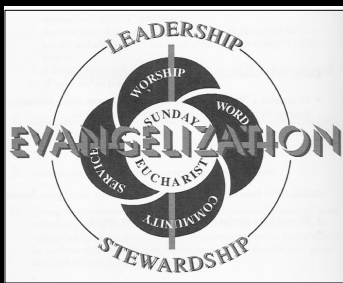

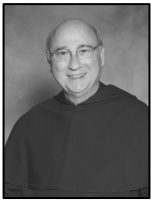

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~



A blessed Easter to St. Juliana parishioners, visitors, relatives and friends! May this festival of joy bring you renewed hope, comfort, and refreshment! All over the world this day, Christians put aside their differences and join in professing one common faith:

“Jesus Christ is Risen....Alleluia, Alleluia!”

Welcome home to all of our college students during spring break. By now you may be getting ready to return to school. If that is the case, I hope your stay was a wonderful family reunion. I wish you success in your studies and my prayer for your continued growth in our Catholic Faith is a reminder of how important you are to your family and your parish family here at St. Juliana.

During this Easter season we strive to live the message of resurrection in a visible way so that people who see us will know that we are blessed with hope. Cardinal Basil Hume once said that “the gift of Easter is Hope.” A random sidewalk survey was taken a few years ago about Easter. People were asked, “Do you celebrate Easter?” and, if yes, “Why? What is it you’re celebrating?” Here’s a sampling of answers: “I think it’s about God...isn’t it?” “It’s when Jesus was born. No, wait. It’s something else about Jesus.” “I have no idea.”

To prepare my Sunday homilies I often refer to a homiletic aid called, “Connections.” The author of the text for Easter Sunday wrote a beautiful reflection entitled: “While it was still dark.” He writes: “*Easter begins in the dark. Always! In all the accounts of the resurrection, Mary of Magdala comes to the tomb while it is still dark. She feels the predawn darkness around her and within her: a void of hopelessness, a crushing sense of loss, grief that cannot be articulated in words.*”

“Easter begins in the dark of night. If you have ever kept vigil, worried to death at the bedside of a loved one, if you have ever been unable to sleep because of what was to come, if you have ever been overwhelmed by doubt or grief Easter has dawned in your life. God has been with you through those long hours; God has embraced you in your isolation; God has come in the morning.”

“Easter begins in the dark earth. Easter is a seed planted in the new spring soil that struggles through the winter hardness to blossom. If you’ve ever struggled to change or worked hard to remake your life in the wake of loss, hurt or devastation, Easter has dawned in your life. Easter is that light that reveals death is not the final ending but the passage way to the God who first breathed life into you.”

“Easter begins in ashes. If you’ve ever been swallowed up in hopelessness or fear or if you’ve ever been paralyzed by hurt or ill-treatment, Easter has dawned in your life. No matter how hard we fall, no matter how broken we are, no matter how deep the chasm into which we’ve, fallen Easter is the Risen one walking in your midst in the compassion of loved ones, the support of friends, the dedication of saints.”

In an Easter homily entitled, “*The Scope of Resurrection*” written by Father James Smith, we read these words: “*A Christian is not one who merely believes in the resurrection of Christ; a Christian is not one who merely believes in their own resurrection after death. A Christian is one who believes that death and resurrection are a way of life---that joy really does bloom in the soil of sadness, that hope really does spring from the dust of deadly things. A Christian is one who believes that daily dying and rising are practice for the final event.*”

A few weeks ago I received an e-mail from Rabbi Dr. Arthur Levine. Rabbi Levine is a member of Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association (FIMA) and divides his time between Fullerton and Jerusalem, Israel. As part our “Speaker Series” Rabbi Levine will be presenting a Passover education program here at St. Juliana this **Monday, April 9th at 7pm** in meeting room 1-2 in the Parish Center. He has entitled his presentation: “*A Jewish ‘Magical Mystery Tour:’ Exploring Historical, Mystical, Spiritual, and Halachic (Jewish Legal) Interpretations of Seder Rituals.*”

The Jewish ritual celebration of the *Pesach* (Passover) and the *Festival of Unleavened Bread* is thought to be the oldest continuously performed ceremony in the world. Discussions of home *Seder* rituals appear in the *Mishnah* (the first comprehensive written compilation of Jewish oral law of which we are aware), around 200 CE (Common Era). From this we know that Jews have conducted *seders* in their homes for at least 2,200 years, even while the Second Temple in Jerusalem still stood. Just as there were fifteen semicircular steps leading into the Temple, the *Seder* is comprised of fifteen elements. Come and explore them and learn about this fascinating ritual. This year the Jewish Passover and Easter Sunday coincide. Please come and bring a friend.

The Sunday after Easter Sunday is *Divine Mercy Sunday*. The rosary and prayers will begin at 2pm with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament followed by the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Mass. We will not have confessions during the devotions and Mass. Please celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation within eight days before or after *Divine Mercy Sunday*. I hope all who have a particular love for this devotion will attend. Pope John Paul II had a special affection for Maria Faustina, the Polish nun he honored with sainthood. St. Faustina received this devotion in private revelations that the church has authenticated and offered for public veneration.

An exciting adult religious education series planned for the parish which will take place over a ten week period is entitled *Catholicism ~ Journey Around the World and Deep Into the Faith*. The kick-off and mini-retreat for this program will take place in meeting room 1-2 in the Parish Center on Saturday, April 14th at 9am. More information can be found on page six and on the flyer in this bulletin.
