~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

The Easter Season continues. Every day the Scripture readings at Mass, especially from the earliest account of the primitive church in the Acts of the Apostles, unfold the layers of meaning in the Easter event: victory, new life, resur-

rection, joy, fellowship, community, witness. These are what we might call, "paschal" events that characterized the first Christian communities that formed slowly around the preaching of the Apostles, especially St. Paul.

If I were to choose one "word" or "event" in the post Resurrection stories that stands out in my life it is the word, "light." Every year as we read both the Christmas narrative of St. John and then his later writings, we see over and over how Christ is the light of the world. Darkness never tells us the truth for when we are in darkness we only see dimly. Darkness is the narrow view while light is the larger or total view.

Grandmother asked her grandson, "Do you say your prayers every night?" Grandson: "Oh, yes!" Grandmother: "And every morning?" Grandson: "No. I'm not scared in the daytime." Everything seems better in the daytime. The "Light of Christ" helps us to see the total view. Searching for truth in the darkness is futile. Searching for truth in the light is life-giving.

I believe all the wonderful parishioners and friends who have been coming faithfully to the *Catholicism* adult faith formation series in the Parish Center on Thursday evenings are searching for truth. I believe our pastoral council planning for our future and formulating a vision and goals for the parish in union with the pastor is searching for truth. I believe those who will walk for hunger (Crop Walk) on April 29th and those who will attend the National Day of Prayer with me on May 3rd are searching for truth. I believe our teachers, catechists, ministers, parents, seniors, facilities staff, office staff, children, teenagers, confirmands, children preparing for First Communion, RCIA neophytes, St. Vincent de Paul, Knights, music ministers, deacons are searching for the light of truth.

When Mike McHenry and I attended the Diocesan day of planning for creating a parish catechetical plan, we learned how important this plan will be for our parish to ensure that we are in compliance with all that is expected of us in passing on our Catholic Faith. We heard these words to us: "That plan should reflect the priority of adult catechesis.....It (plan) should develop goals and objectives specific to the parish community and include the regular assessment of progress toward the achievement of those goals and objectives." Mike and his planning committee along with our pastoral council will create this plan for us and it will be filled with the truth....the light of Christ.

Our Respect Life Committee will be living in the light of Christ on Mother's Day weekend selling flowers to help pass on life and protect the unborn. Our school parents who composed and printed a cookbook keepsake, "God's Bounty" to help our parish school continue to teach the truth of our Faith worked hard for months living in the light of Christ. The author Jeffrey Bores touches on this search for truth when he wrote these words: "If you organize your life around the things you are passionate about, nothing is a time burden. You end up spending time with people you want to spend time with and doing what you love."

During an interview with Deacon Chuck Doidge and his wife Yolande who will be joining us on May 1st, I was struck by their sincerity and eagerness to share their ministry with us and how the sacrifices they have made to arrive at this moment in their lives radiate the light of Christ. The light of Christ will shine through the priest candidates who will be ordained for the Diocese of Orange on June 9th. These four young men will serve generously the needs of the Church. In the declaration of the "Oath of Freedom" they will recite in one voice as I did 45 years ago these words: "I attest under oath first of all that I am impelled by no compulsion or force or fear to receive this Sacred Order, but that I voluntarily desire it and wish to receive it of my own free will, since I believe and feel that I am truly called by God." If I were to give them a fatherly word to help them along, I would say: "Never forget to discern the call of God over and over in your life. It's not a once upon a time kind of thing. Also, don't forget in the lonely times that you voluntarily desired and received the gift of ordination of your own free will. Never will God's grace be lacking"

I am so grateful to all who work so hard in the front lines and behind the scenes in our parish life. I am privileged to observe every day honest, truthful, prayerful and unassuming parishioners. Those who intentionally partner with me and trust me bring me joy. Our life together is not always even and sometimes off task. But we forge ahead in search of the truth of Christ.

Father Anthony de Mello wrote this tidbit which I hope is a fitting conclusion. He writes: It was time for the monsoon rains to begin and a very old man was digging holes in his garden. "What are you doing?" his neighbor asked. "Planting mango trees," was the reply. "Do you expect to eat mangoes from those trees?" "No, I won't live long enough for that. But others will. It occurred to me the other day that all my life I have enjoyed mangoes planted by other people. This is my way of showing them my gratitude."






