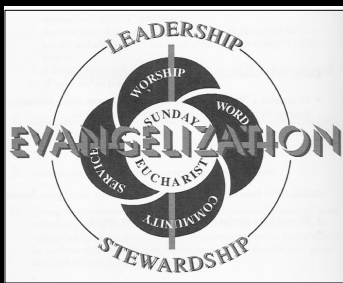

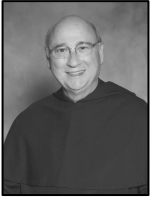

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Mornings are the best time for me. I've always been an early riser. During my seminary days, there was no such thing as "sleeping in." The discipline of seminary life meant that an average day began at 5:15am and 6:15am on Sunday.

Mornings in those days were busy times. I had less than thirty minutes to wash up, dress, make my bed and line up for chapel. Sometimes mornings could be dreadful, especially after a fitful sleep. My first thought on some mornings was a familiar question: "What's in store for me today?" Study, prayer, physical labor, a little play time, and daily accountability characterized the rhythm of daily life in the seminary.

Much of my seminary training during high school, college, theology, graduate school, and the final days before ordination in 1967, still influences how I start and live my day. It's a balancing act for me...balancing my personal daily discipline and the challenges of ministry. My alarm sounds at 5am and my first thought on most mornings has a familiar ring to it, "What's in store for me today?" There is still "study, prayer, a little play, physical labor, and daily accountability." My day to day pastoral ministry centers around the celebration of the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and other duties as outlined in canon law. At no time do I ever try to manage every aspect of busy parish life. With over 47 parish organizations, I have been blessed with a competent auxiliary staff and leadership through our Parish Pastoral Council. We work together with the best interests of the parish at heart.

The ministry tools I have developed over the past 45 years help to guide me in making day to day decisions. Often the demands of parish life need to be situated into the larger picture of what is the most widely accepted contemporary understanding of how a parish defines itself. There are constant updates from the Bishop and diocesan officials which we in leadership need to follow.

In the past 45 years I have learned a great deal from my brother priests, pastors who have mentored me, spiritual directors and trusted parishioners whose advice I value. I have learned also that as a parochial vicar and pastor that my life is lived mostly in public view...every word, gesture, smile, or frown, is in full view of on average 3,000 persons with individual personalities. Everyone has an opinion but thankfully most are non-judgmental. They appreciate the complexity of contemporary parish life and the self-sacrifice necessary to fulfill a priestly vocation.

And it's not just about an ordained priestly vocation. It is the vocation of every parishioner who by his or her baptism is a partner in the priestly office of pastor. Partnerships are based on truth and honesty. It is true that we are not always the best judges of how we do life. We make mistakes and need correction. But I do believe that most of us do life honestly and with integrity.

St. Juliana is a great parish and it is a privilege for me to be a partner with you in our pastoral ministry together. The Easter

season upon us now is a glorious time of year. The celebration of Lent and the Holy Triduum along with the outstanding festival of Easter Sunday has brought great joy to everyone who participated. Record numbers of neighbors, friends, and parishioners prayed together and were loud in their praise of the marvelous transformation that took place this Easter.

Easter is a festival of hope and victory. When you awake in the morning and say your prayers be sure to include a prayer of thanksgiving for the "gift of victory." No one or nothing can take that away from you. As humans and as Christians, our lives have a "happy ending;" even if in the short term things seem bleak. Because we are victorious, we are better able to share our gifts, talents, faith, and treasure.



Over and over again I witness the daily generosity and spirit of parishioners like our Knights of Columbus helping the disabled; our Respect Life committee witnessing to the unborn; the ICF and all the members who helped make our St. Joseph's Table a success; our St. Vincent de Paul Society who fed the needy at Easter and the volunteers who made it happen: *Bob Barnard, Joann and Joe Campanella, Larry Duarte, Lucy Duron, Paul and Lois Durning, Al Esser, Paloma Mansfield, Marion Purdy, Tom Stokes, Roe Weatherspoon*, and Servite High School students: *Tyler Emard, Garrett Airey, Mikey Lobasso, and Ryan Viggiano*; the donation of Vincent Cortes, president of *Vincor Construction, Inc.* who waived the \$15,000 cost of seal coating our parking lot; our prayer groups, faith formation volunteers, SRE and school personnel, RCIA, our liturgical ministers and musicians, our children and the list goes on and on; our High School ministry students who prayed the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, all who gave to Operation Rice Bowl, the Lenten Fish Fry volunteers, our Deacons, Fr. Paul, our ministers to the homebound, and the list goes on and on.

So let us stay the course and not let up. We have much more to do. Our parish is a living, dynamic work in progress. So every day as I begin my day with its familiar ring, I try to claim the advice of Saints of old who advise me and us to adopt the spiritual discipline of calling forth the Holy Spirit by a fourfold discipline: 1) *Quiet your mind*; 2) *Form your mind*; 3) *Write it down*; 4) *Keep it fresh*. That's the plan.

I'd like to close with an anecdote called, "Don't watch-Participate!" *In the mid-1950's, the City of Toronto decided to hold its first-ever Easter parade. The city fathers announced that the parade would take place at 10am on Easter Sunday. The day of the event, the citizens of Toronto turned out in full force to watch the parade. They waited all morning, but no parade ever happened. Disappointed, the citizens went home---angry at what they assumed was some sort of hoax. What the citizens of Toronto failed to realize was that an Easter parade wasn't something you watched; it was something you did. You were supposed to dress in your finest clothes, join arms with your fellow citizens, and "parade" down the center of the street.*
