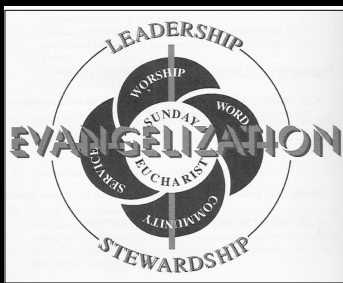

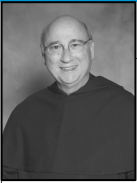

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Last week a momentous event took place that may have gone unnoticed by many Americans. In this election year of political preoccupation, I suspect many stories of interest get overlooked. The event was the landing on Mars of the space exploration vehicle, *Curiosity*. The moment the one ton vehicle landed smoothly on the exact spot, photos were taken in the NASA control room of grown men jumping up and down, hugging each other with elation. Rightfully so! This was an enormous communal feat. It promises to open up new understanding of Mars, whether life existed there, and what implications this may have for our life here on earth. This accomplishment could not have happened without the cooperation and shared abilities of hundreds of scientists and engineers working in harmony and with a common passion.

Once while I was attending a movie theater, I decided to remain after the movie ended to watch as the credits rolled by. I was amazed at how many men and women it took to make two or three "stars" look successful and to execute a myriad of background elements to support a storyline. As my eyes began to blur, I stopped counting at 600. Artists, projection experts, location managers, electricians, coaches, stunt performers, and even caterers to mention only a few needed to work together to produce the end product: a star quality movie!

During the recent *Summer Olympics* in London, teams competed side by side with lone athletes. Team athletes had to work together. Their goal was to win not as individuals but as a team. It was a team effort and without the team, the goal could not be accomplished.

These examples of team effort are helpful reminders of how liveliness and energy are necessary elements to accomplish goals whether they are in science, cinema, or athletic competition. Catholic parish communities are microcosms of spiritual enterprise. We are called to work together as a team to support one another and give witness to the Gospel. Unfortunately, many view parish life from a distance, spectators more than participants. This is certainly true of the occasional Catholic.

Here at St. Juliana we intend to work well together. We have experienced many times the joy and exuberance that comes with accomplishing goals and being successful. Our ministries are lively and enthusiastically supported. While we can always be and do better, our day to day witness is life-giving to many both within and outside of the parish. Leadership is the key element in monitoring and implementing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy which provide for the common good. When we pray well, and sing well, and care for each other well, and educate well, and love well, life is brighter, happier and healthier.

Just as team work is important to accomplish team goals, when the occasion arises when we need more ushers, singers, altar servers, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, etc., members arise to the occasion and declare: "Here we are, teach us, show us, and support us. We'll do it!"

There is a story I read some time ago entitled: *The Bishop's Gift*.

A church had fallen upon hard times and only five members were left, including the pastor. In the mountains near the church there lived a retired bishop. It occurred to the pastor to ask the bishop if he could offer some advice that might help save the church. The pastor and the bishop spoke at length, but when asked for advice, the bishop simply responded, "I have no advice to give. The only thing I can tell you is that one of the remaining members of the church is the Messiah." Returning to the church, the pastor told the church members what the bishop had said. The five church members pondered the words of the retired bishop. As they did, they all began to treat each other with extraordinary respect on the off chance that one among them might be the Messiah. As time went on, people visiting the church noticed the aura of respect and gentle kindness that surrounded the five members of the small church, and more and more people began to come back to the church. Within a few years, the small church once again became a thriving community, thanks to the bishop's gift.

We don't have to think of those we live and work with as the Messiah, but we do have to recognize the presence of Jesus in each person. This realization will help us grow in trust and faithfulness to the common good of the parish.

When we instituted two new monthly collections for our school scholarship fund and our million dollar debt reduction, the finance committee knew that this could be seen as a hardship for parishioners. While the income from these collections has been small, what will ultimately count is the spirit of sacrifice. Believing in our children and desiring a debt free budget are sentiments we can all support. Thank you for your gifts from the heart.

The "Baby Bottles" distributed this weekend hopefully will be returned filled with whatever loose change you have at the end of the day. When you return the bottles the weekend of August 28th and 29th, I am confident that your sacrifice will enable many young women to get the aid they need to carry their babies to term and beyond. My special thanks to you and Barbara Legas, Claire McKellogg and the Respect Life Committee for your dedication to this outreach ministry.

We look forward to a visit from Fr. Reese next weekend from the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales for the annual Missionary Co-op collection. Fr. Reese will talk at all the Masses.

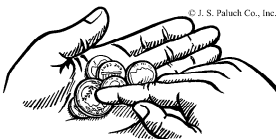

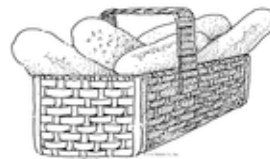

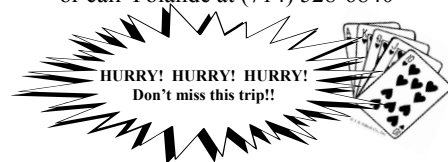
