~ FROM THE PASTOR ~



Writing on the eve of the presidential election I feel both optimistic and encouraged by the prospect of something new happening in our political life. The office of president of the United States of America is a responsibility that carries with it untold opportunities to further both the common good which is so much a part

of Catholic Social Teaching as well as moral and ethical leadership in all areas of human life. Protection of the unborn and most vulnerable, the lived experience of the basic tenets of the American Constitution by every citizen, freedom of Religion, economic security, and the pursuit of peace both at home and abroad are just a few ways in which we assure the advancement of our American way of life in truth and honesty. *In God We Trust!*

The Catholic bishops, writing in the document, Faithful Citizenship remind us of how important it is for Catholics to be partners with elected officials in the public forum. They write: As Catholics, we enter the public forum to act on our moral convictions, share our experience in serving the poor and vulnerable, and add our values to the dialogue over our nation's future. Catholics are called to be a community of conscience within the larger society and to test public life by the moral wisdom anchored in Scripture and consistent with the best of our nation's founding ideals. Our moral framework does not easily fit the categories of right or left, Democrat or Republican. Sometimes it seems few candidates and no party fully reflect our values. We must challenge all parties and every candidate to defend human life and dignity, to pursue greater justice and peace, to uphold family life, and to advance the common good."

We are all well aware of the hurricane disaster that has brought unbelievable suffering, death, and loss of property to our brothers and sisters on the East coast. As I announced at the evening Mass on the Feast of All Saints, the money collected in the offertory collection that night will be sent to both Catholic Charities and the Knights of Columbus for their part in helping in the relief effort. The Red Cross, the Salvation Army, Catholic Charites, the Knights, and Catholic Relief Services are all on the scene assisting each other in providing some of the basic necessities to those who have lost everything. It is hard to imagine what that is like.

I am asking all the parish organizations who have a treasury: Knights of Columbus, ICF, Parent Club, St. Vincent de Paul Society, YLI and individual parishioners to donate to the relief effort. You may write a check to St. Juliana Catholic Church and indicate on the memo line that it is for *Hurricane Sandy Relief Effort* or send your donation directly to the *Knights of Columbus Charities*, *One Columbus Plaza, PO Box 1966, New Haven, CT 06509-1966* or *Catholic Charities USA, PO Box 17066 Baltimore, MD 21297-1066.* Both are nonprofit 501© organizations.

There has been an enthusiastic response to the *Hearts Afire* parishbased program for the new evangelization proclaimed both by Blessed Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI. The *Consoling the Heart of Jesus* ten-week parish retreat begins this Monday, November 12th in the Parish Center meeting room 4 at 7pm. There are still some openings available. This retreat program was created for parishes and individuals by Father Michael E. Gaitley, MIC in his book "Consoling the Heart of Jesus." Father Gaitley gently guides retreatants through a series of CD teachings. Each retreatant is given a copy of the book along with a workbook. The retreat brings souls closer to the heart of Jesus through *The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Sister Faustina, Blessed John Paul II and Blessed Mother Theresa.* The retreat is a practical way to celebrate the *Year of Faith*. There are forms in the office until 5pm on Monday for late registrations.

Our two youth programs are in full swing for the 2012-2013 school year. The High School Ministry is directed by Kerry and Maura

Condon and our Junior High Ministry by Scott Kambak. Scott has planned a special presentation this Wednesday evening in the Parish Center Room 1 entitled, "Poverty and Hunger in the Neighborhood and the World." This will be an excellent introduction to their "End World Hunger" five mile walk on Sunday, November 18th following the 9am Mass. The students will be looking for sponsors.

Our parish choir under the direction of Todd Helm will present a *Thanksgiving Concert* accompanied by brass, flute, cello and percussion in church on Sunday, November 18th at 7:30 pm. In past years when the choir has performed concerts the attendance has always been impressive. We hope this year we will exceed all previous years. The music will reflect a patriotic them and the musicians and performers will all be first class. A freewill offering will be taken up to help defer expenses.

Jean and Doug Knudson have been volunteers and strong supporters of *Corazon*, an organization initiated in 1978 with the help of Servite High School graduates to help families across the border in Mexico break through the cycle of poverty. *Corazon* enables the establishment of strong community building, housing, scholarships, education in basic farming techniques, and more. Doug and Jean will have a table out after all the Masses next weekend, November 17-18 to show photos, give information, and provide opportunities for sponsorship or alternative gifting.

I wish to extend my special thanks to Marc Labreche for his presentations at Mass on *Stewardship Sunday* and his personal reflections on how he participates in our Stewardship program here at St. Juliana. While finances are one part of Stewardship along with time, talent and prayer, they must never be minimized since we have a million dollar debt to satisfy and mounting expenses in the maintenance of our property and employees. I wish to thank the entire committee: *David Hoferer, Vern Meurer, Brian and Annette Burley, Donna Schantz, Berta Saran, Marc and Terrie Labreche. Thanks also to Mariana Meurer and Christine Hoferer and all the volunteers who helped with the Stewardship Appreciation Dinner.*

The Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association (FIMA) will sponsor a *Community Thanksgiving Service* on Tuesday, November 20, 2012 at 7pm at Morningside Presbyterian Church featuring special readings, reflections, and music by area clergy, lay leaders, and civic representatives. I will be presenting a reading and hope St. Juliana parishioners will attend.

We celebrate Veterans Day this Sunday. *Veterans Day* is an official United States holiday honoring armed service veterans. It is a federal holiday that is observed on November 11th. It coincides with other holidays such as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day, which are celebrated in other parts of the world and also mark the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918. In 1945, WW II veteran Raymond Weeks had the idea to expand Armistice Day (Veterans Day) to celebrate all veterans, not just those who died in World War I. On June 1, 1954 Congress replaced "Armistice" with "Veterans," and it has been known as Veterans Day since.




LEGACY COURTYARD PAVERS
