~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Happy celebration of St. Juliana! Juliana was born in Florence, Italy in the second half of the thirteenth century. According to tradition she belonged to the same Falconieri family to which

Saint Alexis, one of the Seven Founders of the Servite Order, is said to have belonged. The central event of her life was her conversion at the age of fifteen to a deeper spiritual life while listening to Saint Alexis preach about the final judgment. From that time on Saint Juliana directed her mind and heart solely to God, and although she remained at home she practiced a life of penance and prayer after the example of the first Servite friars. She frequented the church of Saint Mary of Cafaggio, the future basilica of Santissima Annunziata, and there, together with the friars, she prayed the Divine Office and sang praises to Mary.

Juliana's spirituality was characterized by a love of the Eucharist. When she was dying, her weakness prevented her from receiving the Body of the Lord, and so the Host was placed over her heart. A pious tradition holds that it miraculously penetrated her chest. According to tradition she died in 1341.

Juliana did not found a religious congregation, although many religious sisters and contemplative nuns, who in the course of centuries have dedicated themselves to the service of Mary in the Servite Order have recognized her as their mother and teacher.

We pray: "Lord God, Saint Juliana was a model of chastity and penance and through her you raised up a community of consecrated women within the Family of the Servants of Mary. Grant that your Church remain always faithful to the love of its Bridegroom and continue to burn brightly with the flame of love

consecrated to you alone. We ask this through

Christ our Lord. Amen.



Welcome home to our college students. It is so exciting to see you at Mass. Summer vacation is a time to kick-back, relax and enjoy being with family and friends. Perhaps some of you are recent graduates and looking for work. While relaxing is good, having a job is better. Job searches can be exhausting and frustrating. Please be assured of our prayers for you. The author William James writes these words of encouragement: "Most people never run far enough on their first wind to find out they've got a second. Give your dreams all you've got, and you'll be amazed at the energy that comes out of you.'

I am sure by now you have read that the Crystal Cathedral has been renamed: Christ Cathedral. I am not surprised at the name. Both Cathedrals have the same initials: C.C. While the Catholic mood is jubilant, the mood of the popular Crystal Cathedral ministries is somber but respectful. However, there seems to be a certain amount of resentment on the part of some members of the congregation who not only feel disappointed but see the purchase by the Catholic Church as a betrayal of their Protestant tradition. Hopefully with time this will be seen as a good thing since the message of Christ will continue to be preached and celebrated.

Summertime usually begins when the children are off of

school and vacation commences. While busy parish life slows somewhat and regular meetings are usually postponed until the beginning of the new school year, many ministries continue uninterrupted. Most important of these are those associated with Sunday Liturgy. The dilemma that presents itself centers around what to do when tasks are not honored. Altar servers have busy summer schedules. Some Eucharistic Ministers take a break. Ushers are out-of-town. Lectors can't seem to find replacements. Many liturgical appointments go unfulfilled. I hope that everyone will do their very best to honor their commitments. Please step forward and help whenever there is a need, especially if you are asked to fill-in for an absent minister. Altar servers need constant reminders and I invite parents to please be attentive to serving assignments.

A few weeks ago I wrote about how important music is to our celebration of Mass. Our parish choir under the direction of Todd Helm is excellent with an impressive repertoire and a full range of voices for many styles of music both secular and religious. The choir is composed entirely of volunteer members of the parish. Their loyalty to one another is admirable. They will be missed during their summer recess.

Claudia Kellogg accompanies the choir with organ and piano support along with scheduling cantors, playing key board with the Spirit Group, and accompanying choir rehearsals. Our new organ is an excellent instrument and Claudia is making headway in learning the various combinations of sound that the organ is designed to deliver. She is receiving private coaching and has devoted an impressive schedule of practice time. For all these both Todd and I are very grateful and we know that Claudia will continue to make progress in utilizing the full potential of our new Allen Organ.

Our most important need at the moment is to find musicians to help with the 11am and 5pm Sunday Masses. Donna Farrington has been the motivator, musician, and director of the Spirit group for over 15 years. While Donna will continue to direct the small ensemble at both Masses, we are in the process of interviewing some candidates for the position of directing the 5pm Sunday Mass. My special thanks to *Spirit* group members: Tim Carter, Joan Wismer, Javier Weatherspoon, Jack Lauder, Rudy Pesci, Austin Weber, and Allison Saner and to our cantors: Carol Blair, Steve Hoffman, Kimber Parks, Theresa Raridan, and Monette Velasco. In the name of the parish I wish to acknowledge your loyalty and dedication to this ministry as well as our appreciation to you for sharing your talents in the praise of our Lord in the Liturgy of the Church.

Preaching, prayerfully celebrating Mass with devotion and attention to detail, uplifting music, warm welcoming and an overall ambiance of respect and good manners are ingredients of a successful parish celebration of the Holy Eucharist. It is so important to be on time and to remain in place until the final blessing and dismissal by the celebrant or deacon. It is never permissible to come after the readings or to leave after communion unless there is some urgent reason or dire necessity. Let us be a 100% parish.

Feast day - June 19th; patron saint of bodily ills and sickness.

Born in Florence, Italy in 1270.

Niece of Alexis, one of the canonized Seven Holy Founders of the Order of Friar Servants of Mary (Servites).

Women followed Juliana's religious lead and were clothed sisters of the Third Order of the Servites in 1332.

Died - June 19, 1341.

Canonized a saint on June 16, 1737.

Fra Michele M. Poccianti chronicles St. Juliana Falconieri's life by noting, "...one reads that this very chaste virgin had so strong a devotion to the Passion of Christ that after death the image of Christ Crucified was found imprinted on her breast..."

PARISH FAITH FORMATION **RCIA - RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS**

Are you or someone you love considering joining the catholic faith?

The Adult Catechumenate, also referred to as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), is a community based, four phase process to nurture and guide adults who are seeking information and ultimately initiation into the Catholic faith. The four phases of RCIA are Inquiry, Catechumenate, Enlightenment, and Mystagogia. The length of time to complete the process depends on each participant's individual needs, however conversion and initiation usually revolve around the liturgical calendar. The Easter season is the traditional time when adults are initiated into the faith through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and reception of the Holy Eucharist. After adults have been accepted into the Catechumenate, they are required to gather with the RCIA Team once per week for catechetical instruction and spiritual formation and to join together for communal prayer and reflection on the Scriptures at Sunday liturgy.

We will begin the formation process and classes for 2012-2013 RCIA on Monday, August 20th. Please contact an RCIA Team member or Mike McHenry, the Director of Faith Formation, at St Juliana's Parish Office for more information and details.
