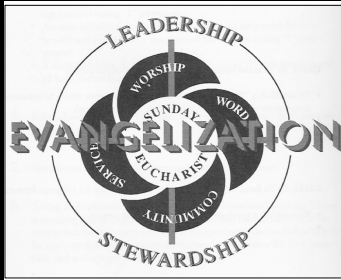

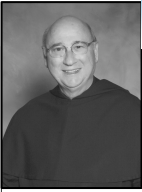

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

We celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of our Lord this weekend. For many years we called this Feast "Ascension Thursday." The church gives us the option to celebrate the Ascension on the closest Sunday which is this weekend. In a simpler and less hectic time it was easier for Catholics to celebrate Mass during the week. Today most Catholics find it difficult to work all day and then try to hustle to Mass. Sometimes it is just a matter of remembering. So the weekend is the best time to reach as many worshippers as possible.

The readings for this feast remind us that the mission of the church is to evangelize. Before Jesus left his disciples physically, he commissioned them to tell everyone the "Good News." Jesus reminds the disciples of his promise to send his Spirit. Baptized in the Holy Spirit, they have the power to preach in the name of Jesus. *"God has given me all the power and authority of heaven and earth. Now I am sending you out to preach to all the nations. I want you to make disciples and baptize them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Teach them to keep my commandments and do all that I have taught you. And I promise you that I am with you always, even to the very end of the world."*

Some years ago the Catholic Bishops of the United States issued a plan for Catholic Evangelization entitled: *"Go and Make Disciples."* In the preamble of the document the Bishops drafted these words: *"Evangelization, then, has both an inward and an outward direction. Inwardly, It calls for our continued receiving of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, our ongoing conversion both individually and as Church. It nurtures us, makes us grow and renews us in holiness as God's people. Outwardly, evangelization addresses those who have not heard the Gospel or, having heard it, have stopped practicing their faith, and those who seek the fullness of faith. It calls us to work for full communion among all who confess Jesus, but do not yet realize the unity for which Christ prayed. Pope John Paul II, in his encyclical on missionary activity, summed up the three objectives of mission: to proclaim the Gospel to all people; to help bring about the reconversion of those who have received the Gospel but live it only nominally; and to deepen the Gospel in the lives of believers."*

Our life here at St. Juliana must be characterized by a deep desire to pray, work, learn, and live our Catholic Faith. Look inside the front cover of the bulletin you are reading and you will find a template of Catholic parish evangelization. This is our template. We created it. This is the way we live our evangelization. The question before us always is, "Am I doing my part to further our evangelization?" "Is coming to Mass enough or is there more that I can do?"

Last week Bishop Brown was with us to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation. My special thanks to Kerry and Maura Condon and the High School Youth Ministry staff for preparing our students. The choir under the direction of Todd Helm and our musicians did a marvelous job. Bishop Brown talked to the students about the "New Evangelization." He told the students, sponsors and all of us that we are the "new evangelizers." He noted that the second largest group of Christians are inactive Catholics. He encouraged us to be strong in our faith and to lead others to a stronger, committed faith.

For the past seven weeks, we have gathered on Thursday evenings after a long day at work and a hurried dinner, to attend the *Catholicism Series* written and narrated by Father Robert E. Barron of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The series is being used as an evangelization and adult faith formation tool. While only a handful of parishioners and visitors have attended, I feel that those who have been

faithful are being lifted up. Last Thursday we viewed lesson seven: *Word Made Flesh, True Bread of Heaven-The Mystery of the Liturgy and the Eucharist.* This Thursday, May 24th Father Baron's topic is, *"A Vast Company of Witnesses - The Communion of Saints."* Father Baron gives consideration to some of the Church's greatest heroes, and demonstrates how their extraordinary examples display both the passion and the creative potential of the Catholic Church. This lesson tells the story of the Church as a vast company of witnesses who are called by Christ to be a Communion of Saints. I hope you will attend.

Monday is the golf tournament for our parish school. It should be fun and I am grateful to the committee for organizing this fundraiser.

This Tuesday I am looking forward to participating in the 8th grade graduation retreat, directed by Scott Kambak, at Marywood. I will celebrate Mass with the students. Scott is an amazing teacher and has been directing the Junior High program for over thirty years. In the evening, at 7pm, I am excited that Pastor Sara McCurdy from Morningside Presbyterian church will be speaking to us on some of the teachings of the Presbyterian Church. This is part of our ecumenical speaker series. I hope you will attend.

Congratulations to Nina Visconti who will be receiving a certificate of recognition from Bishop Tod Brown at the annual *Nominee Luncheon* sponsored by Catholic Charities Auxiliary this Thursday, May 24th. This is in recognition of Nina's sharing of her talents and time as a parish volunteer. The proceeds from this luncheon will help fund the work of Catholic Charities of Orange County. Tracey Irving, from the parish, has also been nominated for her volunteerism by Rosary High School. One woman from all the nominees will receive the Auxiliary's Gold Medallion. Thank you Nina and Tracey for all you do to serve St. Juliana and our community!

Todd Helm and our musicians will be working overtime as we attempt to redefine our music ministry at the 11am and 5pm Sunday Masses. In the meantime, please be patient as we seek out more singers and musicians. If you like to sing and would be willing to audition for Todd, please call the Parish Office. The 11am Mass will continue to have a contemporary ensemble under the direction of Donna Fairrington. The 5pm Mass will be directed toward a more youthful sound both instrumentally and in song. Our excellent choir under Todd's direction will continue to sing at the 9am Sunday Mass (although they do take a hiatus over the summer months.) The Saturday 5pm Mass and the 7:30am Sunday Mass will continue to be organ and cantor. Our cantors, Monette, Theresa, Steve, and Kimber are excellent and Claudia Kellogg is working diligently to master the new Allen Organ and learn more complex music. We have much to be grateful for and to look forward to.

Father Anthony de Mello, S.J. tells a delightful story. *The master was in an expansive mood, so his disciples sought to learn from him the stages....in his quest for the divine. "God first led me by the hand," he said, "into the Land of Action....Then He returned and led me to the Land of Sorrows; there I lived until my heart was purged of every inordinate attachment. That is when I found myself in the Land of Love, whose burning flames consumed whatever was left in me of self. This brought me to the Land of Silence, where the mysteries of life and death were bared before my wondering eyes." "Was that the final stage of your quest?" they asked. "No," the Master said. "One day God said, 'Today I shall take you to the innermost sanctuary of the Temple, to the heart of God himself.' And I was led to the Land of Laughter."*

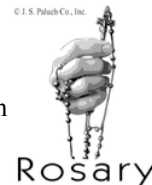

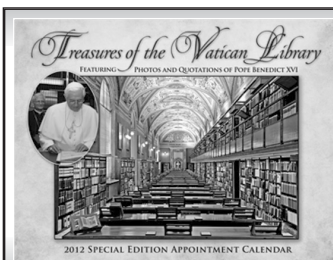

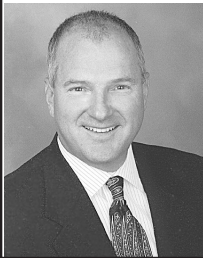
