~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Deepak Chopra who has written a number of books and articles on mental health, relaxation, the power of positive thinking, aging, and a slate of related topics wrote these words: *"Even when you think you have your life all mapped out, things*

happen that shape your destiny in ways you might never have imagined." I certainly experienced a life changing moment when I was asked to come to Orange County and minister as pastor here at St. Juliana. It was both an unexpected moment and an exciting possibility. Some parishioners interpreted my body language at the time (quiet and somewhat downcast) as being unfriendly. I found that out later. However, no one asked me how I felt to be 2,300 miles away from my family, friends and Servite life as I lived it for sixty-eight years in the Midwest.

In June I will begin my fourth year as pastor. I believe we have worked well together and I am especially grateful to the parish office staff, the school community, the pastoral council, our deacons, and those ministries and leaders who have partnered with me in establishing goals as we move forward in "growing the Lord's vineyard."

Besides your trust in me and your collaboration I could not have accomplished my vision thus far without Father Paul's help. Father Paul, as you know, is a high energy, talkative, and cheerful person. As I have often told him, he was born "excited." Effective June, 2012 our Servite Provincial, Father John Fontana, O.S.M. has appointed Father Paul pastor of our Servite Church, Seven Holy Founders, in Affton (St. Louis), Missouri. (See page five for more info from Fr. Paul.) After 17 or more years here in Southern California, Paul will be returning to the Midwest and taking up the challenge of pastoring a large parish in south county, St. Louis. The pastor of Seven Holy Founders, Father Donald Siple (Cy-pell), O.S.M. has accepted the pastorate of St. Philip parish here in Fullerton. This will be his first assignment in Southern California. Father David Gallegos, O.S.M., will step down as pastor and continue to work as parochial vicar.

Since Father Paul's departure will leave an opening here for a parochial vicar, the Provincial has asked Father Luke Stano, O.S.M. to return to St. Juliana as parochial vicar and minister with me as we continue to celebrate the sacramental life of the parish and fulfill the obligations outlined by the Diocese of Orange and canon law. While I haven't talked to Father Luke as of this writing, I am sure he is as surprised as I am that he will be returning after a three year absence. Father Luke is certainly loved by all the parishioners and his return will be welcomed with open arms. The details of Father Luke's ministry will be worked out when he arrives. I will keep you posted.

With all this change going on, it may be of comfort to ponder the words of two co-authors, Dr. Paul Ray and Sherry Anderson: "Our future is not merely something that happens to us but something that we participate in creating. If we do this consciously, we can create a world (parish) that works." I believe that when God revealed himself as Creator in the opening pages of the book of Genesis, he meant to share that creativity with each of us. The great enemy of creativity is *inertia*. While it is not healthy to be *unsatisfied* all the time...to be a restless spirit, it is equally unhealthy, I believe, to be *satisfied* all the time. The pursuit of excellence as we grow in faith and community life is a *blessed pursuit* which we are called to embrace wholeheartedly.

There is such a thing as the "Art of Possibility." It is at work in all of us who embrace it enthusiastically. It is like the old question, "Is the glass half full or half empty." The art of possibility,

if practiced wholeheartedly, has a hidden element that only gets revealed in time. It is like an investment. Keep on looking for "possibility" and one day it hits you in the face and becomes a "wow" moment. The parable of the father and his four young sons illustrates this point. It goes like this: "Four young men sit by bedside of their dying father. The old man, with his last breath, tells them there is a huge treasure buried in the family fields. The sons crowd around him crying, 'Where, where?' but it is too late. The day after the funeral and for many days to come, the young men go out with their picks and shovels and turn the soil, digging deeply into the ground from one end of each field to the other. They find nothing and, bitterly disappointed, abandon the search. The next season the farm has its best harvest ever."

Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers and mothers-to-be. I hope you get a visit from your children or at least a phone call. There was a short article in a national magazine some time ago that said if stay-at-home moms were to be compensated according to what they are worth, they would command a salary of over \$134,000 a year. As for working moms, they deserve to be paid nearly \$86,000 a year just for their household duties, including those of chef, accountant, teacher, chauffer, and nurse. Of course a mother's true worth can't be measured in dollars and cents; they are priceless.

On a Mother's Day card, a six year-old girl wrote her Mother: "Dear Mom, I'm going to make lunch for you on Mother's day. It's going to be a surprise. P.S. I hope you like pizza and popcorn."

For the past few weeks our faith formation ministry has sponsored a series of CD's written by Father Robert Barron of the Archdiocese of Chicago called: *Catholicism.* On Thursday evenings for the past five weeks, Mike McHenry along with about forty parishioners have viewed a new lesson each week utilizing the CD and a study guide. Some previous episodes included: *The Revelation of God Become Man; The Teachings of Jesus; The Ineffable Mystery of God; Mary Mother of God; The Indispensable Me-Peter, Paul and the Missionary Adventure.* This past Thursday the topic was, *A Body Both Suffering and Glorious-The Mystical Union of Christ and the Church.* This coming Thursday, May 17th at 7 pm the topic will be, *Word Made Flesh, True Bread of Heaven-The Mystery of the Liturgy and the Eucharist.* I hope all of our newly baptized, sponsors, and those who came into full communion with the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil will attend. Everyone is invited and bring a friend.

On Tuesday, May 22nd at 7pm in the Parish Center meeting Rooms 1-2 we welcome Pastor Sara McCurdy of Morningside Presbyterian Church in Fullerton as part of our ecumenical speaker series. Many of our parishioners know Pastor McCurdy and I have the privilege of sharing our common faith with her when we attend the monthly meeting of the Fullerton Interfaith Ministerial Association (FIMA). Pastor Sara will be sharing some fundamental teachings of the Presbyterian Church and how we are alike and different as Catholics. It will be an informative evening and I hope many will attend.

We are in the second quarter of our PSA program and I hope you will participate by making a pledge no matter how small. We hope to have 600 families participate.

Also, our second collection next weekend will be for our parish school in order to help with scholarships for needed families. Again, this is not meant to be a burden. Help out the best you can.

A NOTE FROM FR. PAUL GINS, O.S.M.

Dear friends,

On April 30th I received the following notice from the Archbishop of St. Louis: "In accord with the norm of canon 523 of the *Code of Canon Law*, and upon the presentation of the Very Reverend John M. Fontana, O.S.M., Prior Provincial, Order of Friar Servants of Mary, Unites States of America Province, I freely confer upon you the office of pastor of Seven Holy Founders Parish in Affton, Missouri." … "I take the occasion to express my profound gratitude for your willingness to accept a new pastoral office. At the same time, I assure you of my confidence that you will meet well the challenges of your new Pastorate."

The request to once again serve as a pastor came out of the blue from the Provincial in mid-March. I have enjoyed living in warm climates since August of 1994, I have treasured the closeness to my brother John and his family in Temple City since 1995, my role as pastoral vicar at St. Juliana the last four years, my commitment as chaplain to a number of Knights of Columbus Councils and a 4th degree Assembly, as chaplain to Anaheim Police Department, and my ongoing support of Servite High School as teacher, coach, campus minister, basketball chaplain and sports fan. I balanced all of this with my commitment to Servite Religious life, almost 39 years of being always open to what the Provincial asks of me, and with a desire to again serve the Church in a leadership role, thus, I said yes.

I will be away from the parish as you read this, going to St. Louis from May 9th to 12th to meet with the current parish religious and lay leadership, and then onto Ohio to visit family until returning on the 17th. I have begun packing, recycling books, clothes, and reference materials. The remaining clothes, church history books, a number of breakables and electronics will necessitate my hiring a small trailer and starting my trek East on June 12th or 13th. My arrival by June 19th will enable the current pastor to take vacation before reporting to his new assignment on July 1st. I will be the only priest in the parish with help from a Franciscan priest on the weekend. 
