#### **FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT**

#### "BLESSED IS THE FRUIT OF YOUR WOMB"

Exert from *Sunday By Sunday: Year C Lectionary*Luke's infancy narratives are carefully written to reveal that the child Jesus who was born in Bethlehem is truly the Son of God, the long-awaited Messiah of the Jews, and the Savior of all people. In today's Gospel Elizabeth proclaims the good news to Mary, and to us, that Mary's child is divine. She says, "Blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Luke 1:43). As Luke tells it, John the Baptist recognized Jesus before either of them had been born, and announced Jesus' identity as the anointed Son of God through Elizabeth's words.

The first and second readings for this Sunday highlight Jesus' identity as Savior of all people. In Micah we hear that "his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth" and in Hebrews we are reminded that his death was an offering "for all." Today's scriptures should reveal to us the full significance of the Incarnation, the coming of God in the form of a humble human infant

#### **REAL PRESENCE**

We may never fully grasp God's real presence in the human form of the infant Jesus. Just so, we may never fully grasp the real presence of God in the humble form of the Eucharist. The one who came down from heaven and became human at Christmas comes down from heaven at every Eucharist and offers us his body and blood so that all might be consecrated—that is, share in his divine life. As we sing the Lamb of God litany and receive Communion this week, may we welcome the Son of God and Savior of all people, the Messiah and Lamb of God.

May we recognize him not only in the infant Jesus and in the Eucharist, but in all of our sisters and brothers.

In every Eucharist the Incarnation continues; God takes on human form and dwells among us.

#### **REJOICE IN HIS COMING!**

The great paradox of the birth of Jesus is that a powerful savior



could be found in so vulnerable a condition as a newborn baby in a makeshift cradle. Our hearts are easily moved by the image of a baby, but we may overlook the great power that was mysteriously present in Jesus from the very first. The Incarnate Word was a formidable adversary of

all that would burden and enslave us. The same might that created the universe out of chaos now arrived to create the world anew and redeem us from the grip of sin and death.

We have walked in darkness, and we have seen a great light. Let us rejoice that we have so powerful a savior who continues to smash all the forces that oppress us.

The "Door of Faith" and Our "Doors" Keep our doors open and inviting!

EAR OF FAITH

The "door of faith" (Acts 14:27) is always open for us. It ushers us into the life of communion with God and offers us entry into God's Church. We can cross its threshold when God's word is proclaimed, and when the heart allows itself to be shaped by God's transforming grace.

When Pope Benedict XVI declared that a "Year of Faith" would be celebrated, beginning just this past October and continuing through November 2013—we were reminded that we are to open the "door of faith" by renewing our friendship with Christ and rediscovering the Church's teachings. Advent opened the door of a new liturgical year. With these spiritual "doors" opening, were you aware of the physical doors in your own lives opening? What do people see, outside, before the door opens? When you walk into a church, do branches, flowers, a seasonal wreath--adorned perhaps with ribbons or fabric in appropriate liturgical colors--offer a wordless welcome that heralds a warm personal greeting? Christmas decorations, outdoors and inside, are already customary during Advent. Why not plan something similar for Lent, Easter, even Ordinary Time? Is your family crèche in an honored setting just inside the door so it can be the first thing that visitors see? Replace it during Lent with a treasured crucifix, then a Resurrection icon or Christ candle, an image of Our Lady during May, and so forth.

Pope Benedicts gives us a mission—keep our "doors" open.

Adorn doors and entryways, at church, in your homes, at work... in every season throughout this "*Year of Faith*" with visual proclamations of faith that pledge hospitality.


