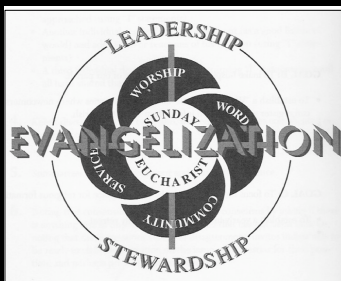

I hope you had an opportunity to read my pilgrimage reflections in last week's bulletin. As I said then, I experienced much more than I wrote. It was an awesome experience and one that will linger with me for a long time. It is not easy to capture and write about such a personal encounter. The chaplain reminded us that once we returned home to business as usual, some of the emotional fervor and spiritual elation would diminish. I do not want that to happen, and it is my hope that I will continue to live the spiritual awareness that so captivated me especially in Lourdes.

When Pope Benedict XVI declared a *Year of Faith* beginning on October 11, 2012 and ending with the Feast of Christ the King on November 24, 2013 my main concern was how we would make this a practical celebration. Faith as a word appears often in various media forms: spiritual books, the Bible, letters, articles, speeches, homilies, etc. One way we can observe this *Year of Faith* is to pay close attention to the many ways the word is used. When we read about *Faith* or hear the word, we can stop and reflect and absorb the meaning into our daily lives.

In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* the word "Faith" appears hundreds of times and within a myriad of contexts. Some examples may help clarify what we understand by the word. "Faith is a personal act--the free response of the human person to the initiative of God who reveals himself." *Faith* is first of all a personal adherence of man to God. At the same time, and inseparably, it is a free assent to the whole truth that God has revealed." *Faith* is more certain than all human knowledge because it is founded on the very word of God who cannot lie." *Faith* is an entirely free gift that God makes to man. To live, grow, and persevere in the *Faith* until the end we must nourish it with the word of God; we must beg the Lord to increase our *Faith*; it must be working through Charity, abounding in hope, and rooted in the *Faith* of the Church." "Faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and believe all that he has said and revealed to us, and that Holy church proposes for our belief."

The Diocese of Orange has promised that some practical suggestions on how to observe the *Year of Faith* will be forthcoming. For now we can follow these simple recommendations: 1) *Pay attention to the words of the Creed we profess at Mass and make them apply personally to your life;* 2) *Take time for personal daily prayer. Opening our heart to God in prayer paves the way for deeper faith and conversion and a more compassionate heart;* 3) *Worship wholeheartedly at Mass. Approach Mass with increased faith by participating fully in the prayers and hymns;* 4) *Study the teachings of the church. Read the Bible daily. Reflect of God's word. Read the documents of Vatican II and the Catechism of the Catholic Church;* 5) *Serve the poor and others in need. We put our faith in action by caring for our neighbors in need. In addition to giving money, we should also look for ways to make serving others more a part our daily lives.*

Parishioners Nina Visconti and Donna Dostalick have an exciting faith-based program for the "New Evangelization" called: *Hearts-A-Fire: Consoling the Heart of Jesus*. This is a 10 week "Do-It-Yourself" retreat inspired by the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Sister Faustina, Blessed John Paul II, and Blessed Mother Teresa. It is designed to help small group, parish-based, faith renewal groups to live their Catholic life of faith, charity, and the sacraments in a deeper way. The small group discussions are based on the book, *Consoling the Heart of Jesus* by Father Michael E. Gaitley. Meetings will take place in the Meeting Room 4 on Mondays from 7pm to 8:30pm beginning on November 12th. We kick off our yearly *Stewardship* program this Sunday with talks by Marc Labreche. Next Sunday will be *Commitment Sunday* when everyone will be encouraged to share *time, talent, prayer, and treasure*. It is my hope and that of the Stewardship Committee that more parishioners will become involved in the various ministries of the parish. Right now we have an ardent need for ushers at all the Masses especially the 5pm Mass on Sunday evenings. Ushers are also ministers of hospitality. In many parishes the first person visitors or long time parishioners meet as they enter church are the ushers. Ushers make them feel welcome. Help them find a seat when the church is full. Direct them to the bathrooms. Answer any questions. Assist the elderly and those with disabilities or wheel chair bound. Hand out bulletins after Mass and assist when there is a medical emergency.

The other ministry where help is needed is *Ministers of the Holy Eucharist*. In order to administer Holy Communion to a full church with both the Body and Blood (Bread and Cup) of our Lord in a timely manner we need seven ministers at all Masses except when a deacon is present, then only six. Deacon Gerhard trains new ministers and oversees this ministry.

During the month of October parishes throughout the United States count the number of worshipers attending Mass for the four Sundays. This year we had a total attendance spread over four weeks of 6,287 with the average per Sunday of 1,572. The averages for 2009, 2010, and 2011 were 1,577, 1,468, and 1,576. So you can see that our Mass attendance is stable which is a good sign but not nearly what it could be if everyone in the parish came to Mass on a regular basis. The average would be nearly double. Nonetheless we are grateful to those who are faithful.

You may know that Pope Benedict XVI recently canonized the first native American Indian, *Kateri Tekakwitha*, a member of the Mohawk tribe. She was born in 1656. Her father was a war chief among the Mohawk Indians; her mother was an Algonquin who had been captured in a raid. Kateri's mother was also a baptized Catholic who was known for her kindness, patience, gentleness, and self-control. Kateri was born about forty miles west of modern-day Albany and lived there until she was about four or five, when a smallpox epidemic decimated her village.

By all accounts, Kateri was an intelligent and good-natured child. She was courageous, determined, and resilient. Although Jesuit missionaries lived in her village throughout her teen years, Kateri seems to have had little to do with them. When Kateri was about eighteen, Jesuit Father Jacques de Lamberville visited her and was surprised by Kateri asking to become a Christian. Kateri was baptized on Easter Sunday 1676.

She strove for excellence----to practice the faith perfectly and to plunge herself deeper into the life of God. But her health was frail, and in the winter of 1680, Kateri became bedridden. On April 17, 1680 at the age of twenty-four Kateri Tekakwitha died. Miracles began and within two years, a regional cult had grown up around her. Kateri is known as the *Lily of the Mohawks*. St. Kateri, pray for us!

We vote this week. It is our duty to vote as our conscience leads us. The Catholic Bishops do not endorse any particular party but remind all Catholics, of whatever party that "*our participation should help transform the party to which we belong; we should not let the party neglect fundamental moral truths. We are called to bring together our principles, political choices, values and our votes, to help build a better world.*"
