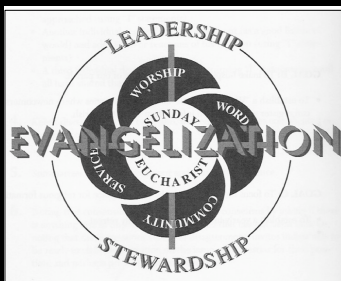

I returned last Friday evening from a “once in a life time” pilgrimage that included a visit to the two most popular Marian Shrines, *Fatima (Portugal)* and *Lourdes (France)*. The entire experience really defies description. It’s a “*like you need to be there*” happening that only you can fathom. You feel something at first and only later do you understand that what you felt was a movement of the *Holy Spirit*.

I have been asked: *What is a Pilgrimage?* A Pilgrimage differs from a tour in several important ways. It is a personal invitation from God, comprised of His offer and dependent upon the pilgrim’s acceptance. In the document I received when I inquired about the pilgrimage I read these words: *A pilgrimage is a spiritual journey to which the pilgrim joyfully responds “yes” to God’s invitation. A pilgrimage is a time of prayer and to witness the miraculous signposts God has left for our return to him. A successful pilgrimage involves a commitment to leave behind one’s problems and to focus instead on seeking to learn more about our heavenly Father, making one’s heart full of desire for special graces, praises, petitions, and thanksgiving, returning home transformed, renewed and restored by the abundant blessings received. Pilgrimages, journeys to sacred places for religious motives, are as old as civilization. Since the earliest times, such journeys have been made as acts of devotion, penance, or thanksgiving or in search of blessings or miracles.*

When I started out on my “spiritual journey” I was not sure what kind of pilgrim I would be. I had concerns about being with strangers, the daily routine, my health and stamina, traveling, food, language, expenses, etc. My experience of pilgrims during my years as the director of Our Lady of Sorrows Basilica Shrine in Chicago was that every pilgrim is different.

There is the *Anonymous Pilgrim*. He the one who is quiet, doesn’t say much, and wants to be left alone. That was sort of appealing to me at the beginning. The *Travelogue Pilgrim* has his camera in hand and wants to make sure he captures every place, person, and thing on film. He is sincere but mostly distracted. The *Seeker Pilgrim* is the one who is looking for a miracle, a sign from God, an answer to a prayer. He wants something tangible like a bolt of lightning or a mysterious nudge on the shoulder. The *Professional Pilgrim* likes to duplicate the pilgrimage experience as many times as possible. He will join a pilgrimage at the drop of a hat and likes to be able to say, “*I’ve been there.*” He is mostly sincere but for him “more is better.” The *Penitent Pilgrim* comes closest to the traditional pilgrim. He or she wants to unburden his conscience by praying, fasting, going to confession and participating in all the religious services with spiritual gusto seriously, deeply, honestly, and completely. Another pilgrim is the *Gatherer Pilgrim*. This pilgrim has only one goal: to accumulate grace! He may keep a log with how many graces he has received by going to Holy Communion, praying rosaries, accruing indulgences, praying the Stations of the Cross, and whatever else is available at the various shrines. Lastly, there is the *Praiser Pilgrim*. He doesn’t want anything. He doesn’t expect anything. He is mostly on a pilgrimage of gratitude. His pilgrimage consists of praising God for miracles, changed lives, healings, and the beauty of nature that surrounds most places of pilgrimage. He won’t refuse a gift or grace. However, it is not his main concern. What concerns this pilgrim is that someone gives God a break from His healing, saving, loving and dying for us. In return, the pilgrim stands in awe at God’s goodness and love.

I believe there is a little bit of every sort of pilgrim in each of us. The one most appealing to me was the *Praiser Pilgrim*. I found myself at every moment and place in awe of what I saw and felt. The faith of all the volunteers at Fatima, Avila (Spain), Loyola, and Lourdes moved me to tears at times. The nightly proces-

sions, the Walk of Faith with those in wheel chairs and gurneys at Lourdes, the outdoor Masses, the thousands of pilgrims from every country, speaking multiple languages, young and old singing songs, holding candles and blessing themselves with the waters from the Spring affirmed my belief that I was in the right place at the right time and what I felt was a gift that I would cherish for the rest of my life.

I have so much more to tell you but not enough room or time. Be assured that I prayed for you and for our parish. When I was lowered into the Spring water at Lourdes as part of the *Bath Ceremony* I took with me all those in our parish who are sick or have a special need. I prayed this prayer as I was helped out of the bath: *God our Father, it is through Mary, the most pure Virgin that your Son has come to us, the Source of Living Water. Help us to answer His call, in coming to purify ourselves at the Source of grace pouring from his heart, and of which this water is a sign and reminder, so that there may live in us the new creature, that we became in Baptism.*” Amen.

The *Year of Faith* which began on October 11th has two sub-texts: the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council (Vatican II) and the 20th anniversary of the publication of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.

I mention here a few of the key teachings of the Second Vatican Council: 1) *The full, conscious and active participation of all in liturgical and communal celebrations, as well as in the decision-making processes of the people of God, a process known as collegiality;* 2) *The shift from seeing ministry as the exclusive domain of the ordained, to realizing it is linked to baptismal call and mission;* 3) *A more biblically based church in its liturgical, theological, and spiritual life;* 4) *Respect for all non-Christian faith traditions. Unity among all Christians, focused on those things that join us rather than those that separate us;* 5) *A strong emphasis on community, leading to active involvement in the world, emphasizing our active role in transforming the world into the reign of God.*

The election of the President of the United States is rapidly approaching. In the fourth installment from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops’ *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* we read the following excerpt: *While the common good embraces all, those who are weak, vulnerable, and most in need deserve preferential concern. A basic moral test for our society is how we treat the most vulnerable in our midst. In a society marred by deepening disparities between rich and poor, Pope Benedict XVI has taught that “love for widows and orphans, prisoners, and the sick and needy of every kind, is as essential to (the Church) as the ministry of the sacraments and preaching of the Gospel.” This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized in our nation and beyond--unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, and victims of injustice and oppression.*

Father Luke and I attended a meeting at the Crystal Cathedral (soon to be *Christ Cathedral*) last week in order to participate in the first of many gatherings to hear about and understand the *For Christ Forever* first time Capital Campaign for the Diocese of Orange. It was an exciting, hopeful, energizing and forward planning presentation on how we can support our Faith, Church, and Future through our prayer, cooperation, and financial stewardship. Our *For Christ Forever* Capital Campaign will have as its goal to raise more than \$100 million in pledges to support five priorities: 1) *Our Future Christ Cathedral;* 2) *Local parish support;* 3) *Catholic Education;* 4) *Priests Retirement;* and 5) *Diocesan Ministries.*
