

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Our eighth grade and kindergarten classes graduated last Friday. I had the privilege of celebrating both ceremonies. We have so much to be proud of as a parish community for the gift of Catholic edu-

cation. We work hard to maintain and protect its vitality. It's expensive, time consuming, and frequently energy sapping. The payoff is priceless. Besides the academic excellence that is so essential, there is the religious dimension that must never be minimized. The two go together and are forever linked. Catholic education is not simply an alternative educational system, it is a religiously value driven and faith based Catholic education al system. When students and/or parents lose that connection or think it can simply be relegated to the teachers or pastoral staff, the school community teeters on a weak foundation. Here at St. Juliana we must never forget, minimize or denigrate that connection. Never!

The author Dean Koontz in one of his books has an interesting insight. He writes: "Some people think only intellect counts: knowing how to solve problems, knowing how to get by, knowing how to identify an advantage and seize it. But the functions of intellect are insufficient without courage, love, friendship, compassion, and empathy." These are the kinds of values that we promote as Catholics in our education, our theology, and our practice both at Sunday Mass and in our daily discourse.

At the eighth grade graduation I told the students a story about the "Grandfather and the Kite." On his 16th birthday grandpa gave his grandson a strange, surprise gift. When the grandson opened the gift he found a kite. Disappointed, he asked his grandfather: why a kite? His grandfather explained that the kite symbolized the ability to look "up." Since the grandson seemed to look down a lot, grandpa thought that flying the kite would force him to look up.

It seems that we look down more than we think. Looking down is often an indication that we live life from moment to moment mostly with what is in front of us. Looking down doesn't always mean we are looking at our toes....rather mostly not looking ahead or beyond what is in front of us.

Living life with what is in front of us is different for all of us. There is a certain kind of immediacy with living life in front of us. It is often unplanned and may not have any thought of the future or what is ahead of us (looking up). For young persons, living life "in front of you" is about having fun, making friends, having nice clothes or shoes, concern over body image, up-todate technology, having and spending money, being popular, competing especially with regard to grades.

When we look up or ahead, we experience life as it could be... we see life not just as it is in front of us, but what lies ahead of us. It is not what is happening to us at the moment, it is what we are creating in advance.

Life ahead of us is all about "possibility." God has planted inside of us the "grace of possibility." When we live life looking up, looking ahead, dreaming with possibility, God adds a second grace: ability. When we face obstacles or life gets too (continued)

hard as we pursue our possibility, we find incredible and unexpected strength and courage. Like a mantra, we keep repeating: "I can do this." "It's not impossible."

Living life as it unfolds "in front of us" has very little possibility because we are comfortable. Living life "ahead of us" is hard work. It is a challenge but has great rewards.

I believe this applies not only to students on the verge of new experiences in their academic careers but to all of us, especially as a parish family. What an enormous treasure we have here at St. Juliana if we pursue our "possibility." Even those of us who are seniors...it's not over. Yes, we may think we "paid our dues," but just think of the collective wisdom, talent, and practical acumen of senior members of the parish. We need to look up to them and seek their advice, practical knowledge, and good sense.

In an around about way, I received news that Annunciation Catholic School will not reopen for the 2012-2013 school year. This decision was made because of a projected drop in an already low enrollment. The letter from the Superintendent of Catholic Schools sent to parents advises, "If you would like to have your student continue his or her Catholic education, we will be happy to facilitate a transfer to St. Pius V School, St. Justin Martyr School, Our Lady of Guadalupe School or any other local diocesan elementary school." While St. Juliana is not mentioned in the letter, our academic excellence and our financial security along with our stable enrollment are well known. We have had a number of applicants which will be an asset to our school. We send our thoughts and prayers to the parents at both St. Philip's (our sister Servite parish) and St. Mary's.

An unknown author shares this wisdom with us that may have some consolation for the many disappointed parents: "There are things that we never want to let go of, people we never want to leave behind. But keep in mind that letting go isn't the end of the world, it's the beginning of a new life."

A movie that is getting a great deal of attention from Catholic groups such as the Knights of Columbus is *For Greater Glory*. This motion picture filmed in Mexico tells the epic, untold story of the Cristero War and a nation's quest for religious liberty. Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson writes in Columbia Magazine: "*For Greater Glory* is a powerful film that provides a compelling account of a forgotten era…It tells a story of enduring relevance, and is a 'must-see' viewing for all who care about faith and liberty today." We hope to have a showing here. It is still in local theaters.

Happy Father's Day! Pam Brown writes; "Dad's don't need to be tall and broad shouldered and clever ... ~ love makes them so!"
