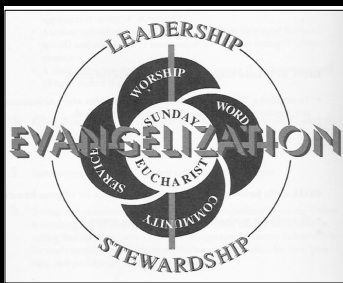

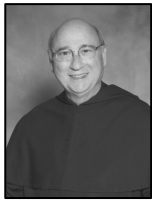

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

The Knights of Columbus "Wearing of the Green" dinner dance in honor of St. Patrick's Day last Saturday inspired parishioners of all ages to be "A Little Bit Irish." Thanks to DJ Vaccher, Paul Vaccher and their families, along with volunteers - the traditional dinner of corned beef and cabbage was exceptionally good and enjoyed by everyone. The Knights under the leadership of Andre Vasquez, Grand Knight, and Ron Trujillo, dinner chairman, once again helped us to enjoy good food, fellowship, and superb entertainment with the Irish dancers.

St. Joseph's Day last Monday didn't get overlooked. Putting aside some business, I was able to provide a smaller version of an Italian meal for the office staff. My family didn't have a particular dish associated with St. Joseph. So I stuck to the usual pasta and sausage. Our Italian Catholic Federation (ICF) will celebrate St. Joseph's Day with the annual St. Joseph Table on Sunday, April 1st in the Parish Center. Everyone is invited to sample the delicious, homemade bakery items. The money raised will be used to help the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

We enter the fifth week of Lent this weekend. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday and then the Sacred Triduum. If you have not participated in the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Holy Saturday Easter Vigil) or it has been a few years since you did, I would encourage you to please give it a try. It seems to me that many parishioners have the mistaken idea that these ceremonies are long and complicated. That is so far from the truth. This holiest of weeks should be a time of great excitement and there should be standing room only in church. Unfortunately, this usually is not the case, although surprises are always possible. It would make me very happy if you attend and enter fully into the sacred Triduum.

Servites all over the world celebrate "Mary at the Foot of the Cross" the Friday before Palm Sunday. This year it is March 30th. I invite you to join me and our Secular Order community as we pray a special prayer service in honor of Our Lady of Sorrows at 7pm in church. The service highlights the role Jesus' mother played in his Passion. It traces her journey with Jesus to Calvary, the foot of the Cross, his burial and then to the home of St. John. I hope you will come.

For the first time this Easter, our St. Vincent de Paul Society will provide Easter food baskets for needy families in the area. Food items are still needed especially those that have practical use. Please check the expiration date on any items you may wish to donate from your own pantry. Peanut Butter is always in short supply and a nourishing staple. We owe our thanks to Paul Durning and the members of the St. Vincent de Paul team for their hard work and charity. Our outreach program makes a difference to those in need.

The Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA) is moving in the right direction. The thermometer in church is on the rise and we get closer to our goal every week. While signing thank you letters to all who have pledged so far, I am struck not only by the generosity of the participants, but also by their sacrifice. To me

that is the most important personal investment in this program. Whether you gave \$10.00 or \$10,000, the sacrifice you made catches the attention of our gracious God who is always ready to give to us from his providence. Don't underestimate the significance of sharing your time, talent, prayer and treasure for the good of the Church. You matter and so does your investment.

Have you ever noticed the image of the pelican on the front of the altar? The first time I saw it, it seemed odd to me that a pelican would adorn the main altar of the church. Besides the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle, the altar is the focus of our attention while in church. In one of the Scripture commentaries I use to prepare my homilies I read that the pelican is a symbol of atonement, the reconciliation of God and man through the death of our Lord on the cross. It is found in many Christian paintings and frescos. It is believed the pelican wounds itself and then feed its young with its own blood. St. Thomas Aquinas addresses Christ as the "Pelican of Mercy."

Our speaker series continues with our guest speaker, Dr. Charles Frazee this Tuesday, March 27th at 7pm in the Parish Center meeting room (1 & 2). Dr. Frazee is a church historian and the author of several books on church history. His topic, "How the Bible Came to Be" will dovetail with what we learned from Rabbi Ken Milhander. He will give an overview of the books of the bible, their origins, authorship and how they made it into the "greatest story ever told."

Recently, I have received e-mails from various sources commenting on the U.S. Department of Health and Human Service Mandate (HHS Mandate). The Catholic Bishops of the United States have issued a number of statements with regard to the intent and danger to Religious Liberty if this Mandate should receive wide support.

I would like to share with you some clarifications of the issue of religious freedom offered by the Catholic bishops as a guide for people of faith. Necessarily I will need to present this in at least three parts.

The bishops write: "We wish to clarify what this debate is--- and is not---about. This is **not** about access to contraception, which is ubiquitous and inexpensive, even when it is not provided by the Church's hand and with the Church's funds. This is **not** about the religious freedom of Catholics only, but also of those who recognize that their cherished beliefs may be next on the block. This is **not** about the bishops' somehow 'banning contraception,' when the U. S. Supreme Court took that issue off the table two generations ago. Indeed, this is **not** about the church wanting to force anybody to do anything; it is instead about the federal government forcing the Church to act against Church teachings. This is **not** about opposition to universal health care.... Finally, this is **not** a Republican or Democratic, a conservative or liberal issue; it is an American issue."

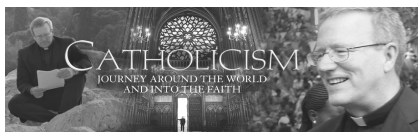
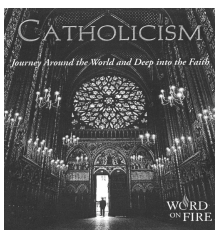

RCIA ELECT SPOTLIGHT KYELEEN BEINLICH



"I have a somewhat diverse background. I grew up attending a Baptist church and school. My father's side of the family is Jewish, so I also celebrated the Jewish holidays as a nod of respect to my family's cultural heritage.

My husband Bruce, a "cradle" Catholic, and I have been married for 10 years. We have two children, a daughter, Simone (7), and a son, Maddox (4). Simone is a first grader at St. Juliana School. When our daughter began attending Kindergarten at St. Juliana we recognized immediately that the church and school community was something "special." We began attending Mass regularly. We believed that by making the commitment to send our daughter to school at St. Juliana we had a duty to commit, or in my husband's case, re-commit ourselves as a family to the Catholic Church. With the anticipation of Simone's First Communion next year, I felt it was time for me to commit fully to joining RCIA. We felt it was important to be a family united in our faith.

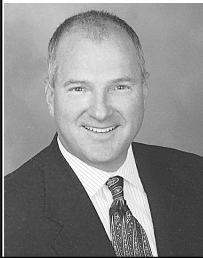
