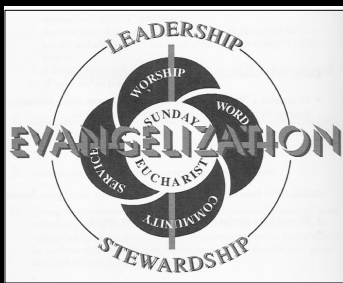

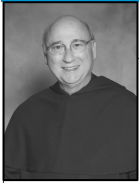

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Last weekend I wrote a rather lengthy piece on the *Catholic Worker Movement* begun by Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin during the Great Depression years. Dorothy and Peter started the *Movement* in response to the communist threat in the 20's and 30's with thousands of workers unemployed and with men, women, and children homeless and destitute. Besides publishing the social teachings of the church penned by Pope Leo XIII in 1891 and forty years later by Pope Pius IX in 1931, in *The Catholic Worker* newspaper, Peter and Dorothy established *Houses of Hospitality* run entirely by unpaid workers and volunteers to house and feed the nameless thousands living from day to day without basic necessities. These *Houses* continue to be staffed and independently managed by volunteers to this very day.

I began my column with the promise that a copy of *The Catholic Worker* newspaper would be included in the bulletin. Well, unfortunately the bulletin arrived late on Friday afternoon after the office staff left for home, and there was no one available to stuff the newspapers in the bulletin. You will find the newspaper in the bulletin this week. It is my hope that you will look through it and perhaps get a taste of the dedicated ministry of the volunteers who publish the newspaper and work in the Houses of Hospitality. *The Catholic Worker Movement* is thoroughly Catholic and has been supported by the National Conference of Catholic Bishops for over seventy-nine years.

In the future we will receive three hundred copies of the newspaper and they will be available at the entrances of the church in the bulletin shelves.

Once again I would like to encourage all of our parishioners to be aware of open doors in the church now that we have the air-conditioning on. Please make sure the door closes behind you when you enter or leave church. If you find a door open, please close it. The ushers will make sure the doors are closed before, during, and after Mass while the air-conditioning is on. I am sure you understand the reasoning behind this directive.

Dr. Lynn D. Johnson, Ph.D., has written a report entitled: *The Happiness Checklist: The Secret to a Resilient, Energetic and Effective Life*. In chapter seven: *Nurture Hope and Practice Optimism*, she writes: "A patient was working on becoming more optimistic. One day she came in and I asked her what she'd been doing. 'At the golf course,' she replied, 'practicing holes in one.' 'Wow,' I said, 'how many did you get?' 'Oh, none today.' Optimism tells us how well people bounce back from defeats and disappointments. The optimistic person may be hit by a bad event, but will come back and spends only a brief time feeling depressed. The more pessimistic person spends much more time in depression. A bad event sets the pessimistic person back so far that sometimes their productivity drops and they become ineffective. They withdraw from friends, stop doing enjoyable things.....(For resilient people) when a bad event does occur, it is viewed as not lasting long, not affecting much of my life, and as just something that happens, not caused by me. The person who is at risk for discouragement, depression and defeat will view a bad event in exactly the opposite way: The bad event is permanent, it is pervasive and it

is personally caused, that is, I am to blame, I am a bad person because I made it happen. Can people change? Yes, without a doubt. People can learn to think in resilient ways, and if they practice those ways of thinking, they get much better at it. Thinking habits are skills, and like all skills, anyone can get better."

What impressed me most about this *Happiness Checklist*, and I only touched on one small section of one chapter, is how much we can control our attitudes and reactions. We may not be able to change an event or situation but we can change on how we think and act toward it. It is usually not the event that causes us to be sad or angry.....it is our attitude toward the event. We can all help each other as a parish family and support one another. We can stretch our compassion and understanding of the many differences in personality, age, and background that characterizes St. Juliana parish.

If you are returning this Sunday from vacation or are planning to be away for a period of time, I hope you will remember to continue your parish support either by parish electronic pay or by envelope. We are all responsible to make up our offertory support when we are away or preparing to leave. Planning for a vacation or a family or business affair can be stressful. Besides the excitement and happy anticipation, there are so many details to be covered. For most of us thinking about parish support while away is probably not at the top of the list. Yet our bills continue to mount and our weekly tally of support is the backbone of our parish yearly budget.

The parish festival is two months away. The festival committee will meet this Tuesday in the parish office meeting room. We welcome all ideas on how to make the Festival more profitable, lessen expenses, create a stronger family atmosphere, and getting the word out. The raffle books will be ready in a few weeks and I know that you will do your best to involve friends and family members in purchasing a raffle ticket or two. It is all good fun and usually families and friends are happy to help out.

Last Friday our parish celebrated the funeral Mass of Bob Downey. Bob and Wilhelmina have been faithful parishioners of St. Juliana for many years. As a Knight of Columbus, Bob loyally served in a capacity of leadership. He always had a smile on his face and a humorous joke up his sleeve. Despite his aging body and a stroke that brought him to the edge of death, Bob continued his presence at Mass and at K of C meetings along with his ministry at the Armory sorting and distributing used clothing for the homeless. At the time I visited with him and anointed him with the Sacrament of the Sick, I could see that despite his weakness, his faith never wavered.

This is interesting. I read that Charles Chaplin Jr. liked to tell about the time his father attended a contest to see who could do the best Chaplin imitation. Dozens of contestants, all wearing the battered hat and baggy suit and carrying the trademark cane, got up and did their best to stimulate the famous walk and two or three of the movements that had made Chaplin known throughout the world. Without identifying himself, Chaplin got up on the stage and did the routine. He came in third.

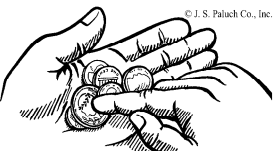

PARISH FAITH FORMATION



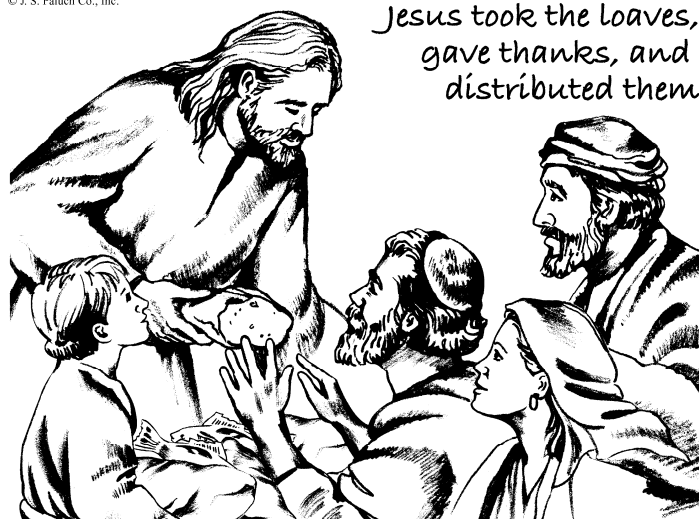

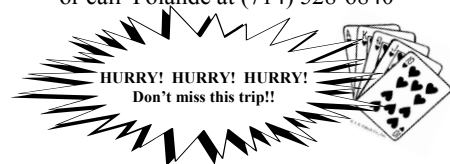
