~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

We all have high expectations of each other. We want our spouse to be the best, our children the smartest, our relatives amiable, our co-workers friendly, our neighbors good. Expectations are part of everyday reality. We expect to be happy,

reasonably healthy, financially secure, and successful in our endeavors.

When expectations are not met or at least seem unrealistic or unfulfilled, we can be discouraged and either abandon the quest or resign ourselves to a feeling of mediocrity. Expectations can be a slippery slope. On the one hand we need to expect great things from each other as parents, family members, co-workers, parishioners, leaders, clergy, etc. On the other hand we also need to know that sometimes these expectations will simply not be met or at least postponed.

The key to understanding expectations in any part of life is to be aware of human frailty. As much as we would all like to be perfect and to expect perfection of others, our view is limited. We see in this life only "dimly" as St. Paul reminds us. Be that as it may, this does not mean we abandon our quest for excellence. We can always be better, and do better, and expect better. One of the most damaging statements heard over and over again in times of transition is, "That's not how we do it" or "That's the way we have always done it."

Patience is a key mind set when struggling with how to make things better. In any walk of life whether in the business world or family life or parish life the quest for betterment needs to be tempered with patience. When we close ourselves off from dialogue or trust that things will be better and can be better, we stay stuck.

There is also another way we can approach the quest for achievement....the inner smile. What the inner smile does it reminds us not to take ourselves too seriously. Yes, we are on a quest but since we are not perfect and others are not perfect, we can accept our limitations even in the midst of hard work.

I am reminded of a story told by Father Anthony de Mello, S.J. He writes: A man walked into a doctor's office and said, "Doctor, I have this awful headache that never leaves me. Could you give me something for it?" "I will," said the doctor, "but I want to check a few things out first. Tell me, do you drink a lot of liquor?" "Liquor?" said the man indignantly, "I never touch the filthy stuff." "How about smoking?" "I think smoking is disgusting. I've never in my life touched tobacco.' "I'm a bit embarrassed to ask this, but---you know the way some men are---do you do any running around at night?" "Of course not. What do you take me for? I'm in bed every night by ten o'clock at the latest." "Tell me," said the doctor, "this pain in the head you speak of, is it a sharp, shooting kind of pain?" "Yes," said the man. "That's it---a sharp, shooting kind of pain." "Simple, my dear fellow! Your trouble is you have your halo on too tight. All we need to do for you is loosen it a bit."

In the months ahead we will be hearing more and more about how we can become visionary people not with a "halo" but in (continued)

our imperfection. We will hear about goals, vision, change, betterment, growth, cooperation, trust, collaboration, partnership, faith formation, financial security, spirituality. We will move forward together or we will stay the same apart. I need to trust you and those in positions of leadership and you need to trust me as your pastor.

When we become "Servant Leaders" to one another we put aside our own agendas or biases and embrace the common good of all. The pastor has been commissioned to make sure that the sacraments are celebrated with dignity, the faithful educated in the ways of our faith and tradition, the corporal works of mercy applied, and the daily life of the parish governed with charity. In collaboration with the faithful, those chosen to be leaders, and the ordained ministers, the pastor in union with the Bishop of the Diocese by whose authority he is appointed as shepherd is an "....indispensable helper and adviser in the ministry and in the task of teaching, sanctifying and shepherding the People of God."

I wish to extend my heartfelt gratitude to our Parish Pastoral Council, staff members, and parishioners who came together and planned for the wonderful reception and celebration of my 45th anniversary of Servite priesthood last Sunday. Thank you for your cards and those of you who were kind and generous with a gift and supportive words. My special thanks to the cel-



ebration chairpeople; Alberta Saran & Jan Fontes - along with Bob Dietterle and all the Pastoral Council members for their attention to details in making this day special. Thanks also to Terry and Donna Reinbold for taking photos.

"On behalf of the children served by Get On The Bus, thank you for your generous donation of \$11,271.21 (from the March 2012 GOTB Dinner and Benefit Concert) that will be utilized to unite children with their parents in prison. Your continued support of our work is very much appreciated, and as such we wanted to provide you with a brief

update of our 2012 GOTB program planning to date:

1.) This year we've received more GOTB applications from families than ever before - an increase of 12%. We've added New Folsom as a prison partnership, which brings us to 10 participating prisons.

2.) Our GOTB visits began with the first Mother's Day event at California Institute for Women in Corona on May 5th, and will end with the last three Father's Day events on June 16th at Salinas Valley Prison, California Training Facility and Solano Prison.

3.) Approximately 1.000 volunteers statewide will assist in the many details and activities necessary to provide GOTB visitations at 10 prisons.

Thank you for helping families cope with the stress, isolation and grief created by the separation of a parent due to incarnation. It is noted that prisoners that receive even one visit during incarceration are less likely to commit another felony upon release and are less likely to end up back in prison.
