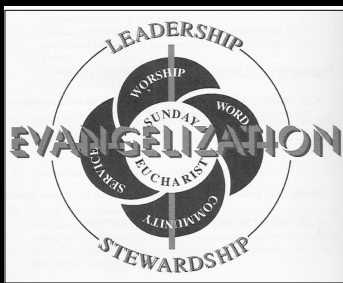

Thank you, St. Juliana parishioners, for returning your commitment cards last Sunday at all the Masses. There is still time to fill out a card and return it in the offertory basket. I fully realize that for many the idea of making another commitment may seem overwhelming. Busyness has consumed so much a part of our daily lives. However, remember we are not asking you to become more "busy." Stewardship is about taking your baptismal vows seriously but with common sense as well. You can only give so much of your time, talent, prayer and treasure based on motivation, obligation, financial stability, and prayer time. What is being asked of you is to simply be honest. Do what you can in a committed and consistent way and then leave the rest up to God's grace in your life. God will prompt you and give insight when the time is right for you. But do something!

Recently, I read a humorous story that illustrates jokingly what some believe about stewardship. While we need money to pay our bills and keep us financially sound, stewardship in the context of Church teaching is more than money. The "treasure" part of stewardship is about sacrifice that flows from a committed heart. It is not about "picking one's pocket." The story goes like this. *A wealthy parishioner who had never given money to support his parish was approached by the chairman of the stewardship committee for help with extensive roof repairs. "Sir," he said, "our records show that you are a millionaire but have never helped your parish. We really need a new roof. Can you help us out?" The man said, "Obviously your records make no note of my dying 95-year-old mother and her large medical expenses, or my blind unemployed brother, or my poor sister who was abandoned by her husband and left with six children to feed." "I am so sorry, I had no idea," the chairman said. The rich man replied: "So, if I don't give any money to them, why would I give money to you?"*

Saint Ignatius of Loyola helps to illustrate a mind-set that can better serve our stewardship needs than simply wishing for some benefit or ground swell of active ministers to emerge unexpectedly. He writes: *"The goal of our life is to live with God forever. God, who loves us, gives us life to flow into us without limit. All the things in this world are gifts from God, presented to us so that we can know God more easily and make a return of love more readily. As a result, we appreciate and use all these gifts of God insofar as they help us to develop as loving persons. But if any of these gifts become the center of our lives, they displace God and so hinder our growth toward our goal. In everyday life, then, we must hold ourselves in balance before all of these created gifts insofar as we have a choice and are not bound by some obligation. We should not fix our desires on health or sickness, wealth or poverty, success or failure, a long life or a short one. For everything has the potential of calling forth in us a deeper response to our life in God. Our only desire and our one choice should be this: I want and I choose what better leads to God's deepening his life in me."*

Catholics as well as all people of faith had hard choices to make during our recent presidential election. While the Catholic bishops gave usable, solid Catholic guidance, the term "intrinsically evil" kept coming up in various contexts. Pope John Paul II gave the term a broader meaning than some have used it. In the Vatican II document, *Gaudium et Spes* and in his encyclical, *Veritatis Splendor*, he says that intrinsically evil acts are *"any kind of homicide, genocide, abortion, euthanasia and voluntary suicide; whatever violates the integrity of the human person, such as mutilation, physical and mental torture and attempts to coerce the spirit; whatever is offensive to human dignity such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution and trafficking in women and children; degrading conditions of work which treat la-*

borers as mere instruments of profit, and not as free responsible persons: all these and the like are a disgrace...and they are a negation of the honor due to the Creator."

In recent years the Pope and bishops have decried the Death Penalty. We may even add to the list climate change and global warming which can be an affront to human health and well-being.

This weekend our second collection combines three former collections, *Catholic Campaign for Human Development, Catholic Communication Campaign, and Catholic University of America* into one: *National Needs Collection*. Thank you in advance for your generosity in support of this added collection and those that help alleviate some of the burden in paying down our debt and supporting our parochial school.

Our St. Vincent de Paul ministry is in dire need of more canned goods and non-perishable items for the food pantry. The large container in church is empty at the moment and by filling it every week needy families who visit the pantry will receive help. The 2012 Christmas grocery collection drive will begin soon and brown bags with green flyers will be made available. The bags then may be returned the weekend of December 8-9. Volunteers will sort through all the food items and fill boxes to be distributed for Christmas. "The Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World" promulgated by the Second Vatican Council sent laity, clergy, religious and all people of faith out of church buildings and into the world to serve the needs of our brothers and sisters. Perhaps there is no more famous statement than the first sentence that gives this document its Latin name, *Gaudium et Spes*: "The joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time, especially the poor or afflicted, are the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the followers of Christ as well....The community of people united in Christ...cherish a...deep solidarity with the human race." "The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church in the Modern World" spoke directly to the laity in a way previously unknown: "The laity are given this special vocation to make the church present and fruitful...it is only through them it can become the salt of the earth...They are the living instruments of the mission of the Church itself."

This weekend we celebrate a number of events that exemplify the generosity, energy, enthusiasm, and devotion of St. Juliana parishioners, young and old. Our junior high ministry, under the direction of Scott Kambak, will hold its annual "End World Hunger" five mile walk in Acacia Park starting at 10:30am following the 9:00am Mass. Rain or shine walkers will raise money from sponsors to donate toward alleviating world hunger. Last year our young ones walked in the rain....God love them!

The Knights of Columbus will be outside Church next weekend to ask for your help and to hand you a tootsie roll to benefit men, women and children with intellectual disabilities. You will recognize the Knights by the bright yellow and red aprons provided for the occasion. You may write a check directly to the Knights if you are unable to help donate next weekend.

Lastly, I encourage everyone to join our parish choir this Sunday evening at 7:30pm in church for a "Concert of Thanksgiving." The choir and orchestra will feature music of the season such as, "Simple Gifts," "For the Beauty of the Earth," "Come Ye Thankful People Come," "America the Beautiful," and Aaron Copland's "The Promise of Living." A free-will donation will help pay for the musicians.

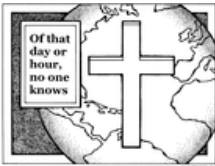
