

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

We are now entering the third full week of Lent. The question that usually pops into my head at this juncture is, "How am I doing with my Lenten discipline of fasting, prayer, and almsgiv-

ing?" These are the three pillars of Lent and ones the Church has adopted for the communal celebration of Lent. It is not just our own personal journey, but it is the journey of the entire Church. We are in this together as it were.

While our morning Mass attendance has increased and about forty faithful come to the Friday Stations of the Cross I believe we could do better. What do you think? It certainly would be a sacrifice to get up early to pray the Mass with fellow parishioners. Are you willing to do that? The Mass readings during Lent help to form us into reflective persons who are challenged to be more forgiving and honest with ourselves and others. The call to conversion and to live the Gospel in our daily lives is the focus of our Lenten Masses.

During Lent I pray the "Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation" during the Morning Masses. Reconciliation is a strong theme during Lent. While we need to pray for the grace of reconciliation all the time, we pray for it more intentionally during Lent. Fr. Anthony de Mello, S.J. often remarked that "Reconciliation alone will save the world, not justice which is generally another word for revenge." That may be overstating the comparison but it certainly is food for thought. He tells a story which illustrates this contrast. "A traveler was walking along the road one day when a man on horseback rushed by. There was an evil look in his eyes and blood on his hands. Minutes later a crowd of riders drew up and wanted to know if the traveler had seen someone with blood on his hands go by. They were in hot pursuit of him. 'Who is he?' the traveler asked. 'An evil-doer,' said the leader of the crowd. 'And you pursue him in order to bring him to justice?' 'No,' said the leader, 'we pursue him in order to show him the way."

Contemporary Catholics influenced by technology and the media find the discipline of prayer and fasting difficult. Think for a minute of all the diet programs we have tried and how much time and effort it takes to remain faithful. Nonetheless, it is not unusual for Catholics to wonder why it matters to God whether we have one meal or three meals in a day. Of course, anything we do for love of God is pleasing to him, but fasting involves more than just pleasing God. When we abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent, and when we cut back on our food intake, we are consciously breaking our normal routines. Acts of self-denial recall to us the forty days Jesus fasted in the desert before he began his public ministry and died on that first Good Friday.

We can turn the difficulty of our Lenten discipline into an opportunity. An unknown author advises us: "The person who has not struggled with difficulty after difficulty cannot know the joy of genuine success. Face the problems, and fight your way

over them. There is more satisfaction in putting forth effort than in gloating over easily won profits. The rungs in the ladder of success are composed of difficulties."

Last Saturday and Sunday we celebrated a number of wonderful events in the life of our parish. Our second grade children participated in the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time on Saturday. Parents presented their children to Father Paul and me, and each child experienced the sacramental grace of forgiveness. They listened with excitement on their faces to the words of absolution: "Through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins, in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen." Sunday these same children attended Mass with their parents and wearing a colorful homemade stole, participated in the Rite of Enrollment for First Communion. Excited about their special day in May, the children wore smiles from "ear to ear." Later in the day, the "Get on the Bus" dinner and concert fundraiser took place in the Parish Center. Proceeds will be used to hire buses to bring children in Orange County and beyond to visit their parents in prison on Mother's Day and Father's Day.

Congratulations to our Eagle Scouts who will be receiving their award this Sunday. While our scouting program seems to have limited appeal here at St. Juliana, those who participate in scouting find it to be character building. That is a good thing.

I wish to thank Fr. Jim Clarke and all who participated in the parish Lenten mission last week. Over sixty parishioners attended the morning sessions and over one hundred attended the evening sessions. Mike McHenry planned and organized the parish mission. Now we will begin plans for the next presentation in our Adult Faith Formation series with the program, "Catholicism" written by Father Robert Barron beginning on April 19th in the Parish Center. This is a ten-week series which follows talks by Father Barron on a CD with a companion text book. All participants will have the opportunity to purchase the text.

Everyone is Irish on St. Patrick's Day. Chicago, New York, Boston among other cities usually pull out all the stops to celebrate the "greening of the day." The Chicago city council dyes the Chicago river green on St. Patrick's day and the parade down State street is a Chicago institution. I am sure Los Angeles celebrates as well. Here in Fullerton, our Knights of Columbus will provide a delicious corned beef and cabbage dinner in honor of St. Patrick next Saturday, March 17th at 6 pm in the Parish Center. The day should be fun even if Fullerton Creek isn't green.

I leave you with this parting thought from Joel Barker: "Vision without action is a dream. Action without vision is simply passing the time. Action with vision is making a positive difference."

PARENTAL NOTIFICATION-PETITION SIGNING

The parish Respect Life Group will have a Signature Gathering Campaign on March 10th & 11th outside of church at all Masses. Bishop Brown has approved signature gathering at the parish level for the Parent Notification Initiative to have it on the 2012 November General Election ballot. This initiative will require a doctor to notify parents 48 hours prior to an abortion being performed on their minor daughter. A girl under 18 cannot get a flu shot, a cavity filled or an aspirin dispensed by a school nurse without a parent knowing. But a doctor can perform a surgical or chemical abortion on a minor girl (under 18) without informing her parents. On a daily basis, older men impregnate teen girls and then pressure them to have secret abortions to cover up crimes of statutory rape. Many teens suffer emotional and medical consequences as a result. Please support this effort. It only takes a minute.
