~ FROM THE PASTOR ~



The parish *Fall Festival* is in full swing this weekend and I hope you plan on participating. Beside the rides, games, and good food and drink, there is always the opportunity to meet parishioners, foster new friendships, and renew old acquaintances. At festival time it is usual that some former parishioners who have long moved out of the Fullerton area

will return to see old friends. The most enjoyable aspect of the *Festival* for me is observing the young children and teens having fun. Our young ones are fearless, and even with stomachs filled with pizza, cotton candy, popcorn, and slurpees, they have the courage to ride the Zipper and other thrill rides designed to sicken even the bravest among us.

I was handed an envelope the other day from a benefactor who often worships with us here at St. Juliana and who from time to time shares her musical talents with the choir. She read in the bulletin that I want to purchase processional candlesticks for the altar servers to carry in procession during our weekend Masses. The candles I have in mind are beautifully crafted and can be carried easily by our acolytes. Enclosed in the envelope was a check for \$100 designated for the purchase of the candlesticks. If you would like to help, any donation would be welcomed. I know there are parishioners who are inspired to finance a particular need. In the last three years, benefactors have come forward to pay for the statue of St. Peregrine, the painting of the St. Juliana statue, the Holy Oils Ambry, new communion cups, the electric candles and stands, and of course our new church organ. These designated gifts, along with your support to the PSA and other fund raisers, have helped us become a truly wonderful *Stewardship Parish*.

Next weekend we will begin our yearly October Mass count. The ushers will be tallying all who attend Mass during the month of October. The purpose behind this yearly event is to measure trends in church attendance across the United States. In reviewing the St. Juliana count over the past three years the total attendance for three years is fairly stable. In 2009 the total attendance was 6,308 with an average of 1,577; in 2010 the total attendance was 5,871 with an average of 1,468; in 2011 the total attendance was 6,305 with an average of 1,468; in 2011 the total attendance was 6,305 with an average 1,576. Encouraging those who come to Mass infrequently will help us raise our October count as well as offering an opportunity to further their relationship with our Lord and his Body the Church.

October is also *Respect Life Month*. Through the efforts of Barbara Legas, Claire McKellogg, and our Respect Life team, St. Juliana has been a model parish in support of respect life issues. Abortion is one of many issues that come under the umbrella of "Pro-Life." War, elder care, death penalty, poverty and quality of life are added issues related to both the institutional (political) and moral/ethical (religious) dimensions of how we take care of each other and stand up for the rights of those most vulnerable in Society. We may even include issues related to Religious Liberty. In order to better educate ourselves and to keep before us the larger picture of how our Catholic Church views these matters, we have invited Keith Cotton, Birth Choice Health Clinic's clinic manager to talk at all the weekend Masses October 13 and 14.

You may have heard or read that Pope Benedict XVI has appointed a new bishop for the Diocese of Orange to succeed outgoing Bishop Tod D. Brown who officially retired last year at the age of 75. Bishop Brown has endeared himself to both the priests and laity of the Diocese by his gentle, caring, and responsible leadership for the past 14 years. The Diocese of Orange is the tenth largest Roman Catholic Diocese in the United States. It is comprised of 62 parishes and diocesan centers and has a population of 1.2 million Catholics.

The new Bishop is Bishop Kevin W. Vann, the current Bishop of Fort Worth, Texas. He will be installed as the fourth Bishop of Orange in December. A native of Springfield, Illinois, Bishop Vann is an accomplished pianist, an expert in canon law and a gifted organizer. When installed as Bishop in 2005, the Diocese of Fort Worth served 400,000 area Catholics. Under his leadership the Diocese has become a larger and more dynamic Catholic community serving 700,000 Catholics, more than 50 percent Hispanic. He is recognized for innovative parishbased and diocesan initiatives and a leading member of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Migration. Working within the Texas Catholic Conference, Bishop Vann has encouraged comprehensive immigration reform in the State of Texas and nationally. His outreach to all immigrant communities, including the growing Vietnamese and Asian populations now present in Texas, will be important assets when beginning his assignment in the multi-cultural Diocese of Orange. Bishop Vann is fluent in Spanish and Italian and is developing his Vietnamese language skills.

In response to Bishop Vann's appointment as his successor, Bishop Brown said: "The Diocese of Fort Worth has enjoyed a dynamic period of growth and the demands for comprehensive pastoral services there are not unlike those we have experienced here in the Diocese of Orange. Bishop Vann enjoys an enviable record of success and I am exceedingly pleased by his appointment as my episcopal successor."

One of Bishop Vann's on-going duties will be to continue oversight of the "Catholization" of the Crystal Cathedral to be renamed: *Christ Ca-thedral*. Bishop Brown has asked pastors to arrange for a date when parishioners could visit the Cathedral as a group. A tentative date for St. Juliana is January 19th at 1 pm. Details and a date confirmation will follow after the New Year.

Parishioners who attend the Saturday evening five o'clock Mass may have noticed that Fr. Mike Pontarelli, O.S.M. and Fr. Aaron Riomalos have been the celebrants for the past two months. Fr. Luke has had one or two Masses. I have not been the celebrant. That is not by choice. The reason for my absence has been the availability of Fr. Mike and Fr. Aaron. Because of other commitments they were available only on Saturday evenings. While I am grateful for their help, I hope to be back in the loop and take my turn to celebrate with you. Since most parishioners have their favorite Mass time, this is the only time I have the opportunity to see the Saturday night "regulars."

With the Presidential election in about six weeks every American will have the opportunity to exercise his or her right to vote in a free democratic society. That is a good thing and as Catholics we are called to *Faithful Citizenship*. Faithful citizenship refers to the responsibility we each have to form our consciences, and to use those informed consciences in making all of our decisions, including voting decisions. Church leadership has an obligation to help us to form our consciences and by doing so, helps us become faithful citizens.

The U.S. bishops identify the following as "fundamental problems" of our day---and as significant issues in the upcoming election: *Abortion* and "other threats" to those who are weak or vulnerable; *Threats to religious freedom*, namely "renewed efforts to force Catholic ministries---in health care, education, and social services----to violate their consciences or stop serving those in need;" *Efforts to redefine marriage* away from "the permanent, faithful, and fruitful union of one man and one wom-an;" *The current economic crises* and all that flows from it; *A "broken immigration system;" "Wars, terror, and violence,"* with a special emphasis on "the absence of justice, security, and peace" in the Middle East.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops created a website of resources for all Catholics: <u>www.FaithfulCitizenship.org</u>. There you will find the full text of the bishops' statement, prayers and other resources for parishes and individuals.

A parting thought from David Hawkins as published in, *Bits & Pieces*, a division of Lawrence Regan Communications Inc.: "*Make a gift of your life, and lift all mankind by being kind, considerate, forgiving, and compassionate at all times, in all places, and under all conditions, with everyone as well as yourself. This is the greatest gift anyone can give."*


