~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Enclosed in the bulletin this week is a dated copy of *The Catholic Worker* newspaper. I have included it so that you will have an opportunity to know something of the Catholic Worker movement begun by

two deeply committed Catholics, *Peter Maurin* and *Dorothy Day* in 1933 in response to the devastating effects of the Great Depression and the societal ills created by the Industrial Revolution and the Communist Revolution in Russia.

Dorothy and Peter began the *Movement* in response to the communist threat in the 20's and 30's with thousands of workers unemployed and with men, women, and children homeless and destitute. Besides publishing the social teachings of the Catholic Church and essays commenting on social problems of the day in *The Catholic Worker*, Dorothy and Peter established *Houses of Hospitality* run entirely by unpaid workers and volunteers to house and feed the nameless thousands living from day to day without basic necessities.

The Catholic Worker movement was the Catholic answer to the growing attraction of socialism among workers who had little recourse. Based on the great social teachings of the church as espoused by Pope Leo XIII in his social encyclical, *Rerum No-varum* (Latin for "On the New Things") and Pope Pius XI in his follow-up encyclical, *Quadragesimo Anno* (Latin for "In the 40th Year") Dorothy and Peter and their many associates gave practical reality to the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy advocated by the Church for centuries,

Peter and Dorothy embodied in their personal lives both in spirit and deed the Works of Mercy. In an essay written by Peter and published in *The Catholic Worker* he writes: *In the first centuries* of Christianity the hungry were fed at a personal sacrifice, the naked were clothed at a personal sacrifice, the homeless were sheltered at a personal sacrifice. And because the poor were fed, clothed and sheltered at a personal sacrifice, the pagans used to say about the Christians, "See how they love each other."

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are: to admonish the sinner, to instruct the ignorant, to counsel the doubtful, to comfort the sorrowful, to bear wrongs patiently, to forgive all injuries, and to pray for the living and the dead.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are: to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to ransom the captive, to harbor the harborless, to visit the sick, and to bury the dead.

The celebrated social teachings of the Church upon which Peter and Dorothy founded *The Catholic Worker* were penned by two renowned Catholic social reformers: Pope Leo XIII and Pope Pius XI.

Pope Leo XIII lived from 1810-1902 and was Pope from 1878-1902. In 1891 he issued his famous social encyclical *Rerum Novarum*. It addressed the condition of the Working Classes. The encyclical discussed the relationship and mutual duties between labor and obtaining capital, as well as government and its citizens. Of primary concern was some betterment for *"The misery and wretchedness pressing so unjustly on the majority of the working class."* It supported the rights of labor to form unions, rejected communism and unrestricted Capitalism, while offering the right to private property. Pope Leo XIII was influential in overcoming child labor and establishing the protection of children and worker's rights, especially the 40 hour week.

Pope Pius XI was born in 1857 and died in 1939. He became Pope in 1922 and wrote 32 encyclicals. His most famous one, *Quadragesimo Anno* was chosen to highlight the 40th anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's encyclical which paved the way for the historic social reforms of 19th and 20th centuries. The reforms outlined in both encyclicals and ones that followed had far reaching effects in society both within and outside of Catholic circles. In the encyclical Pius XI addresses the ethical implications of the social and economic order. He describes the major dangers for human freedom and dignity arising from unrestrained capitalism and totalitarian Communism. Pius emphasizes the principal of subsidiarity and the importance of the "Common Good."

All this being said, it is my hope that as a parish community we will always find ways to promote social justice both within our parish, the Fullerton community, and in the public forum where countless men, women, and children are in need of common necessities and the dignity of work and workers is upheld. Through your generosity we are making significant progress in our outreach programs. In this election year hopefully we will participate in the Catholic Bishops' *Faithful Citizenship* program to further be a voice promoting the "Common Good."

Once again our Knights of Columbus will sponsor the blood drive this weekend. My special thanks to Brian Burley and the Knights for providing this service to help pass on the gift of life.

Your generosity last Sunday in the Building Fund second collection will be used to help pay down our debt of \$1,200,000. We should easily be under one million dollars by this time next year. This weekend our school second collection is enabling us to add to our scholarship fund for needy parents. Thank you to all who make the effort to share your treasure. It is not always easy.

Our Servite Secular Order will meet this Wednesday, July 25 at 7 pm in room 3. The OSSM is the lay branch of the Order and new applicants are welcomed at the meeting. If you have an interest and want to learn more come to the meeting or speak to Catherine at the office and we will put you in contact with the prior and prioress, Dave and Heather Lazaro.

Now that we are in the air-conditioning season, it is so important to keep the church doors closed while services are taking place. The ushers will make sure the doors are closed once Mass starts. At the end of Mass when everyone has left they will make sure the doors are closed. Each one needs to help because often the ushers are helping others or cleaning the church at the conclusion of Mass.

A quote from the Dalai Lama: "Compassion is what makes our lives meaningful. It is the source of all lasting happiness and joy. And it is the foundation of a good heart, the heart of one who acts out of a desire to help others. Through kindness, through affection, through honesty, through truth and justice toward all others we ensure our own benefit."
