

#### ~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Lent is upon us. Prayer ~ Fasting ~ Works of Charity! These are the basics of Christian spiritual life and the three pillars of Lent. Fundamentally, prayer is conversation with God. In prayer we may be praising God for his glory, thanking

him for his boundless mercy to us, or asking him for his help in times of trouble. Ultimately, prayer boils down to talking with God. When it comes to fasting, the Church insists that we be sensible. In fact the Church has only two days of fasting----Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition to these days, we are encouraged to make personal sacrifices... "giving something up for Lent." Works of charity or almsgiving means specifically monetary giving. Every charity needs funds, and God is pleased every time we reach into our pockets to contribute to a good cause.

Some of us find Lent a pesky time of year. We have good intentions. We want to fast. We want to pray. We want to give of our treasure. Somehow it is all very annoying. Lent can be a mixture of good intentions and failed promises. That doesn't sound very appealing.

There may not be a good answer to our dilemma. Perhaps we can take Lent a day at a time. Just for today, I will go to morning Mass and say some extra prayers. Just for today I will pray the Stations of the Cross. Just for today I will give up some food and feel hungry. Just for today I will put the change in my pocket in "Operation Rice Bowl." Then you may find that Lent for you is a series of "just for today's." I believe that sounds more appealing and doable.

Maybe Lent isn't the time to be overly introspective or a time for spying on ourselves. However, a little self-knowledge and circumspection no matter how difficult it may be doesn't hurt. An unknown author wrote these words which may or may not be helpful. He writes: "The person who has not struggled with difficulty after difficulty cannot know the joy of genuine success. Face the problems, and fight your way over them. There is more satisfaction in putting forth effort than in gloating over easily won profits. The rungs in the ladder of success are composed of difficulties."

My gratitude goes out to our Knights of Columbus for sponsoring the annual blood drive this weekend. Passing on the "gift of life" is both an honorable thing and a Godly virtue. Also, I wish to extend my thanks to Terry Reinbold and the men's retreat team for hosting the Annual St. Juliana Men's Retreat at Mater Dolorosa (Mother of Sorrows) Retreat Center in Sierra Madre last weekend. I am sure the silence was a challenge for the men who, like all of us, like to talk. For some the silence was "golden." The retreat is always the same weekend in February. So mark your calendar for 2013.

There is still time to purchase your ticket for the "Get On The Bus" benefit concert and dinner to be held in the Parish Center on Sunday, March 4<sup>th</sup> from 4-8 pm. "Get On The Bus" (GOTB) brings children and their guardians/caretakers from throughout California to visit their mothers and fathers who are in prison. This Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup> our Candidates and Catechumens will be presented to the Bishop at Holy Family Cathedral in the Rite of Election. From that moment on they will be called the "Elect" as they continue their journey toward the Easter sacraments. Please remember them in your Lenten prayers.

During the past three years I have had the wonderful experience of participating not only in programs, retreats, meetings, etc sponsored by the Diocese of Orange along with monthly deanery meetings, but also to take part in the Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association (FIMA). I suggested to Mike McHenry that when we create our adult education speaker series we include two or three members of FIMA. This Tuesday, February 28<sup>th</sup> Rabbi Ken Milhander from Temple Beth Tikva will be our guest speaker at 7pm in Room 1-2. I hope you will come. He'll be sharing with us some thoughts on Judaism as it is practiced in the Reformed tradition. Rabbi Ken is very personable and a delight to listen to. Please welcome him to our parish.

I look forward to seeing you at the Stations of the Cross at 6 pm this coming Friday. The fish fry starts earlier but you can come to the Stations and then go over to the Parish Center. The service lasts about 25 minutes. The fish fry closes at 8 pm.

The 2011 Pastoral Services Campaign (PSA) has as its motto: *Proud to be Catholic*. The sticker I received at the beginning of the Campaign is still on my car window. As I get out of my car when am out and about, I sometimes wonder what passers-by think when they read those words. I hope I make a favorable impression.

I am still "Proud to be Catholic" and I hope you are too. Last year the Diocese raised more than \$10.8 million from 33,463 generous donors who supported our parishes, schools, outreach ministries, clergy foundation, and faith formation initiatives and programs in the Diocese.

Bishop Tod Brown in a letter to parishioners wrote these words: "Your tax-deductible gift to the 2012 Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA) makes a difference...and benefits every Catholic in our Diocese of Orange. Without funding from the PSA, numerous essential programs, services and ministries throughout our Diocese would not be able to function. ### RCIA CANDIDATE SPOTLIGHT CHARLIE BENDER



I had been attending a Lutheran church until entering college, where I found myself spending more time with books than attending church services. Years went by; in 1998 I met my wife, Ann, at work and our relationship continued from there. Ann comes from a very devoted Catholic family (with a priest and two archbishops, lectur-

ers, etc.) Being Lutheran it was rather simple to step into the Catholic faith and practices. We have two children, Kelly, 10, and Jack, 6; both attend St. Juliana School and we have been active in the parish for approximately nine years.

I had never really thought about becoming Catholic, even though all our friends are members of the Church. We practice the Faith, but still it never really occurred to me to 'jump into the pool.' Then it happened! First my son Jack out of the blue asked me, "Why aren't you Catholic?" I had no answer but, "I don't know." Secondly several weeks later, Ann and I were at an adult school function sitting at a dinner table with Fr. Frank, where he was discussing the RCIA program with some other attendees. In the middle of the discussion I interjected that I would like to be involved in that group. All Ann could say was, "Really, really, you would do that?" I responded, "Yes," with Fr. Frank still at the table, and the journey began.

I look forward to continuing my journey with God and absorbing all the good that comes with it.


