~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Last weekend over 100 parishioners and friends stopped by the tables outside of Mass and signed the SAFE CA Ballot Initiative petition. Sr. Louise Ann Micek CSJ and the sisters of St. Joseph of Orange stood outside of Church at all

Sunday Masses to answer questions and encourage everyone to participate. This Initiative will replace the death penalty with life in prison without the possibility of parole. It is part of a seamless garment approach to abortion, euthanasia, death penalty, elder abuse and other wrongs that impact the quality of life and protect the innocent. Thanks to the strong stand Catholics have taken in partnership with other faith communities and social movements, the debate continues so that someday truth and justice will prevail for all of our citizens.

Our parish school girl's basketball team has been on the winning edge this year. As in past years the excellent coaching has not only brought our girls trophies but has paved the way for future sports excellence in high school and beyond. Our thanks to Brian Burley and the coaches for the time they devote to our girls.

Your prayers this weekend for the Friar Servants of Mary (Servites) as we celebrate the feast of the Seven Holy Founders mean a great deal to Servites stationed here in Southern California. We have many needs. As we age new friars need to come along to take our place. There may come a time when friars will come from other parts of the world to work in places staffed by the friars. It will be missionary work in reverse. Let us pray that St. Juliana will send young men from the parish to begin the formation process and study. What an honor it would be for families and the entire parish.

Members of our Secular Order will hold an information night this Tuesday, February 21st at 7 pm in the parish meeting room in preparation for a new formation cycle to begin in early fall. Everyone is invited to participate.

The Knights of Columbus as a world wide Catholic fraternal organization has made a widely acclaimed impact on many social issues. Passing on the "gift of life" through the blood drive next Sunday morning is certainly one of those times our Knights stand apart. I hope you will consider giving blood and by so doing bring a blessing to recipients and our parish.

We will be entering into the Lenten discipline this Wednesday. February 22nd. As you attend Mass and have blessed ashes place in the form of a cross on your forehead think of what you will do as your personal Lenten discipline. Will you fast and not just give up some food, drink or pleasure? True fasting is always sacrificial. A young friend once told me he was giving up some food for Lent. I asked which food. He said, "peas." I realized then and there he "hated" peas. So, where was the sacrifice? Will you pray more? Will you attend morning Mass? The Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings is a traditional prayer service. Will you participate? How about the parish mission? It is three evenings in March. Are you planning to attend? If you haven't decided to honor the Lenten discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer, then for what purpose do ashes on your forehead serve? The Church's yearly discipline is not to make our lives difficult or burdensome. God only knows how much

we keep plugging along. Lent can be a joyful time. Our Lord said when you fast wash your face, put on your make-up, comb your hair and have a glad countenance. Persevere even when your stomach rumbles. When Easter Sunday comes, how much more will the celebration be memorable?

Last week's bulletin had an insert thanking by name all of St. Juliana parishioners who share so generously and courageously their time, talent, and treasure. The various ministries were highlighted and the roster of PSA participants printed. Next weekend we will have our 2012 PSA kick-off at all the Masses. Once again we will have not only a financial goal but also a participant goal. Will we exceed last year's goal of 500 participants? We didn't quite reach it last year.

During these difficult economic times, it is important to realize we will only reach our goals by banding together. If we had every parishioner participating at his/her level of income we would far exceed our goals.

I am reminded as we prepare for next weekend of a story Fr. Anthony de Mello, S.J. told in his book, "Taking Flight." He writes: "A woman dreamed she walked into a brand-new shop in the marketplace and, to her surprise, found God behind the counter. 'What do you sell here?' she asked. 'Everything your heart desires,' said God. Hardly daring to believe what she was hearing, the woman decided to ask for the best things a human being could wish for. 'I want peace of mind and love and happiness and wisdom and freedom from fear,' she said. Then as an afterthought, she added, 'Not just for me. For everyone on earth.' God smiled, 'I think you've got me wrong, my dear,' He said. 'We don't sell fruits here. Only seeds.'"

We live in the present but all that we do today is a seed for our future and our children's future. St. Juliana parish is today what our predecessors planted years ago. From St. Mary's Annex to a parish 1700 families strong and a future full of hope.

In a pamphlet published by The Christophers entitled: "Positive Attitude-Positive Choices," the author writes: "Attitude is more than how we look at life; it's how we choose to live. Whether we consider ourselves born optimists or have to struggle to see a glass that's half-full, we can always choose to 'start anew.' Being positive not only helps us accomplish our goals, but also seek happiness." He then goes on to tell the story of Thomas Alva Edison, the renowned creator of the light bulb, the phonograph and other inventions, who had a huge laboratory complex in New Jersey. The day after it was destroyed by fire he said, "There is great value in disaster. All our mistakes are burned up. Thank God we can start anew." He rebuilt and went on to acquire an amazing 1,093 patents in his lifetime.

It is not easy to be an optimist. God only knows I have my moments. Nevertheless, the alternative has very little possibility. Dr. Robert Schuller once said these words which I am sure are sustaining him in these difficult days for him: "How you think and how you act today will determine your future. To an overwhelming degree, you can control your life and its changes, by how you perceive them. So, plan and pray your way toward tomorrow."





SERVITE SEVEN HOLY FOUNDERS

Feast of the Seven Holy Founders (February 17th)

Bonfilius, Bonajuncta, Manettus, Amadeus, Hugh, Sostene, and Alexis are the names with which were canonized the seven men



who, around the middle of the thirteenth century, founded the Order of Friar Servants of Saint Mary in Florence. The Church and the Order venerate them with the title of the Seven Holy Founders. They were lay men and merchants; some were married, others single or widowed.

They were animated by a strong desire for Christian perfection and belonged to the Greater Society of Our Lady. As members of this Society they served

God and Our Lady by practicing works of charity and penance. Their desire to serve God eventually led them to leave their homes and businesses and to form a community outside the city walls. About the year 1245 they moved to Monte Senario, about twelve miles from Florence, where they built a small church and dwelling. Soon other men, desirous of prayer and solitude, joined them. Because of the holiness of their lives, the seriousness of their religious commitment, and the esteem of the people, they obtained first the approval of the bishop of Florence Ardingo, and then that of the Apostolic See. From Monte Senario the Seven and their followers returned to Florence to engage in apostolic work, and at Cafaggio they built a church, the first nucleus of the present basilica of Santissima Annunziata.

Historical data about the Seven Holy Founders are not numerous; even their names, except for Bonfilius and Alexis, are uncertain. But the spiritual characteristics of their life are certain, as told in the Legenda de origine Ordinis, the oldest account of the work of the Seven Saints, transmitted by an uninterrupted tradition. These characteristics are an ardent love of God and Our Lady, humility, a spirit of service, a disposition to harmony and pardon, and an active desire to promote peace.

The Seven Holy Founders were canonized as a group by Pope Leo XIII in 1888. Their mortal remains are venerated in the basilica of Monte Senario.

SECULAR ORDER OF THE SERVANTS OF MARY

The first session of formation for those interested in becoming a Secular Servant of Mary will take place in Rm 4 of the Parish Center at 7pm on Tuesday, February 21st. You must be at least 18 years of age and have the desire to share the ideals of the Servite Order along with living a gospel life in the ordinary circumstances of your daily life.

Before acceptance into the Secular Order, the candidate passes through a period of probation, normally one year, under the guidance of the local Servite community of friars. During the period of probation the candidate will study the Rule of Life and Commentary along with a short history of the Servite Order and a workbook designed for a deeper understanding of Servite spirituality.

LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting obliges all those from ages 18-59 to refrain from eating between meals, and to limit their eating to one full meal and two lighter meals for the day (these not to equal a full meal); liquids permitted.

Abstinence obliges those 14 years of age and older not to eat meat. **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** are days of **both** *fasting* and *abstinence*. In the United States, all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.


