

From the Pastor ~

We bring the Christmas Season to a close this weekend with the dual celebrations of the Epiphany of Our Lord and on Monday, the Baptism of Our Lord. In his little pamphlet of Christmas reflections, author Jerry Welte writes of these two feasts. He pens:

"The Epiphany celebrates the universality of Christ's message, the truth that the Lord is born for Jews and Gentiles alike. All those who seek the Lord are guided in faith to the place where Christ is born in their lives. As we walk by the light of Christ, we experience 'epiphany moments,' sudden insights into God's plan or revelations of God's presence in our world."

With regard to Monday's feast of the Baptism of the Lord Jerry Welte continues, "The Baptism of the Lord is like the 'God housekeeping seal of approval' on Christ's mission. In a very mystical fashion, Jesus is confirmed as the preeminent ambassador of God's kingdom. In a similar way through baptism, each of us is named as a beloved child of God and sent forth with God's approval as a prophet to proclaim the kingdom of peace and justice."

During the days leading up to your family gathering on Christmas Day no doubt you were busy with all the details of shopping, wrapping gifts, decorating the house, baking favorite cookies, and preparing the living room for the family Christmas tree. Time passes. Here we are two weeks later and one week into the New Year and we wonder what has changed in our circumstances. The day after Christmas the world around us returned to its familiar routine. Perhaps we have also returned to our everyday routine

Wouldn't it be marvelous if we could duplicate the Christmas excitement and sentiment everyday of our lives? Isn't that what Jesus had in mind? The child inside of us that relishes Christmas wants to be happy and peaceful. The child inside of us desires love and nurture. The simplicity of the Christmas message, the host of characters who enter and leave the scene, the poverty of the birthplace and the lowing animals speak to us of how different our lives would be if we could claim the story of Bethlehem and make it our story. Everyone associated with the Christmas Gospel narrative experienced a shift. The shepherds, the Virgin Mother, the foster father, the townspeople, the three kings, all found their lives enlarged. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could develop in our lives the gifts of love, patience, forbearance, faithfulness, gratitude and steadfastness? All these simple virtues are found somewhere in the Christmas story and they can be found in our story too!

The great Jesuit teacher, preacher, spiritual director and story-teller, Anthony DeMello, S.J., writes this story about a family of five who were enjoying their day at the beach. The children were bathing in the ocean and making castles in the sand when in the distance a little old lady appeared. Her gray hair was blowing in the wind and her clothes were dirty and ragged. She was muttering something to herself as she picked up things from the beach and put them into a bag. The parents called the children to their side and told them to stay away from the old lady. As she passed by, bending down every now and then to pick things up, she smiled at the family. But her greeting was not returned. Many weeks later they learned that the little old lady had made it her lifelong crusade to pick up bits of glass

from the beach so children wouldn't cut their feet.

The author Barbara Glanz in her book *Spreading Contagious Enthusiasm* writes: "Sooner or later we all become preoccupied with time and making the most of what we have. Yet the value we place on time will be different for each of us based on our perception of it: *To realize the value of one year, ask a student who failed a final exam; To realize the value of one month, ask the mother of a premature baby; To realize the value of one week, ask the editor of a weekly magazine; To realize the value of one day, ask a daily wage laborer with kids to feed; To realize the value of one hour, ask two people in love waiting to meet; To realize the value of one minute, ask the person who barely missed the train; To realize the value of one second, ask the person who just avoided an accident; To realize the value of one millisecond, ask the person who won a silver Olympic medal."* 

Looking back over the past few weeks we can all rejoice in the talents and dedication of our parishioners who made the Christmas celebration so beautiful. The decorators, musicians, worshippers, greeters, parents, children, outreach volunteers, and gift bearers brought the "Spirit of Christmas" alive for all of us to enjoy.

Our Parish Pastoral Council met in December and continues to work on implementing our revised Parish Mission and Vision statements (revised statements are now on the cover page of this bulletin.) The work of the council to create our one year and five year strategic planning and goal setting is beginning to take shape. Soon all parish organizations will be asked to implement these goals.

The school *Gala Auction and Dinner Dance* will be held on Saturday, February 4, 2012 in the Parish Center. In past years the Auction was supported mainly by school parents. My hope this year will be for a significant mix of school parents and parishioners. With that mix, we can begin to develop a stronger link between the school community and the parish at large. The school is a ministry of the parish and not a separate entity. Parish and school along with our SRE program are forever linked into one education and faith formation ministry.

Please take some time to read the enclosed flyer in the bulletin announcing the upcoming "Mini-Retreat for Couples" Conducted by Dr. John Yzaguirre and Clair Yzaguirre, licensed Psychologist and Marriage and Family Therapist. Dr. John and Claire are also co-creators of the "Thriving Marriages" program and book given to thousands of couples throughout Southland churches. As I was thinking on how to end my reflections this week, I suddenly came across a notebook with some trivia I jotted down at one time. Believe me, this is really trivia. Here are a few: Forty people are sent to the Hospital for dog bites every minute; 40,000 Americans are injured by toilets each year; The average person over 50 will have spent 5 years waiting in lines; Your feet are bigger in the afternoon than any other time of day; Most of us have eaten a spider in our sleep." Ugh!


