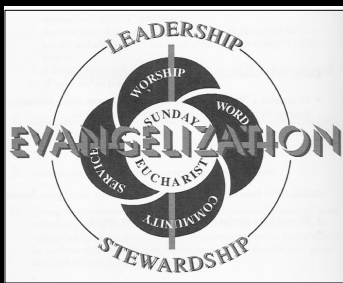

My birthday celebration recently far exceeded any past remembrance. "Happy Birthday Fr. Frank" on the electric sign took me by surprise. I have always had a soft spot for birthdays. In previous years before coming to California, I would take a few days off and travel to Northern Illinois and Wisconsin to spend some quality time with the Fall weather and changing colors. It is an ideal time of year weather wise and even though the seasonal change here in Southern California is not as dramatic, my summer visit to the Central Coast and wine country certainly compensated for what I experienced back East.

Another unexpected birthday good fortune was the amount of cards, notes, gifts, and hugs I received. All in all I felt the love and kindness of so many St. Juliana parishioners, staff, children, and friends. Our children from the parish school and SRE wrote homemade cards and sent them over to my office where I read each one individually until my eyes blurred. They were colorful, inventive, and often humorous. Children are so free with loving words. They are not afraid to express feelings even if they are not totally sure what they mean.

I don't have space for all the messages contained in children's cards but here are a few which I kept aside to share with you. Little James said: *"I hope something good happens to you."* Emma wrote: *"Happy Birthday! You are a great pastor. You're at the top ranking. Keep up the good work."* Sharon wrote: *"Violets are blue, your birthday is soon, and we all love you!"* Tiffany said: *"Happy Birthday! Lookin' good for only twenty-five!"* Luke colored in: *"Happy B-day, Fr. Frank. I hope you have a great time and don't mind spending a few more dollars around town."* Elissa had this to tell me: *"Dear Father Frank, You are the best person I ever met."* Kalee's card was bright orange and she wrote: *"Happy Birthday! I hope you have a great time. I always loved when you would say the Gospel and ask us questions. Break a leg and eat a lot of cake."* In a three-dimensional card that opened up with cut-outs an unsigned card read: *"Happy Birthday, Father Frank! Enjoy my replica of the church."* A new student, Sabrina, noted: *"Happy Birthday! I don't know you very well and I plan on getting to know you better."*

The month of October is Respect Life month. This weekend is special for St. Juliana since we will have a guest speaker from Birth Choice Health Clinics speaking at all the Masses. The Birth Choice Mobile Clinic will be outside of the Parish Center for all to see. In a very moving testimony a young client by the name of Jessica wrote of her experience in the *Birth Choice Health Clinic 2011 Ministry Report*. She writes: *"It was the love and commitment from Birth Choice Health Clinics that saved my son's life, kept my marriage from destruction, and gave me a meaningful purpose. I came to Birth Choice after leaving a local abortion clinic, unable to terminate my pregnancy because there was too much water in my system to perform the abortion. I was rescheduled to have the abortion in a few weeks. In the meantime, I decided to get an ultrasound. I found your clinic on line, not knowing it would change my life forever. The ultrasound showed the four little chambers of the beating heart. The complexity of the life that was living in me made me realize what a miracle it truly was to be pregnant; in fact it melted my heart and brought tears to my eyes. I thought this baby was going to ruin my career and my plans. I didn't think the timing was right to have a baby. I am married to a Godly man who wanted to keep the baby, was brought up in a Christian home, and wrote papers against abortion in college. But when I was faced with an unplanned pregnancy, I was going to make the choice to ruin the life in me because I thought it would ruin my own life by choosing to be a parent. I thank God for Birth Choice Health Clinics because I couldn't have been more wrong. That day I made a vow before God to keep my baby, and I am so thankful I kept that vow. I choose to surrender my agenda and walk in faith instead."*

The statistics show that in the Birth Choice Health Clinics, nearly 80% of women who see their baby on the ultrasound decline abortion as an option for their pregnancy. From time to time the Pastoral Council suggestion box located off the parking lot front entrance of the church has one or more handwritten notes from an anonymous scribe; usually a complaint. *"The Church is too cold/too hot."* *"The rug is disgraceful. Get a new rug."* *"The Mass is too long and the music lousy."* *"Why don't you say something about the way people dress...especially teenage girls?"* *"Go over to St. Joseph's if you want to hear good music."* These are just a few examples. Rarely, if ever does someone write a kind word or make a practical suggestion. Let me say that the "suggestion box" can be better utilized and more productive if writers who have concerns would use the new forms which include a place for a signature and a telephone number so that the council can address their concerns personally. A productive example would be to fill out the form with these or similar words: *"I have noticed the rug getting worn and it looks awful. I would like to meet with someone to discuss ways we could make the rug look better or replace it. I would be willing to help raise funds or find others to help. Sincerely yours, Mary Jones (000)-000-000."*

Our Knights of Columbus will celebrate their annual Communion Mass and Breakfast this Sunday. I strongly urge men of the parish to consider joining this industrious Catholic Men's organization. The Knights have led the way in keeping Catholic social and political issues in the public square, especially Religious Freedom.

I am happy to announce that we have three donors who have come forward to help pay for the new altar server processional candles. One candle is paid for. The second candle is \$450. Any donation will help.

I would like to continue with the second installment of a five-part series on *Faithful Citizenship* taken from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*. The Bishops write: *"Unfortunately, politics in our country often can be a contest of powerful interests, partisan attacks, and media hype. The Church calls for a different kind of political engagement: one shaped by the moral convictions of well-formed consciences and focused on the dignity of every human being, the pursuit of the common good, and the protection of the vulnerable. As Catholics, we should be guided more by our moral convictions than by our attachment to a political party or interest group. Our participation should help transform the party to which we belong; we should not let the party neglect fundamental moral truths. We are called to bring together our principles, political choices, values and our votes, to help build a better world."*

The Fall Festival report will be published soon. It takes a few weeks for all the numbers to come in so that we have an accurate count of income and expense. The preliminary summary indicates that the Festival did better than last year with additional sponsors, more donated food items, better control of the games and prizes, and an over-all higher participation by parishioners and residents. There were a number of neighboring festivals taking place at the same time as ours. However, the impact seems to be minimal.

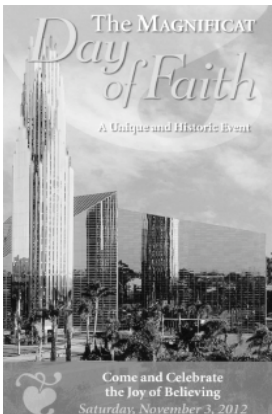
