~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

We celebrate the Servite Feast of St. Philip Benizi, O.S.M. this weekend with the annual blessing of bread and water in the plaza area outside of the Parish Center. Our newly formed Servite Secular Order

community of St. Juliana of the Holy Eucharist will host the blessing of bread and water and distribute these to all in attendance following the Sunday morning Masses. So if you are reading this on Saturday evening, feel free to come back and participate in the blessing ceremony.

At the time St. Philip was born, the Order of Friar Servants of Mary was still in its infancy as a mendicant order. The Fourth Lateran Council in 1215 had decreed that no new religious orders would be admitted. Canon 13 stated in blunt terms that any individual or group who wanted to embrace religious life had to choose one of the existing forms approved by the Church. The Franciscans and Dominicans were already approved. Nevertheless, new religious movements did spring up after the Fourth Lateran Council. New religious orders did receive ecclesiastical approval from the local Church authorities and explicit protection from the Roman Curia.

The Second Council of Lyons in 1274 decided to dust off the 13th canon of the Fourth Lateran Council. It stated that the Lateran Council's ruling had been so far disregarded that there was now an unbridled multiplication of new religious institutes. And so it decreed, with even more severity, that the founding of new mendicant orders was now forbidden. Those established since 1215 were forbidden to receive new entrants, and were therefore condemned to eventual natural extinction.

Some historians of the period included the Servants of Mary among the suppressed orders. The Servites, indeed, now entered into one of the most critical periods of their early history, and managed to save themselves from extinction, humanly speaking, through the energy, courage and ability of their prior general, ST. PHILIP BENIZI, O.S.M.

Saint Philip was born in Florence in 1233, the date of the founding of the order by the Seven Holy Founders. On Easter Thursday 1254, Philip received his mysterious but clear call to religious life while at prayer in the Servite church at Cafaggio (present day Santissima Annunziata Church). He entered the Order on April 18th of the same year. Philip's learning became known to the Friars and with much rejoicing he was promoted to the clerical state and gradually advanced to sacred orders.

Philip was ordained a priest in 1258/1259. Nine years later, at only thirty-four years of age, he was elected prior general of the Order. Because of his status as general and with the help of leading church lawyers of the time along with friends in high places within the Church, Philip was able to secure the future of the Order. On February 11, 1304, the Dominican Pope Benedict XI sent a pontifical letter from his palace of the Lateran in Rome to the prior general (Philip) and all priors and friars of the Order of the Servants of Mary. With this, he gave approval to the Rule and Constitutions they professed, and thus to the Order of the Servants of Mary which had originated in Florence some seventy years previously.

For the Servants of Saint Mary a long period of waiting had come to an end, and a new era of development began for the young religious institute which had come to take its place among the existing religious orders: Franciscans, Dominicans, Augustinians, Carmelites and Servites.

At the time of the definitive approval of the Order by ecclesiastical authorities, the Servants of Mary numbered at least 250 friars living in twenty-seven priories in Italy and four in Germany.

During one of his frequent journeys to Rome, while staying at the poor and less known priory in Todi for a brief period of rest, St. Philip died at the age of fifty-two, on Wednesday, August 22, 1285.

In one of the ancient manuscripts preserved by the friars, a story is told that at a time when the people of Florence were waging a war against Arezzo and had destroyed all the vegetation of the countryside, a great famine arose there. For the friar Servants of Mary in Arezzo this occasioned such a shortage of food that they scarcely could keep alive. When blessed Philip heard of their necessity and hunger, he hastened to them as fast as he could, as the good shepherd who always goes to the aid of the desolate. One day, when the friars had passed beyond the hour of dinner, Philip tried to comfort them as best he could. Entering the church, he turned to the Blessed Virgin, begging and imploring her that, as a loving mother, she would not allow her servants to die of hunger. While he was thus praying, an unexpected knock was heard at the priory door. One of the friars rushed out at once and found no one there, but instead, two baskets of beautiful white bread. He brought them to the friars and they went to their meal. So, together with blessed Philip, they were all miraculously revived. And from then on, through the merits of Philip, they were never short of bread or other provisions.

May the bread and water blessed in honor of St. Philip this weekend be a source of abundance and peace of mind to all who receive them.

Thank you for your generosity and good will last weekend during our yearly Missionary Co-op collection for the Oblates of Saint Francis de Sales.

I hope you have taken your Fall Festival Raffle tickets from the table in church. By taking them home you will help save us postage. And that is a good thing.

Faith formation registration is taking place and our RCIA team is seeking those who wish to begin their faith journey into full communion with the Catholic Church. Call the office if you are interested.

Acacia school will open soon and so will St. Juliana School. Rosary High School is already in session and as many Fullerton residents know or will soon know, the corners of Victoria, Acacia and Melody become congested with traffic before 8am. If you come to the 8am morning Mass, you will need to leave extra early in order to be on-time for Mass. It is very important that we protect the integrity of the Mass and participate from the Entrance Rite until the dismissal. When traffic is bottlenecked in the morning, it is almost impossible to be on-time if you leave home at the same time as you do now. Please plan accordingly.

It's not too late to register!

Adults enter the Catholic Church through a process formally known as the <u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>.
