confident in your abilities. Studies have shown that confident people are more apt to seek out and meet new challenges. A sense of self-confidence will also change the way other people view you: Confident people are considered to be more successful, more reliable, and more able to perform in the clutch. Here are three things you can do to help you increase your self-confidence: 1) Create a 'confidence file' for yourself. Put a list of your recent achievements on paper, and stick it in a file folder; put any awards in the file; stick any complimentary letters or notes in there; if your boss

praises you, ask to get it in writing, and then put it in your file. Any time you are feeling down on yourself, review your confidence file to give yourself a lift. 2) Celebrate even the smallest victory. Learn to revel in your success. Before you go to bed at night, write down three things you did during the day that you are proud of. It doesn't matter how small the item is. Just writing down three things every night will build self-confidence. 3) Don't wallow in your mistakes. Humans make mistakes; always have, always will. Don't punish yourself for making mistakes. Learn from them. And then get on with your life."

Perhaps entering into a new year and a year older can seem daunting. What are we to expect in our personal lives and in our spiritual lives? Will we be happy? Successful? Still have a job? Family life okay? Whatever our concerns may be, one thing is for sure: all will be well if we nurture courage, fidelity, faith and love. Instead of closing our eyes and hoping for the best, we can face the future with the certainty of our Faith.

I would encourage you to mark your calendar for the afternoon mini-retreat sponsored by our Faith Formation program called: *"Thriving Marriages"* presented by Dr. John and Claire Yzaguirre here at St. Juliana on Sunday, January 15, 2012 from 12:30pm to 3:30pm in the Parish Center. A licensed psychologist and family therapist, Dr. John and Claire, are deeply committed to helping couples achieve resilient, united and joyful marriages. With over 28 years of clinical and ministry experience, each year they train thousands of couples with their programs and assist churches from various dioceses and denominations in their marriage and family programs. They are the co-authors of *"Thriving Marriages: An Inspirational & Practical Guide to Lasting Happiness."*

The Church sets aside every New Year's Day to acknowledge the pivotal role that Mary played in God's plan for our salvation. While January 1st is New Year's Day, our liturgical calendar names it: "*Mary, Mother of God.*" We honor the woman who became a vessel for the divine by opening her life and her heart to the Spirit of God. Like Mary, each of us is a sacred vessel that is pregnant with God in the Spirit and empowered by grace to give birth to Christ in the World.

Kathy Coffey in her little pamphlet entitled: "What is Mary All About" writes "...When we negotiate life's difficult passages, such as unplanned pregnancy, poverty, exile, fear, wrenching separations, mystifying children, bigotry, violence or tragic deaths, we can follow Mary who also endured these ordeals. An ordinary woman in a remote village, member of a minority oppressed by conquering Romans, she had a tremendous effect on the world. Her experience proves that NO human life is small or unimportant. If we too respond generously to God's initiatives, we too can carry the 'family resemblance,' looking like our Mother Mary at a deep level within."

I will be meeting soon with our Servite Secular Order community to discuss an information night for parishioners who would like to know more about the "Order of Secular Servants of Mary (OSSM)." The present community consists of six members and the name of the community is: "St. Juliana of the Eucharist." I hope you will consider joining the formation program.



BOX TOPS FOR EDUCATION
