~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Our parish has been blessed with a hardworking and reflective Parish Pastoral Council. Like councils in the past, the one overriding passion of each council member is to bring his/her talents into play for the good of the parish. So that we

may better understand ourselves as a Catholic community, the council has worked tirelessly for the past six months on rewriting our parish vision and mission statements. Vision is how we see ourselves. Mission is how we carry out our vision. On the front cover of the bulletin you will read the following statements: "Our Vision is to live as a people of God with Christ at the center of our lives through liturgy, faith formation and community." "St. Juliana Falconieri Catholic Community is a welcoming family dedicated to proclaiming the Gospel, celebrating the Sacraments, educating, serving, and providing opportunity for all to enrich their faith."

These two statements may seem simple enough. However, the council worked for hours upon hours to state succinctly how we see ourselves as a parish family and what our responsibilities are to ensure the growth and integrity of our parish.

Implied in these statements and underscoring all of our beliefs, is the spirit of service. Mohandas Gandhi, in a publication "The Words of Gandhi" wrote these words which I believe help to bolster our eagerness to be people of service. Gandhi writes: "Do not worry in the least about yourself, leave all worry to God---this appears to be the commandment in all religions. This need not frighten anyone. He who devotes himself to service with a clear conscience, will day by day grasp the necessity for it in greater measure, and will continually grow richer in faith. The path of service can hardly be trodden by one who is not prepared to renounce self-interest, and to recognize the conditions of his birth. Consciously or unconsciously, every one of us does render some service or other. If we cultivate the habit of doing this service deliberately, our desire for service will steadily grow stronger, and will make not only for our own happiness but that of the world at large."

The responsibility of the Parish Pastoral Council in the days ahead will be to identify goals and tasks to implement through each of the parish organizations *(listed on Page Two of this bulletin)* under the "Seven Essential Elements of Parish Life." These goals and tasks will be part of long range planning for the next year and then five years.

While designated leadership is responsible for the day to day operation of a busy parish, each parishioner adds to the expansion of the parish. Parish life is the totality of the gifts and talents of every parishioner. We all bring something of ourselves that God can use to better us personally and St. Juliana community.

An interesting article that appeared in the March 6^{th} edition of the Orange County Register highlights some steps we can take to unlock our potential. The author of the article, Dr. Barton Goldsmith, a psychotherapist, suggests 10 ways we can change our life for the better. He writes: *1) Count your blessings.*

It changes vour perspective for the better; 2) Start vour day the night before. The most successful people I know end their workday by making a list of what they have to do in the following day or two. This allows the subconscious to work on things while you sleep; 3) Be ready to grow up. Adults have the ability to learn to delay gratification, but we also have a choice as to how to behave when things don't go our way. If you remember to take the high road, you'll end up where you want to be; 4) Drop the attitude. It is quite possible that, by feeling entitled, you are pushing away things and people you might like; 5) Don't ignore your emotions, but remember that feelings aren't facts. Emotions need to be honored but just because vou have a feeling doesn't mean that you're right; 6) Watch out for negative thinking. Sometimes we get into negative-feedback loops and don't even know it; 7) Set up and stick to a routine. We are creatures of habit, and good habits help us feel that we have some control over our lives; 8) Drop your resentments. By choosing to drop them you will make your life much lighter; 9) Know who you really are, and learn to honor yourself. Never compromise your personal values and always strive to be your best self; 10) Enjoy a part of every day. Look for those little bright moments that happen all the time but that we often fail to recognize.

The Friday Lenten fish dinners sponsored by the St. Juliana School Parents' Club feeds over two hundred patrons on the Fridays of Lent. If you haven't come to the Parish Center for dinner, there are two more Fridays for you to enjoy the dinners and fellowship. If you would like to combine the



Stations of the Cross and dinner, come to the Church first at 6pm and pray the Stations together with other parishioners and then go over to the Center for dinner.

St. Juliana parish will participate in the Annual Crop Walk for Hunger on Sunday, April 29th. Registration begins at Noon and the Walk begins at 1pm from the corner of Harbor and Wilshire. St. Paul Lutheran Church in Fullerton organizes the Crop Walk under the direction of Pastor Tom Goellrich. As we did last year, St. Juliana will participate but we will need walkers. Our parish representative is Lane Paulsen. Lane can be contacted by e-mail at <u>lanekofc@roadrunner.com</u>. I hope we can get a minimum of 50 walkers.

The Servite Secular Order community, St. Juliana of the Eucharist, will host another information night at 7pm in the Parish Center meeting Room 3 on Wednesday, March 28th. Those interested in knowing more about the Order of Secular Servants of Mary (OSSM) are welcome to attend.

I hope you are using your Operation Rice Bowl. When you have collected your coins, convert them into paper cash and put your donation in an envelope labeled "Operation Rice Bowl" and place it in the collection basket anytime during Lent. Your "alms" is one of the three pillars of Lent.


