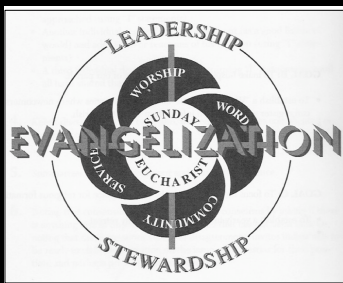

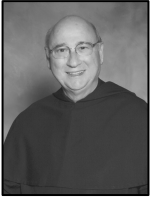

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

The celebration last Sunday of *Divine Mercy* brought great joy to all who attended the afternoon services. The lilting melody of the *Divine Mercy* chaplet sung by Maureen Harry called the faithful to experience a deeper and more abiding presence of the Risen Lord and his "*Mercy upon us and upon the whole world.*"

The afternoon began with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the recitation of the Luminous Mysteries of the rosary, prayers led by Donna Dostalick, the recitation of the chaplet, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Mass followed after a brief time of private reflection.

I extend my gratitude to all who planned and participated in the services: Donna Dostalick, Chris Parker, Sal Mancino, our Eucharistic Ministers, musicians Tim and Kimber Parks, Maureen Harry, Judy Davilla, and volunteers: Rita Semple, Drew Martin, Al and Regina Esser, and Diana Johannes. I apologize if I left someone out. Let me know if I did and I will add names to next week's column.

This past Saturday about ten parishioners gathered in Room 1-2 in the Parish Center for a mini retreat and kick-off of our adult faith formation series, *Catholicism*. The group viewed the first two CD's: "*Amazed and Afraid: The Revelation of God Becoming Man*" and "*Happy Are We: The Teachings of Jesus.*" The series was written by Chicago priest, theologian, historian, and Scripture scholar, Father Robert Barron. Our Faith Formation director, Mike McHenry, planned this twelve-part series to fulfill our mandate to bring our Catholic Faith into the ordinary circumstances of our lives. The series will continue for ten weeks on Thursday evenings at 7pm in the Parish Center or Room 1-2. I encourage you and all of our parish leaders to attend.

We have a few guest speakers planned for future programs. Pastor Sara McCurdy from Morningside Presbyterian Church will speak to us outlining some of the basic tenets of the Presbyterian Church. Father Al Baca will share ways in which we can develop an ecumenical attitude and appreciate the diversity in the various faith traditions of the Church. Mr. Dan Daley from the Alzheimer Association, Orange County Chapter has been invited to speak to those who have a special interest or would like to know more about this most common form of dementia. The dates for these talks will be published in sufficient time to mark your calendar. Mr. Daley can be reached at 949-637-0994 if you need immediate assistance.

Mike McHenry is in the process of organizing a Faith Formation Library in the Parish Office. Once the books and CD's are organized and catalogued for parishioner use, materials will be available to be signed out. We have a substantial amount of books and audio-visual materials. If this project is successful, it will be a great asset to our faith formation. As soon as the library becomes available, I will let you know.

The feast day of St. Peregrine is May 4th in the liturgical calendar of the Servite Order. I would like to invite you to a special Mass of Healing in honor of St. Peregrine with anointing of the

sick and blessing with the relic of St. Peregrine on Sunday, May 6th at 2:30pm in the afternoon. This Mass will be in addition to the regular Sunday Mass. The prayers and readings will be taken from the Mass in Honor of St. Peregrine in the Servite Missal. If you have friends who suffer from an active cancer or are in remission, please invite them to attend this service.

In and around the year 1283 CE, St. Peregrine received the Servite habit in the priory of Siena, Italy. Later he entered the Priory in Forli where he dedicated his life to the service of the poor and daily prayer. Struck with a cancerous sore on his leg, he was miraculously healed while in prayer before an image of the Crucified Christ in the Chapter room in Forli. Because of this his intercession is sought with great faith by the sick, especially by those with incurable illnesses.

Servites see realized in Peregrine their ideals in a striking way: service, prayer, devotion to Our Lady, especially under her title "*Our Lady of Sorrows,*" and love of others, especially the poor. Peregrine was canonized in 1726. His body is venerated in the Servite church in Forli.

I hope to participate in the National Day of Prayer at the Doheny Beach Conference Center at UC Irvine Campus on Thursday, May 3rd at 10am. If you would like to join me, we can car pool. Rev. Darrell McGowan from First Christian Church and fellow member of FIMA is the contact person. The purpose of the Day of Prayer is to engage in prayer practices from many traditions, learn from each other, and stand together for the dignity and honor of all people regardless of race, color, or religious affiliation.

Ministering to our children and young people is at the heart of what Jesus calls His people to do. I am reminded of this as we remember that April has been declared by the President to be "Child Abuse Prevention Month." We are committed to following the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* and the subsequent safe environment program established by the Diocese of Orange. Our school and church diligently continue to maintain and follow all safe environment mandates passed down from the diocese. I wish to extend my thanks to everyone who has taken the time to complete our safe environment program so that they may volunteer to help our young people. Vicki Delaney who directs this program for our parish has been working tirelessly to ensure compliance on every level. You may contact Vicki at the Parish Office number: (714) 879-1965.

For the past few weeks we have considered the HHS mandate. The Catholic Bishops' end their Statement on Religious Freedom with these words: "*...we call upon the Catholic faithful, and all people of faith, throughout our country, to join us in prayer and penance for our leaders and for the complete protection of our First Freedom---religious liberty---which is not only protected in the laws and customs of our great nation, but rooted in the teachings of our great Tradition.*"

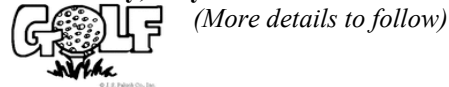

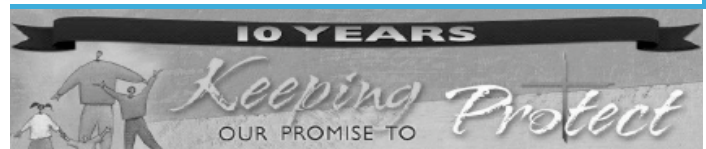

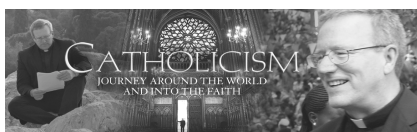

The National team reported that 718 babies were saved in the USA and 8 abortion workers quit their jobs because of people praying. In Orange County there were **5 confirmed babies saved** at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility in Orange. 25 Catholic churches in Orange County participated in the prayer vigils outside of Planned Parenthood. 35 parishioners from St. Juliana's took part in the prayer vigils, some going more than once. Also students from Servite High School were praying the Rosary daily, on campus, for the intentions of the **40 Days For Life Campaign**. Remember that although the campaign has finished, abortions still happen every day and prayer warriors are needed every day all during the year.

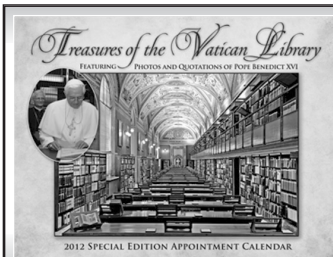

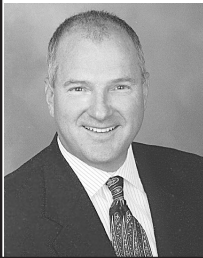
