~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

The missionary cooperative plan of the Diocese of Orange is a yearly opportunity to not only help the missionary effort of the Church at large and in a specific way the various missionary Orders and

Institutes, but also apart from financial support it is an opportunity to experience the vastness of the Church and its work of evangelization. Father Richard T. Reese from the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales brings with him a wealth of experience as a missionary in Africa.

Known officially as the DeSales Oblates the members of the congregation are of two ranks, clerics and lay brothers. They engage in a wide variety of areas of service: education, parish ministry and foreign missions. They also work as teachers at religious and secular colleges and missionary areas as well as serving in military, campus, hospital, and convent chaplaincies and in inner city social work. Founded in 1872 by Father Louis Brisson, the Constitutions of the Order were officially approved on December 8, 1897.

I know that Father Reese will receive a warm welcome and as always your support of the missions will be generous.

I read a story recently where in the Archdiocese of St. Louis there was a man named Tony who was the head chef at a large hospital in the city. It bothered him to see so much food that had never been touched being thrown away daily. So he decided to gather the surplus food and take it down along the Mississippi River and distribute it to those living in caves and sewer openings along the river. Over the years this single act of kindness grew as more people got involved in the work. Later, Tony was ordained a deacon and continued his ministry to the homeless. By the time of his death, his ministry was feeding hundreds every night and involved people from all over the St. Louis metropolitan area, with many hospitals and restaurants contributing their surplus food each night. All of this happened without one word of publicity, without one appeal for funds or help. It happened because one person, interested in helping human beings in need, saw how to go about it. Others saw the need and joined in.

This kind of story is a "universal" story. Every Religious Order, Institute, and Congregation began with a vision to help others in their need whether that need be hunger, education, religious formation, or evangelization. We can never underestimate the "power of one." While we are a lay community of faith here at St. Juliana and rely on our fellowship of over 1,600 hundred families, it is often the "one" person who takes the lead and makes a difference; the "one" person who stands out and says: Here I am, I'll do it; the "one" person who without any thought of recognition, reward, or position makes a difference in the life of the parish and in our outreach to the poor.

Last year a group of fun-loving, hard-working, children-loving and parish-loving young professional men decided that a "Brew Fest" fundraiser to raise funds for needy school families and other educational related needs would attract a group of young donors. The "Brew Fest" was an overwhelming success with 6 local breweries and 8 restaurants participating. Good food, good beer, dancing with live music, and an overall feeling of joy and enthusiasm netted over \$8,000 in scholarships for St. Juliana students. This year's goal is \$12,000.

"Brew Fest" is the creation of C.L.I.F. (Catholic Lithuanian Irish Federation) spearheaded by Steve Farrell and company. This year's Fest will take place on Saturday, August 25, 2012 in the Parish Center starting at 6 pm. The flyer in the bulletin has all the information. 100% of all proceeds go to St. Juliana School to fund scholarships and special projects.

Remember the piece about happiness a few weeks ago? Research on happiness and how to develop and maintain it in our daily lives can be influenced by circumstances. This is one of the reasons why people who suddenly inherit or win a lot of money don't stay happy. They may be happier for a few months but in less than a year, many are back to their habitual levels of happiness. What can we control? What will lastingly give us more happiness? A large chunk of happiness comes from how we look at the world, how we think about the world, and that is quite changeable. We now know that even the brain itself is constantly shaped and changed by the mind. If you learn to play a musical instrument, certain parts of your brain literally grow, because your will, your spirit directed the brain to grow. The more you practice happiness, the better you would be.

In the days ahead you will see in the bulletin and perhaps a comment or two from me about the opening of school, the Fall Festival Raffle, our participation in the Capital Campaign for "Christ Cathedral" of the Diocese of Orange, and many other topics. With open minds and hearts we will work together to accomplish our goals.

Next weekend we will celebrate the Feast of St. Philip Benizi, O.S.M. with the blessing of water and bread after the 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00am Masses. St. Philip was born in Florence in the early thirteenth century. He entered the Order and was ordained a priest. In 1267 he was elected prior general and remained in office almost until his death. He served with wisdom, developed excellent laws, and fought to keep the Order from being suppressed by the Holy See. Recognized for his holiness, he inspired many to enter religious life and follow



his example of Gospel values and service to Mary. Because of his strong influence, he has been considered a "father of the Order." He died in 1285 at Todi and was canonized by Pope Clement X in 1671.
