

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

This past week our parish school community observed Catholic Schools Week with enlivening energy and get-go. The kick-off last Sunday with the presence of our school children, parents, and school staff at the 9am and 11am Masses was a

memorable celebration. Our children's choir under the direction of Claudia Kellogg sang so beautifully with vigorous and pleasing voices. My thanks also to the Spirit group under the direction of Donna Fairrington for their energetic presence at the 9am Mass which is usually the choir Mass. All in all I was very pleased with our festivities. The installation of our new School Board added an element of professional pride. Thanks to your generosity the second collection for the school realized \$2,183.

No doubt over the past few years you have heard me talk about the Secular Order of the Servants of Mary (OSSM). From the earliest days of the Order, there have been married couples and individuals who desired to share in the spirituality of the friars. The majority of these people remained in their own homes, fulfilling their family responsibilities and carrying out their tasks in the work force and society of their time. The Secular Order of Servants of Mary was officially recognized by Pope Martin V in 1424.

The Secular Servite vocation is a special calling within the Church. The vocation finds its root in baptismal consecration. A Secular Servite commits to bring to fulfillment the Gospel commandment to love. He or she strives towards holiness according to the spirituality of the Servite Order, following the directives of the Secular Order Rule of Life. With the friars, sisters, and other members of the international Servite family, the Secular Order shares the same ideal, the same commitment to the evangelical and apostolic life, and the same devotion to Mary, Mother of the Lord.

At present the newly formed Secular Order community here at St. Juliana has six members. The name they gave their community is "St. Juliana of the Eucharist." Prior to forming this new community, the Secular Servites spent a year in formation studying the Rule of Life and history of the Order. The prior of the community is Dave Lazaro; assistant prioress, Heather Lazaro; secretary, Pat Riehl. The council has three councilors: Kathy Murphy, Shirley Halpin, & Tony Tranchida.

The month of February is dedicated to the memory of our Seven Holy Founders whose feast day is celebrated in the universal church calendar on February 17th. The Secular Order community would like to invite parishioners to an evening of reflection, Tuesday, February 21st at 7pm in the Parish Center meeting room three. At this gathering more information and personal testimony will be shared in the expectation that we will be able to create a new formation group to expand membership in the Secular Order. A sign-up sheet will be in the back of church as an encouragement to come, see and listen. Refreshments will be served.

Celebration Publications is a written homiletic resource that I use regularly to help prepare for preaching at weekend Masses. In an article written by Patricia Datchuck Sanchez and Rafael Sanchez Alonso entitled 'Look Both Ways!' the authors write: "When children are in their formative years, most families have a litary of rules that are intended to help the young ones

grow to well-balanced, happy, wholesome and holy maturity: 'Wash your hands....Brush your teeth...Eat your vegetables...Say "Please" and "Thank you"...Don't talk to strangers...Tell the truth...Don't gossip...Stand up straight...Play fair...Cover your mouth when you sneeze...Say your prayers... Be grateful.' Along with these and many others that you might remember, most of us also heard 'Look both ways' before we ventured out into the streets that would lead us from the warmth and safety of home." Here at St. Juliana, leadership has spent time looking back over the past year and I believe we have much to be grateful for and proud of in terms of moving forward. The energy from both leadership and parishioners has been instrumental in taking the best of "looking back" in order to open up "looking forward."

This back and forth process can be demanding and tiresome even in our personal lives. As important as looking back is to seeing our successes and failures, the view is ultimately only important if we are led to what is possible and yet to come. I am deeply committed to this process. While it is easier to leave things alone and be satisfied with what "is," I have to say that complacency scares me. There will come a time when I need to pass on leadership. At that moment, what will bring me the greatest satisfaction and joy, will be the knowledge that I was trusted and I did my best.

The authors I quoted earlier end their reflection with these words: "As we look both ways, we do not linger on the looking back. Rather, we press forward, as did former U.N. Secretary Dag Hamarskjold, who said, 'For all that has been, thanks! For all that will be, Yes!"

I wish to thank our school parents, parishioners, teachers, and friends of St. Juliana School and parish for supporting the annual Gala Auction and Dinner Dance. The festivities take place this weekend and I am confident that the hard work of the committee and volunteers will realize both a financial success and community building. An ever increasing desire of our School Board, Parent Club and Pastoral Council is to create a stronger bond between the school community and the parish. Every parishioner should know where the school is located and keep abreast of all school activities.

This week our Junior High Youth Ministry has two events planned that I hope parents will encourage their teens to attend. On Wednesday, February 8th from 7:30 to 9:00pm in Parish Center Room 1, a guest speaker will present "Personal Responsibility: Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention." On Friday, February 10th, from 7:00 to 10:00pm in the Parish Center our teens will enjoy a special Valentine costume dance, featuring music of the Fifties, Sixties, and Seventies. Sounds like fun.

The author Joel Hawes wrote these words which resonate for me in these busy days. He writes: A good character is, in all cases, the fruit of personal exertion. It is not inherited from parents; it is not created by external advantages; it is no necessary appendage of birth, wealth, talents or station; but it is the result of one's own endeavors----the fruit and reward of good principles manifested in a course of virtuous and honorable action."


