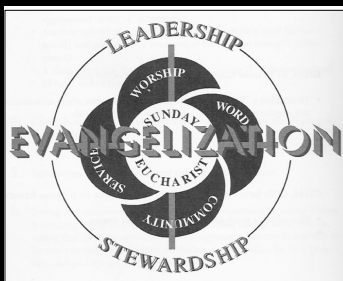

~ FROM THE PASTOR ~

Fall festivals, Oktoberfest's, pumpkin picking, cider making, apple bobbing, bomb firing, trick-or-treating, costume partying, and friend making are all part of the transition from a lazy summer to a promising Fall with Thanksgiving on the horizon and Christmas not far behind.

St. Juliana enters into this time of transition with the Annual Parish Fall Festival which opens next weekend with a promise of fun, good eating, entertainment and a chance to win \$4,000. The larger Fullerton community is slowly accepting our invitation to join in the merriment. It will be up to St. Juliana parishioners to get the word out at this late date so that both parishioners and neighbors will have time to plan their participation. We hope to have a good attendance every day that will result not only in wholesome family but community building as well.

Money making is also a large part of a successful festival. No doubt about it. The Fall Festival is a major fundraiser for the parish especially with regard to our on-going parish debt which is slowly being reduced to \$1,108,000 at the present time. Along with a favorable PSA and other designated gifts, by this time next year our debt will be significantly reduced. I especially appeal to new parishioners to pray over and decide as a family or as individuals if you could be more generous in your weekly offering or PSA commitment. Older parishioners who have been the mainstay of our financial security are beginning to get donor fatigue. This is happening throughout the church at large.

Our Servite Secular Order will meet this coming Wednesday in room three of the Parish Center at 7pm. A dream would come true for me if we could build up this small but faithful community of Servites in order to insure the presence of the Servite Order in the event that the Friars are no longer able to staff the parish. There are a number of places within the Order where the Friars have left because of diminishing personnel but the Servite presence and charism continue through the efforts of Lay Servites. Carmelite and Franciscan Secular Orders are well known to some of our parishioners but few know of the Servite Secular Order (OSSM). Even if you have a tiny spark of interest come to the meeting and learn more about the Secular Order.

In Chapter One of the Secular Order Rule of Life we read: *The Secular Order of the Servants of Mary consists of lay men and women who, united by their Christian baptism and directed by the Holy Spirit in the path to holiness, wish to align and unite themselves in the Service of Christ and their sisters and brothers in the world by drawing on the inspiration of Mary, the Mother and Servant of our Saviour Jesus Christ. In the Order of Servants of Mary, they commit themselves as lay or secular persons, to follow in their family and social life the path of the Seven Holy Founders of the Servants of Mary. The Secular Order, made up of men and women living out their baptismal consecration in the world, is one of these expressions of the shared vocation of the Servite Order. It shares in the same ideal, commitment to evangelical, apostolic life and piety towards the mother of God; with the Servite Order it constitutes a single family.*

In a few weeks we will begin *The Year Of Faith* observance proclaimed by Pope Benedict XVI. In this special year October 11, 2012 to November 24, 2013, believers from around the world are called to renew their commitment to the faith that is "always the same, yet the source of ever new light." The start of the year coincides with the anniversary of two great events that have marked the life of the Church: the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council and the 20th anniversary of the publication of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.

In a pamphlet published by *Our Sunday Visitor* we read: "From the beginning of his pontificate, Pope Benedict XVI has worked to gather God's people into a fuller communion with one another and with the risen Lord. This *Year of Faith* is a time for us to renew

our personal relationship with Jesus and recommit ourselves to the Church. We are called to give ourselves more fully to God by professing our faith in Jesus Christ, his only Son, and this faith is expressed when we profess the Creed."

I am sure while you were reading those words it crossed your mind that you are already in a "fuller communion with one another and with the risen Lord." For that I am truly grateful and as pastor I am greatly blessed. However, there may be some who are reading this now who are thinking, "I am not sure of my relationship with Jesus or the Church." If that is so, then when we begin this special *Year of Faith* your active participation and willingness to grow in your faith can have faith-changing meaning in your life. Among some of our parish members participation in Sunday Mass, parish activities, and presence to the larger parish community is a hit or miss. It is common knowledge that about 25% of Catholics attend Church on a regular basis. Children are routinely deprived of the sacramental life of the Church because they have no way of getting to church. Sunday sports, family outings, sleep-ins, household chores, often take the place of family worship. The second largest group of Christians in statistical measurements is "fallen away Catholics." Of course not all are "fallen away." Many join "mega churches" which fulfill their need to have visual and musical stimulation. Good preaching and good music are spiritual magnets for many. It occurred to me that the 600 or so envelopes addressed to parishioners in the back of Church with raffle tickets for the Festival were never picked up over a six week period. We had to mail them despite repeated pleas. I can't say for sure that 600 families forgot to pick them up or were not physically present to do so.

This *Year of Faith* is a time to: 1) *Reflect on the gift of faith;* 2) *Deepen our knowledge and understanding of the teachings of the Church;* 3) *Read, reflect, and pray with the Scriptures;* 4) *Nourish and strengthen our faith through the Holy Eucharist;* 5) *Open "the door of faith" for others.*

I'll be asking all of our parish organizations to participate in this *Year of Faith*. We hope to have speakers on faith topics. A repeat of the *Catholicism* series with Father Robert Barron will be included. I will be asking our Faith Formation team to create practical ways we can participate as a parish through regular observances.

In a document called "Note with Pastoral Recommendations for the *Year of Faith*" we read: *The Year of Faith* is intended to contribute to a renewed conversion to the Lord Jesus and to the rediscovery of faith, so that the members of the Church will be credible and joy-filled witnesses to the risen Lord in the world of today---capable of leading those many people who are seeking it to the 'door of faith.'

You may know already that our St. Vincent de Paul pantry is almost empty of canned and packaged goods. Last week I hinted at it. St. Juliana parishioners have been more than generous in their support of SVP pantry. However, now is the time to join together and help keep this ministry alive for the good of those in need of assistance. Canned goods, peanut butter, cereal, and other non-perishable goods are needed. This could be a family project to shop together and teach our children the value of giving. The children may want to buy a food item with their allowance.

I hope you are planning to join the festivities next weekend for our annual Fall Festival. Help spread the word to the larger Fullerton community and environs. I am sure those who live outside of the immediate neighborhood would come to the festival if they knew about it. Yard signs, posters, announcements, flyers are all ways to remind folks that our St. Juliana parish family wants to extend a hearty invitation to come and enjoy a family feast! Please be proactive and invite friends & neighbors.
