~ FROM THE PASTOR ~



During this *Year of Faith* it is important for us to find practical ways to celebrate our Catholic Faith. Certainly celebrating Mass on weekends is the most basic way to celebrate. What about daily Mass? What about joining the daily rosary prayer group and one of the Small Christian Communities? What about

exploring outreach to the poor through our St. Vincent de Paul? What about devoting time to daily prayer, bible reading, visits to the Blessed Sacrament? Consider these suggestions. Make a personal decision to participate. Then follow through.

In the Year of Faith pamphlet you received some time ago, the writer reminds us: "What could be more important than our faith? It is the foundation of who we are as Catholic Christians and a gracious gift from God. Yet, in our contemporary world, we are increasingly vulnerable to secular movements that pull us away from our relationship with God....This Year of Faith is a time for us to renew our personal relationship with Jesus and recommit ourselves to the Church. We are called to give ourselves more fully to God by professing our faith in Jesus Christ, his only Son, and this faith is expressed when we profess the Creed."

In another place in the Year of Faith pamphlet the writer says: "The fruits of this Year of Faith will be seen in a strengthened commitment to God and one another. When we reach out in compassion to help a neighbor in need, we are bearing witness to the light of Christ. When we share our faith as bold disciples of Jesus, the fruits of this year long renewal will be reflected in our efforts. When we receive the holy Eucharist daily or weekly, we will be transformed by the real presence of the risen Lord and will go forth to live more fully as his disciples."

Mike McHenry, our faith formation director, has scheduled two events before Christmas to help us observe the *Year of Faith*. Dr. Kathleen Schinhofen, D.Min will conduct an *Advent Night of Prayer* on Thursday, December 6th at 7pm in Church and Fr. Jim Clarke returns to conduct an *Advent Parish Mission* entitled: "*What Are We Waiting For?*" on December 17, 18, 19 at 7pm in *Church*. Please mark your calendars and invite your neighbors and friends. These two blessings will reap exceptional benefits for our parish.

Our St. Peregrine Mass and devotion on the first Saturday of the month continues to attract devotees from surrounding areas to St. Juliana. With cancer and other serious illnesses affecting so many families, it is understandable that the celebration of the sacramental life of the Church would motivate people of faith to seek solace and healing through the intercession of St. Peregrine. If you have someone in your family who has cancer or some serious illness, please join others in prayer this Saturday, December 1st at the 8am morning Mass. Following Mass, prayers in honor of St. Peregrine are offered along with the opportunity to be blessed with the relic of St. Peregrine.

Recently, I met with members of the Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association (FIMA) to discuss plans for the yearly *Longest Night* celebration. Churches in the Fullerton area rotate hosting this celebration on the longest night of the year to help participants who may find the "holy-day" season difficult to celebrate due to a death in the family or some other sadness. This year St. Juliana will be the sponsoring parish on Saturday, December 22nd at 7:00pm in Church. Everyone is welcome. There will be readings, prayer, music and refreshments at the close of the service. This may be an opportunity to share our *Year of Faith* with others in our community.

Our Knights of Columbus will be removing the old missalette/ hymnals from the blue binders in church in preparation for Advent and the new Church year. This is a tedious undertaking and I am grateful to the Knights for doing this. A number of the binders are damaged due to those who try to fit both covers in the clear plastic sleeves. The sleeves as well as the binding on the hymnal are damaged when the front cover is jammed into the sleeve. It is simply not designed to fit in the front. Only the back cover fits into the plastic sleeve. Please cooperate and help protect the binders and hymnals.

I am sure you are planning the Nativity, Epiphany, and Baptism of Our Lord celebrations by organizing decorations, dates, gifts, meal plans, etc. This is a good thing and it helps us to be happy and in a festive mood. Since the celebration of Christmas parties and festivities happen earlier and earlier every year, Advent, the time of preparation for Christmas, often gets second billing or completely overlooked. I ask all parish organizations to schedule Christmas parties closer to Christmas or even after Christmas in observance of the Christmas Season which continues to the Baptism of Our Lord on January 13th. No doubt the busyness of the Season often necessitates earlier and earlier planning, so we may have to rethink the "Reason for the Season."

The Diocese of Orange requires that every parish finance committee present a yearly financial report to the entire parish. This published report helps parishioners appreciate how important finances are to fund the various parish ministries. The report will be published as an insert in the bulletin soon. I am grateful for all who contribute to the offertory collection and electronic pay. Can we all do better? Perhaps! If you have not given consistently or have not made up your offering while you were away, this will be the opportunity to catch up.

Every month I receive a booklet entitled, Bits and Pieces. It contains quotes, anecdotes, stories, and advice on living good lives motivated by charity, common sense, and healthy behaviors. In a recent edition this story caught my eye. The title of the story is We All Need Help and it goes like this: A carpenter's apprentice was beside himself when he broke his left hand. The thought of missing out on so many weeks of work began to worry him. He approached the carpenter and begged to be put to work. "But what can you do?" the carpenter asked. "Your hand is broken." "Not my right hand," the apprentice said. "I do everything with my right hand, and I can still hold a hammer.' "But what about the nail? Who will hold that?" They went on for some time like this about things that needed to be cut, sawed, or drilled. The apprentice was constantly looking for tasks he could perform with one hand, and the carpenter tried to patiently point out that in their line of work two hands, sometimes four, were almost always necessary. "But there must be something I can do." "There is," said the carpenter. "Recognize that there aren't too many things that one hand can do without the other. We all need a little bit of help in just about everything we do."

My thanks to Todd Helm, the choir, musicians, readers, soloists and all who contributed to the success of our beautiful concert last Sunday evening. The choir rehearsed long hours and truly excelled. Good music, good singing, good recitation, and good directing: a formula for success.


