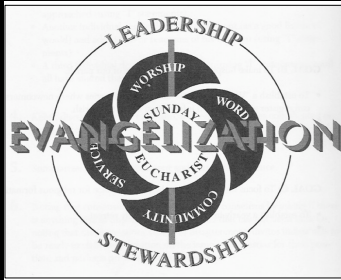

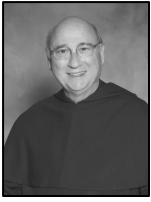

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

The author Alex Noble wrote these words which resonate in my mind as I write to you this week: *"If I have been of service, if I have glimpsed more of the nature and essence of ultimate good, if I am inspired to reach wider horizons of thought and action, if I am at peace with myself, it has been a successful day."* St. Juliana parish and school community came together last Saturday and created a wonderful, successful merrymaking in the Parish Center called the *"Gala Auction and Dinner Dance."* This festivity was the culmination of months of hard work by school parents and staff, which not only had great success in raising funds through both the silent and live auctions, but also in creating good will and new friendships. I was so pleased to be a part of the evening entertainment. To all who participated and to all who gave so generously of their time, talent and treasure: heartfelt applause!

There are a number of parish happenings planned for the days ahead which will require our attention and hopefully our participation. Some events which I would like to alert you to and which will be highlighted in other parts of this bulletin the next two weeks are the following: The celebration of the Feast of the Seven Holy Founders next weekend at all the Masses; The Men's retreat at Mater Dolorosa Retreat House at Sierra Madre; The Servite Provincial Chapter which opens on Monday of this coming week also at Sierra Madre. The Servite Secular Order information night on February 21st; Ash Wednesday services on February 22nd (and the beginning of *Operation Rice Bowl*); The Knights of Columbus Blood Drive on February 26th; The "Get On The Bus" benefit on March 4th. Our Lenten Parish Mission will begin with an introduction at all the weekend Masses on March 4th and continue on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of that week. (See page 6 for Parish Mission details.)

No doubt you have heard that many of our liturgical ministries are in need of ministers. One that is of concern to me is our Eucharistic Ministers. We now have four Holy Communion cups at all our Masses. When a deacon is not present we need seven ministers at all of our Masses. While some parishes have cut back on offering the Precious Blood, I believe offering and receiving the cup is a fuller participation in the Mass. Deacon Gerhard will be happy to instruct new ministers. (His phone number is listed on page 2.) Please consider this ministry.

Other ministries in need of your support are Altar Servers, Ushers, and Lectors. These ministries require some training and dedication of time. So, please consider putting your best foot forward and say "yes."

Researcher Michael Cieslak of the Diocese of Rockford, Illinois reports many Catholics who leave the Church do so for no specific reason---they just drift away. He gathered information from an on-line survey: *"Catholics Come Home."* His survey found reasons Catholics gave for leaving the church: No reason, just drifted away (44%); Disagreement with Church teachings; Lack of welcome in the Church; Church did not meet spiritual needs; Anger at Church leadership for the sexual abuse scandal or for another reason; Marriage to a non-Catholic;

It was no longer relevant in my life; Divorce and remarriage outside the Church. On the flip side, the reasons for returning to the Church by those returning: Desire to return to faith of childhood (58%); Have a deeper desire to know God; Miss the Catholic Church in general; Just decided it was time to return; Miss the sacraments; For the sake of family; Miss the liturgy.

While the data for why Catholics leave can be disheartening, the reasons why they return are more hopeful. We can use this data to alert us on how we can encourage one another and insure that St. Juliana continues to be a welcoming community and a magnet for those who are seekers.

In the January 16th edition of *America* magazine, Fr. John F. Kavanaugh, S.J., professor of philosophy at St. Louis University in St. Louis, Missouri comments on this topic of "leaving" and "returning" Catholics in his column titled *"What We Must Face."* He writes: *"Just as leaders of a nation must call its citizens to a common good beyond any particular vested interest, so also leaders of our church must call the disaffected not merely back to the church but to the One without whom the church has no legitimacy or mission."*

"If we Catholics all return home to our true center, we will indeed have a bounty of 'Welcome-homes.' Coming back to a church focused on Christ rather than itself, some who have left us may discover what they were looking for when they left. And all of us might find ourselves newly empowered to challenge a disordered culture, just as courageously as our Lord did."

This weekend we had the opportunity to examine our attitude toward the death penalty. The SAFE CA ballot initiative will replace the death penalty with life in prison without the possibility of parole. The financial impact of this initiative will save California tens of millions of dollars. A Gallop poll in 2011 found that 61% of Americans supported the death penalty, down from 80% in 1994. In addition, the number of individuals sentenced to death in the United States has fallen drastically. This year, according to a recent report from the Death Penalty Information Center, 78 individuals were sentenced to death, the first time the number has dropped below 100 in three decades.

This shift comes as American's increasingly find the practice unfair, expensive and at risk of executing innocent people. The fact that criminals can be sentenced to life without parole has made the death penalty seem less necessary for the defense of public order.

Last November Pope Benedict XVI reiterated the church's opposition to capital punishment and his support for groups working to eliminate it.

While this Initiative may be difficult for some to accept, I believe we need to keep the dialogue open and respect each other's differences. My special thanks to Sr. Louise Ann Micek, CSJ for bringing this Initiative to our attention.

A parting thought from Roman philosopher, Cicero: *"We were born to unite with our fellow men, and to join in community with the human race."*
