~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

The Gospel readings during the month of August are taken from St. John's Gospel. The theme of these Gospel narratives is the "Bread of Life." The Holy Eucharist as real food, the benevolence of God toward those

who are hungry, the dignity of poor ones, the challenge of living the corporal and spiritual works of mercy are all subtexts to the major theme of "Bread of Life." Jesus is the "true bread come down from heaven." In the days ahead we will hear Jesus say: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

Last Sunday both Deacon Gerhard and Deacon Chuck explained in very graphic ways how the theme of "Bread of Life" impacts our daily lives as Christians. We are called or rather mandated to be people who are instruments of God's generosity in feeding, clothing, sheltering, and defending the poor. While most of us relegate our responsibility to government, private, and religious institutions to take care of the needy in society, we still bear the burden of personal involvement while making sure those in need have some form of care.

St. Juliana parishioners have been instruments of God's bountiful care in so many ways. Some bring food to the food pantry. Others give a financial gift in the monthly St. Vincent de Paul envelope. Still others help in the soup kitchen, donate to FIES, pack boxes of food and toys at Christmas, volunteer on Thursday mornings in the St. Juliana pantry, bring clothes to the Armory, and make sure that needy families have Easter dinner on their tables. All this is done without fanfare or thought of reward. Our little boat is so small and the sea so vast, nevertheless to those we help it means a great deal. As long as a Christian community exists here, there will always be those who reach out and help. Thank you volunteers, St. Vincent de Paul, donors, Respect life committee, Knights of Columbus, ICF, Bereavement and Spiritual Partners In Care for supplying such largess for those in need.

An article that appeared in a local newspaper recently highlighted the life of "Connie" who will celebrate her 104th birthday in late August. When asked how she felt she replied, "I feel great." "I eat much and sleep more. I eat four times a day. I get up at 7:30 every morning and go to bed by 7. I don't worry. I turn it over to God." She does not wear eyeglasses. Her blood pressure is a stable 120/60. She has no diabetes, joint pain or memory loss. Her secret to longevity: "Live a good, God-fearing life observing the 10 Commandments. Love everybody with all your heart. Be kind and generous to others. Spend more time listening to God. Avoid TV, cell phones and time-wasting stuff. Volunteer your time for the needy. Spend hours talking and listening to God."

Connie wrote a poem for the Longevity Light Verse Contest. I quote a portion of the poem here. "Thank you for the gift of another lovely day; to enjoy a garden full of your creative display; an array of fragrant flowers of yellow, pink, and red; Robbins singing their morning song; I'm truly blessed......Now at peace and full of joy as I see my journey's end; cause my Savior's waiting for me just around the bend; My life is full of love with so much happiness untold; I just listened and obeyed when He said join my fold; humbly take up your cross and bring your suffering to me; for where you're going my child, there will I always be."

Looking ahead, Father Richard T. Reese, O.S.F.S., of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales will be with us for the annual mission appeal for the work of their community the weekend of August 18-19. There will be more information in a future bulletin.

We have all read recently about the drought across the Midwest United States. From Kansas to Iowa to Missouri to Southern Illinois miles and miles of corn and soybean crops are struggling to produce a harvest. In some cases over 40% of the crops are spoiled from heat and lack of water. Here in Orange County and in particular St. Juliana Rectory garden, the harvest is plentiful. Since the beginning of July I have picked, I am sure, about three small bushels of tomatoes intermingled with green bell peppers. It will be good for us to thank God for our weather and his bounty. May the fields bring great comfort and joy to all harvesters.

My special thanks to Jon Gilwee and the Knights of Columbus for the successful blood drive along with all those who donated blood and passed on the gift of life.

Group tours for parishes in the Diocese of Orange are being offered by the new Christ Cathedral (formerly the Crystal Cathedral) on Tuesday and Saturday mornings when booked a week in advance. I feel that it is worthwhile for us to hire one or two buses to tour the Cathedral and to hear of the plans to convert the space and surrounding property for Catholic worship and tradition. Of course our parish will participate in the Capital campaign which will be unveiled soon. I need help to organize this. I ask one of our parish organizations to take this on as a project.

Remembering names can be a challenge as we age. Some folks can remember dates, places, events, names, etc., with uncanny recall and accuracy. That is a real plus when your vocation is lived around people and their families. To remember a person's name and to use it in his or her company has a special impact on what could develop into a life-giving relationship.

Occasionally, I will remember to use a person's name when in a service situation like at a check-out counter or at a department store. One time when I said to a check- out clerk, "Thank you, Cheryl," she looked at me as if to say, "Do I know you?" Then we both smiled when she realized that she was wearing a name tag with, "Hello, I'm Cheryl."

The more we can address each other by name the more we are apt to develop potential friendships and the possibility for more conversation. As pastor, I really want to remember the names of parishioners. My name is easy to remember. It's "Father." Everyone can remember "Father." Actually, it's Frank! So whenever you can, please help me to remember your name. I know many by name and I refer to the parish directory often to match faces and names. But then comes the day of reckoning and my mind goes blank. If you notice a disconcerting look on my face, it's time to bale me out and help me. I hope you will do that.

I remember many years ago hearing a talk about developing friendships. The speaker at one point illustrated a point by saying that we have three names: the name God gives us; the name our parents gave us; the name we make for ourselves. Interesting! How do we want to be named?




