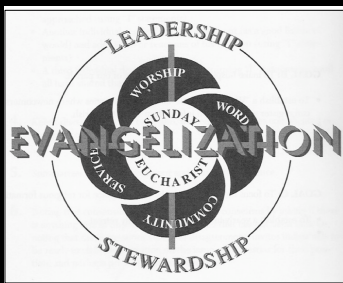

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Congratulations to the *Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange* as they celebrate their 100th anniversary this Sunday afternoon at Sacred Heart Chapel in Orange. The Sisters served for many years in our parish school and Sisters Louise, Mary Bernadette, Joanna and Judith live just around the corner from St. Juliana and attend Mass here when they can. St. Juliana School is still a member of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange School Network. Sister Judith Dugan, S.S.J., has been a member of the planning committee for our new Consultative School Board for the past year and has been an indispensable resource. The Jubilee Mass will be at 2 pm.

I would like to encourage all of our parishioners, especially our school parents and newly married, to attend the *Thriving Marriages Mini-Retreat* next Sunday in the Parish Center from 12 noon to 3:30pm. The presenters will be Dr. John and Claire Yzaguirre, a licensed Psychologist and a Marriage and Family Therapist. Both are deeply committed to helping couples achieve resilient, united and joyful marriages. They are co-authors of "Thriving Marriages: An Inspirational and Practical Guide to Lasting Happiness."

While their work is certainly scholarly and scientific it is at the same time completely practical. In the preface of "Thriving Marriages" the authors write: *"We believe that you will find this book relevant to your own marriage, whether you are newly married, 'empty-nesters' or celebrating a golden anniversary or beyond. We hope that it will inspire and motivate you to practice the strategies that we suggest, and that your marriage will reach a new level of unity, as have countless other couples. The feedback that we receive from the workshops and retreats on marriage and family life that we present across the country underscores the positive impact of this model on lives and marriages. It has helped couples transform their marriage from mere survival or maintenance into a journey of continuous growth. The simplicity of the vision that we propose and the practicality of its approach can transform your marriage into the one that God wishes for both of you."*

The mini-retreat will flesh out these words resulting in fruitful dialogue with the presenters and practical strategies to better the lives of married couples. Please invite other couples to attend with you.

June is the month of St. Juliana's feastday. I believe that a parish should give special recognition to its patron or patroness. Last year we unveiled the newly painted statue of St. Juliana, and thanks to the Visconti Family, we have electronic candles to honor our patroness. Families with children and older parishioners enjoyed outdoor festivities on the feastday itself. While it had the potential to be an inclusive celebration with food, games and special attractions, only a small representation of the parish attended. It seemed like a tremendous amount of work went into preparing and setting up the festivities. So far this year we are unable to find a chairperson or committee to plan the St. Juliana feastday on June 26th (actual feastday is June 19th). Juliana Tapia is planning a *Chili Cook-off* as a kick-off but nothing else is planned. It would be wonderful to have a parish picnic on the field following the 11am Mass with games for the children and some music. Parishioners could bring their barbecues and the parish could provide some drinks, prizes for the games, and hot dogs with condiments. How does that sound? Are you interested in helping to organize the celebration? Let me know.

Parishioners Doug and Jean Knudson have been going down into Mexico volunteering for a community development group called *Corazon*. They found out about the organization through Al and Jean Esser in the 1990's when St. Juliana parish sponsored several house builds in Tijuana. Three Servite High School graduates helped start *Corazon* with their ideas in 1978. Since then *Corazon* has grown to help significantly improve the lives of thousands of Mexicans living in poverty through scholarships, adult and youth

programs, as well as building projects. A number of parish families have recently made financial donations to the *Corazon* gardening program through Doug and Jean. If you would like to help in any way or have questions please e-mail corazongardens@gmail.com or call a *Corazon* at 714-547-0357.

Reading about this program brings to mind the importance of "volunteerism." In today's world young adults and those searching for meaning in their lives often turn to volunteering their time in place of organized religion. One way to reach many of our young, idealistic persons today is to help them find meaning first through some kind of altruistic service. This then becomes an opportunity to take service to a higher level of faith and worship. Volunteerism is not a substitute for faith-filled lives but rather at the service of faith.

A. Quincy Jones wrote these words which I believe apply to volunteerism: *"The medical profession tells us that there are four conditions which must be met if we are to have any chance of leading a happy life: physical security, social recognition, adventure, and emotional security. In today's highly technical and scientific life, these four considerations become increasingly important, but we should add one vital ingredient: love. Love of our fellow man, love for our work, and the conviction that this love insures the future for all of us."*

Our parish is thriving because we have thriving ministries comprised of generous men and women who without thought of compensation or even recognition devote themselves tirelessly to serving the larger community. One group which has perhaps the least amount of exposure is the parish money counters who count the Sunday collection. It is a thankless job and one that is often overlooked as a ministry. My "hat" goes off to these men and women from the parish for the hours they devote to this important task.

There are two inserts in this week's bulletin that I trust will help all of our parishioners as they prepare in the months ahead to elect or re-elect a new president as well as decide on many other issues as outlined by the U.S. Catholic Bishops. A website resource which can be very useful for Catholics voting on a multitude of issues is www.FaithfulCitizenship.org.

In a recent editorial in *America* magazine entitled "Studying Public Religion" the author writes: *"The issue of religion has forced itself into the presidential election campaign. During the long Republican primary campaign, no issue produced as much heat as the place of contraception in health care. Now, as the election campaigns shift into high gear, the U.S. Bishops have announced "a fortnight of freedom" to challenge a multitude of court decisions, legislative initiatives and executive decisions by both state and federal governments as violations of religious liberty."*

The U.S. bishops identify the following as "fundamental problems" of our day and as significant issues in the upcoming election: *Abortion and "other threats"* to those who are weak or vulnerable; *Threats to religious freedom*, namely "renewed efforts to force Catholic ministries--in health care, education, and social services--to violate their consciences or stop serving those in need"; *Efforts to redefine marriage* away from "the permanent, faithful, and fruitful union of one man and one woman"; *The current economic crises* and all that flows from it; *A "broken immigration system"*; *"Wars, Terror, and Violence,"* with a special emphasis on the "absence of justice, security, and peace" in the Middle East.

The author Steve Covey said: *"Maturity is the balance between courage and consideration. If a person can express his feelings and convictions with courage balanced with consideration for the feelings and convictions of another person, he is mature, particularly if the issue is very important to both parties."*

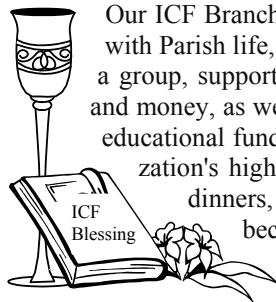
“Walking On Water”
