#### ~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

What a party! Everyone was there! It was fun, entertaining, delicious, and thirst quenching. Young and old came. Party folks and those who just like to sit around and watch came. Decorations were manly and not overdone. The music had just the right

sound and tempo. Red-jacket hosts and lovely hostesses greeted party goers. Freebee glasses and a variety of beer to fill them were given to eager hands glad to have them. What a party, the 2012 C.L.I.F (Catholic Lithuanian Irish Federation) Brew Fest.

My special thanks to the C.L.I.F. executive committee under the leadership of Steve Farrell: Vitas Rugienius, Rick Price, John Hawkins, Joe LeVecke, Pete Gray, and Roy Hollister. The various brewery personnel, eatery chefs, volunteers, hosts, hostesses, parishioners, and friends filled the Parish Center to capacity; a crowd befitting such an honorable fundraiser for St. Juliana school children, especially those most in need of financial assistance. Do we not have such a wonderful spirit here at St. Juliana? Yes we do!

Four weeks and we celebrate the parish annual Fall Festival. Soon you will see signs advertising the coming festivities: games, food, drink, carnival rides, major prize raffle, and entertainment. The festival is not only a local parish family merry-making but also an outreach to the larger Fullerton community to share with neighbors the fun and excitement of a carnival. While summer is rapidly coming to an end with the opening of school this week, there is always room for a little more fun. Clear your calendar now. No excuse will be accepted. "We'll be out-of-town to squeeze in a few more days of vacation," you say. No, you need to be here. You will be missed.

If you do not pick-up your raffle book in the back of church by Monday, then we will have to mail the book to you. Postage is expensive and by picking up your raffle book you will help save some money. Don't forget that there will be early bird drawings so you can win some extra cash.

Father Richard Reese from the Oblates of Saint Francis de Sales appreciated the hospitality he received during his recent visit to St. Juliana and the subsequent mission collection which netted \$8,754 for the missions. That is an incredible generosity. Some parishioners gave sizeable checks which indicate their on-going commitment to the missionary work of the Church: bringing Christ to others!

Last weekend the Masses were unusually long. I am grateful to those who came to Mass on time and stayed until the final blessing and dismissal. Speaking for myself, I really want to celebrate Mass with you in ways that communicate the wonder, majesty, and profound significance of every prayer, gesture, word and song. The sacred liturgy is the foundation of our Catholic Faith. I also realize that in our modern society, one of our most important postures, patience, is losing out to restlessness. We find it hard to sit still. I noticed on vacation when I attended Mass in a very large parish that people were fidgeting almost constantly despite a rather good homily and uplifting music. By the time I returned to my pew after communion many of the folks in front of me, mostly fidgets, had left.

Another time while on the road I stopped to attend Sunday Mass again at a large parish with an impressive array of worshippers. Many young families with children were present. I thought to myself, these young moms and dads will certainly fidget. But that was not the case. It was the older crowd who on returning to the back of church with Holy Communion still in their mouths, continue to walk right out the door of church. Not just a few, but

many left. I was so curious about this breach of etiquette that I asked an usher as I was leaving after the dismissal, "Why the mass exodus?" His reply: "The five o'clock special at Howard Johnson's."

These experiences remind me of a story about a "left-out speaker." At dinner banquets there are often a number of speakers to offer words of wisdom. At one such event there were several speakers and each speech seemed to be longer than the previous. As each speaker finished, more and more people took the opportunity to leave the banquet. Finally there was only one person left listening to the speech. Reminiscing about the event some time later, he recalled, "And I listened. And I listened. I felt like going up and helping him turn the pages because he wasn't turning them very fast. Finally, he finished his speech. The speaker then pointed to me and said: 'I'm glad that you appreciate my beautiful thoughts. I'm so happy you stayed 'till the end.' And I looked at him and replied, 'But I'm the next speaker.'"

Welcome back to our teachers and school parents as we celebrate "Back to School Night" this Friday, September 7th at 6pm in the Parish Center. I look forward to greeting the school families and once again to stress the importance of a unified parish/school community. We are called to support one another and to take an active interest in the life of the parish and the activities of the children and teachers.

This holds true also for our Faith Formation (SRE) program which begins the new year with Mass at 6pm in church this Wednesday, September 5th. Faith Nights begin on schedule the following Wednesday at 6pm. I look forward to meeting the children and our new catechists. Our High School ministry and Junior High ministry begin soon. The bulletin has more information.

The program consists of receiving the traveling statue of Our Blessed Mother and to bring it home to pray the family rosary for Vocations, Family Holiness and growth in Charity, Love and Peace. Now Nina has joined together with a number of parishioners to participate in a pilot program for our parish, "33 Days to Morning Glory." This is a faith based do-it-yourself retreat for small groups in preparation for Marian Consecration. There is a simple book as guide with devotions inside and a CD to lead the meetings over a five week period. A workbook for private reflection is included. Once the core group has made the retreat, which begins this Monday, September 3rd and continues once a week until the Feast of the Holy Rosary on October 7th, it will be open to the parish at large. This October, Kateri Tekakwitha will be canonized as the first Native American woman saint.
