~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Congratulations to our new "Elect" who were chosen for Baptism at the Easter Vigil by Bishop Brown at Holy Family Cathedral last Monday, February 27th These Elect are: Kyeleen Beinlich, Chantal Borowski, Jennifer Guadarrama, Cas-

sandra Heise, Sarah Key, Lottie Luke and Luis Lerma. Along with the "Elect", Charlie Bender, Kevin Luke and James Weiks were welcomed as part of the Rite of Recognition as they prepare for the completion of the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

It was a privilege for me to present these Elect and Candidates to the Bishop and to read their names publicly as the entire faith community welcomed them into this phase of their faith formation and on-going growth in the Spirit. Also present at these rites were their sponsors and members of St. Juliana RCIA team: Deacon Gerhard, Barbara Dietterle, Steve Enke, Suzie Lazuka, and Faith Formation Director Michael McHenry. During the Rite of Election the Bishop asked the catechumens: "Therefore do you wish to enter fully into the life of the church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist?" After their response (We Do), the Bishop declared: "My brothers and sisters, I now declare you to be members of the Elect, to be initiated into the sacred mysteries at the next Easter Vigil."

At the conclusion of the Rite of Election, the Bishop addresses the Sponsors of the Candidates for full communion with the Catholic Church to determine whether the Candidates are sufficiently prepared. The Sponsors reply to four questions with: "They Have!" Following the inquiry, he continues: "My brothers and sisters, the church recognizes your desire to be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit and to have a place at Christ's Eucharistic table. Join with us this Lent in a spirit of repentance. Hear the Lord's call to conversion and be faithful to your baptismal covenant."

One of the bulletin inserts this week is a copy of a letter sent to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) by Cardinal Timothy Dolan asking the Bishops to help in the fight to pass the Respect for Rights of Conscience Act. The letter, co -signed by Bishop William Lori, is dated February 24, 2012. Cardinal Dolan along with Bishop William Lori both worry that the mandate sets a terrible precedent for religious liberty. Bishop Tod Brown, the Bishop of the Diocese of Orange, has not issued a letter or statement in this regard as far as I know. When he does, I will make sure it is made public.

The Stations of the Cross devotion celebrated on Friday evenings at 6pm in church captures the Lenten spirit whereby we are called to meditate on the Passion of Our Lord. Tracing his steps through the streets and by-ways of Jerusalem, we journey with Jesus toward the Cross. This is the beginning of his Paschal mystery which helps us to experience his great sacrifice. He has changed the direction of our world. While only a few attended last Friday, I am optimistic that more will come to pray this traditional Lenten prayer. It only takes twenty-five minutes and fills a need in each of us for courage and heroic sacrifice.

The late Archbishop Fulton Sheen (d.1979) was a busy man. In the 1930's and 1940's he hosted a popular weekly radio program. In the 1950's he was the star of the Emmy-winning television program *Life is Worth Living*. He wrote more than 70 books and countless pamphlets on the Catholic faith. He was

much sought after as a preacher and lecturer. He brought dozens of converts into the church, giving each one private instruction in the faith. And for eight years he served as United States national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. Yet in spite of his exhausting schedule, every day Archbishop Sheen set aside an hour for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. This prayer time helped him to start his day. Would you consider coming to Morning Mass, Stations of the Cross, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and quiet time in Church as opportunities to make your day? Prayer, whether public or private, is one of the three pillars of Lent.

This Sunday is our second annual "Get On the Bus" fundraiser in the Parish Center co-sponsored by St. Juliana and The Congregational Church of Fullerton. While all the tickets are sold and perhaps as you read this, the dinner and entertainment are in full swing, there is still time to make a donation if you so choose. Drop your designated gift by the office or mail it. I wish to extend my thanks to Barbara Dietterle and the committee for all their hard work these past months.

Our school dads and daughters will have a ball next Saturday as they celebrate the annual Father-Daughter dance in the Parish Center. It is all about making memories.

Our ushers (ministers of hospitality) will be making a concerted effort to greet you as you come into church for weekend Masses and special occasions. As you leave they will hand you a Sunday bulletin so that you will be able to participate in parish life. The ushers have been instructed to seat late comers and to assist anyone in need. There will always be at least one usher on call at the entrance to the church in case there is an emergency or you need to get directions to the bathrooms. When we have an overflow crowd and all seats are taken, standing is permitted as long as the doorways are clear. When the choir is absent and we have an overflow crowd, the ushers will open the choir loft as well. I hope you will cooperate with our ushers.

Now that our 2012 Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA) is underway, our thermometer will appear in church to keep you abreast of our progress. Early pledges are coming into the office and I am confident that we will reach our goal of 600 pledges. If you give \$5.00 or \$5,000 dollars to the PSA, what is important is not so much the amount but rather the level of commitment. That is a personal decision. The only way we will meet our obligation to the Diocese and then receive our rebate, will depend on the level of cooperation by every parish family. If you are hesitant to support this undertaking, please reconsider.

Our Parish Lenten Mission presentations begin Mon., March 5th and continue through Wed., March 7th. The Mission talks, presented by Fr. Jim Clarke, will be offered twice each day, in the church: 8:30am-10am, and then repeated, 7pm-8:30pm. Fr. Clarke is Director of Spiritual Formation and Assistant Professor of Spiritual Theology at St. John's Seminary in Camarillo. With a background in spirituality, adult education, counseling and psychology, Fr. Clarke currently serves as Chair of the Spirituality Commission for the Los Angeles Archdiocese and is an Associate Spiritual Director at the Cardinal Manning House of Prayer for Priests in Los Angeles. His topic is "Spirituality for Busy People." Please come and bring a friend. Let me close with a Lenten Prayer: "Gracious, merciful Lord, be my guide always. Draw me closer to You. Help me to offer my sacrifices for the good of those most in need. You are the Great Comforter." Amen In the Joy of Our Faith,






CATHOLICISM SERIES with Fr. Robert Barron

40 DAYS FOR LIFE (FEB 22 - APRIL 1) LENTEN PRAYER VIGIL

This Lenten season, Orange County will again be uniting with more than 170 cities across America for the largest coordinated PRO-LIFE PRAYER VIGIL at Planned Parenthood facilities that perform abortions. You can participate in two ways:

1.) **PEACEFUL VIGIL**. In Orange County, we will have continuous peaceful prayer vigils, from 6:30am -6:30pm <u>daily</u> outside the Planned Parenthood Facility located at 700 S. Tustin St. in Orange. St. Juliana has committed to covering the

hours from 7:00am - 3:00pm on Saturday March 24 and also on three Mondays, March 12, 19, & 26 from 10:00am - Noon. We will need to have 4-5 people at the site praying the Rosary during those



hours. The parish Respect Life Group and the Knights of Columbus are coordinating this event. *Please call Barbara Legas at <u>714-870-4214</u> or Al Esser at <u>714-256-5936</u> to volunteer for <i>an hour*. We will have sign-up sheets available in the vestibule after all the Masses on the weekends of March 11 & 18. Show-ups are welcome at the site any time during the 40 days. Abortions are performed every day at this facility.

2.) **PRAYER AND FASTING**. We invite everyone to join together for the 40 days of fervent prayer and fasting for an end to abortion. Fast from any food, TV, radio, etc. one day a week and pray every day.

PARENTAL NOTIFICATION-PETITION SIGNING

The parish Respect Life Group will have a Signature Gathering Campaign on <u>March 10th & 11th</u> outside of church at all Masses. Bishop Brown has approved signature gathering at the parish level for the <u>Parent Notification Initiative</u> to have it on the 2012 November General Election ballot. This initiative will require a doctor to notify parents 48 hours prior to an abortion being performed on their minor daughter. A girl under 18 cannot get a flu shot, a cavity filled or an aspirin dispensed by a school nurse without a parent knowing. But a doctor can perform a surgical or chemical abortion on a minor girl (under 18) without informing her parents. On a daily basis, older men impregnate teen girls and then pressure them to have secret abortions to cover up crimes of statutory rape. Many teens suffer emotional and medical consequences as a result. <u>Please support this effort. It only takes a minute.</u>
