

Please keep me in your prayers this week. I was able to have surgery on my broken right shoulder last week and will give you more of an update once I meet with my surgeon for a post-operation appointment this week.

With everything happening, it is hard to believe it is already the third week of Advent! Traditionally, the Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete ("rejoice") Sunday. The somber Advent colors are exchanged for a deep pink or a vibrant rose. This is the week we light the pink Advent Wreath candle - which reminds us that joy and laughter benefit the Christian much more than sadness and gloom. The readings for this Sunday reflect this bright delight. We're beckoned to "shout for joy" by the prophet Zephaniah. Paul tells the Philippians to "Rejoice in the Lord always!" In fact, the whole rhythm of Advent picks up today. As the more immediate preparations for Christmas begin, the more restrained mood of the early days of Advent are abandoned. You can feel Christmas in the air! This sensation is not just schmaltzy sentimentality. It's more like a sixth sense we Christians have. And the liturgy is urging us to employ this sense to recognize that Emmanuel, "God-with-us", really is with us **now**.

Another successful Toy and Food Drive is complete. Thank you to all who worked so many hours to coordinate all aspects of this effort. Your good work does not go unnoticed.

Our St. Juliana School families are participating in the 9am Mass this Sunday. It is always joyful to have our children actively participate in the Mass. I extend a welcome and my thanks to the school administration, teachers, school choir, students and families that worked hard and were are able to participate in this special Mass. The School is sponsoring coffee and donuts today - please join them after the 7:30am and 9am Masses in the Parish Center.

Third Sunday of Advent

Reflection taken from *Scripture Soundings - Year C* Today's readings seem to indicate that our final Advent preparations need not be anything out of the ordinary. Thus, for us, celebration is part of the ordinary. Unbridled joy is the ever-present emotion for those who recognize that the Messiah is present. We need not involve ourselves in some highfalutin' agenda to get ready for Emmanuel. Rather, our Advent task is to tend to what is at hand, to be in charge of our own souls, and also to be responsive to all who are near and dear.

And being responsive, by the way, is never something that is done in the abstract or in general. We can be responsive only in the concrete, in particular. Perhaps that's why the Baptizer in today's Gospel passage was so particular in his preparation advice. Clearly that's why we have to be particular in our preparations for the coming of the Lord. We have to be at attention and pay attention to our personal needs, and in so doing, recognize and respond to the very particular and personal needs of others.

Man can only accept himself if he is accepted by another. He needs the other's presence, saying to him, with more than words: it is good that you exist. Only from the You can the I come into itself. Only if it is accepted, can it accept itself. Those who are unloved cannot even love themselves. This sense of being accepted comes in the first instance from other human beings. But all human acceptance is fragile. Ultimately we need a sense of being accepted unconditionally. Only if God accepts me, and I become convinced of this, do I know definitely; it is good that I exist. It is good to be a human being. If ever man's sense of being accepted and loved by God is lost. then there is no longer any answer to the question whether to be a human being is good at all. Doubt concerning human existence becomes more and more insurmountable. Where doubt over God becomes prevalent, then doubt over humanity follows inevitably. We see today how widely this doubt is spreading. We see it in the joylessness, in the inner sadness, that can be read on so many human faces today. Only faith gives me the conviction; it is good that I exist. It is good to be a human being, even in hard times.

Do the sounds of bells remind you of Christmas? Here is a special "bell" for the season.


MARY'S JOURNEY
