

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

I hope the July 4th National holiday afforded you the opportunity to not only express your patriotism but also an occasion to have some quality family time. Barbecues, flag waving, and "bombs burst-

ing in air" signal that time of year when we can all be grateful for our freedoms and way of life in this wonderful United States of America.

Perhaps you had the chance to see the much talked about movie shot entirely in Mexico called: For Greater Glory. Thanks to a benevolent parishioner, tickets were provided free of charge. While the movie was incredibly violent since it was about war, the heroism and the depth of faith by the Mexican people at a time when the practice of their Catholic Faith was severely curtailed, overrides the visual gore. Over 90,000 Catholics, clergy, sympathizers gave their lives rather than let an atheistic government deprive them of their religious liberty. This Uprising came to be known as the Cristero War. The Cristeros were ordinary men, women, and children who banded together to fight for their Catholic Faith. There clarion call was, "Vivo Christo Rey," "Live Christ the King!" The Knights of Columbus as well as a diplomatic intervention by the American government helped bring the War to an end in 1929. To this day there are still provisions in the Mexican Constitution which curtail public expression of religion whether Catholic or not.

It is a sober thought that while we have considerable Religious freedom and can openly practice our faith with impunity, many fail to give faithful religious practice the attention it deserves. We know from studies conducted by the *Pew Forum* that only 25% of Catholics attend Sunday Mass and the second largest group of Christians behind Catholics and ahead of Southern Baptists are former Catholics. For many the issue isn't some overriding problem with the Church or some theological tenet. Rather, it is more about time management, material prosperity, and loss of a personal spiritual center with some mixture of laziness.

Without a deep spiritual longing for God and his governance in our lives, we human beings can easily forgo religious practice which may lead to indifference...take it or leave it you might say!

Father Anthony de Mello, S.J. tells a story that illustrates the irrelevance of religion to one who foregoes the practice of religion as a result of spiritual emptiness. He writes: The play was in progress at the village theater when the curtain was suddenly lowered and the manager stepped before the audience. "Ladies and gentlemen," he said, "it distresses me deeply to have to announce that the leading actor, our great and beloved mayor himself, has just had a fatal heart attack in his dressing room. We are, therefore, forced to stop the play." On hearing this announcement, a huge middle-aged woman in the front row stood up and shouted agitatedly, "Quick! Give him chicken broth!" "Madam," said the manager, "the heart attack was fatal. The man is dead!" "So give it to him at once!" The manager was desperate. "Madam," he pleaded, "what good will chicken broth do for a dead man?" "What harm will it do?" she shouted. In other words, chicken soup does for the dead what religion does for the spiritually unconscious. Religion, like the chicken broth given to a dead person, is ineffectual.

Summer time isn't the best time of year to point out the obvious fact that we all have family members and friends whose practice of their Catholic faith, especially with regard to Sunday Mass, is inconsistent and sometimes not at all. Often times Mass attendance begins to wane as soon as school gets out and summer recess heads into high gear.

How do we welcome those who are lukewarm or struggle in matters of faith and practice? Certainly not by criticizing or embarrassing them. Prayer, good example, gentle cajoling, and a joyful spirit that says: "Look at me!" "I'm loving it!" will prepare the way to a more fruitful and abundant spiritual life for our brothers and sisters on the fringe of parish life.

Two weeks ago I had the opportunity to visit *Christ Cathedral* of the Diocese of Orange in Garden Grove. There is no doubt that the Cathedral space will be an architectural challenge to create a sanctuary fitting for Catholic worship. Certainly it will be beautiful and functional when finished. The entire campus will be a great asset not only to the Diocese but also to those who will rent space for various programs. In the near future, the Diocese will offer parish tours of *Christ Cathedral* and we will rent a bus to transport those who wish to visit.

Over the past few months I have been meeting with staff members to investigate the possibility of expanding our parish bulletin from eight pages to twelve. J.S. Paluch publications controls about 90% of the church bulletin market and is hesitant to expand our bulletin without a substantial increase in advertisers. Our local sales representative from J.S.Paluch, Bernie Mendoza, will be at the parish after all Masses next weekend to pass out information regarding the communication benefits they are providing to the parish. The Italian Catholic Federation (ICF) has a local branch 397 here at St. Juliana. The ICF has branches in almost every major city in the United States and is open to all nationalities but at the same time possesses a strong link with its Italian heritage. A representative from the ICF will give a very brief presentation at the end of Mass and refreshments will be served in the Parish Center following the 9am Mass.

A cheerful thought from Ernest Holmes in his book, *That Thing Called You*: "Expectancy speeds progress. Therefore, live in a continual state of expectancy. No matter how much good you are experiencing today, expect greater good tomorrow. Expect to meet new friends. Expect to meet new and wonderful experiences."
