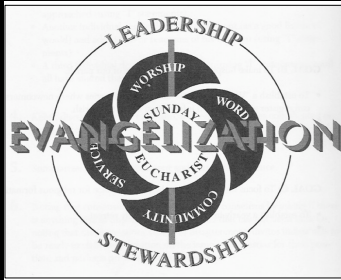

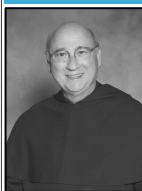

I am so grateful that I have been able to celebrate Mass during the Christmas Season which concludes this weekend with the Baptism of Our Lord. The decorations will be removed from the church and carted away to their storage containers. Thanks to our church environment committee under the supervision of Catherine Haydon and the many volunteers, the sanctuary was brilliant and a fitting tribute to our blessed Lord. Our choir under the direction of Todd Helm and accompanied by Claudia Kellogg along with our cantors, Theresa, Monet, Steve, Carol and Kimber excelled in enhancing the beauty, reverence, and majesty of the Christmas liturgies. Donna Farrington, Phi Tran, the Spirit Group, and the Youth Band helped to enliven the added Christmas celebrations.

The Christmas season ends with the Baptism of Our Lord because at this event Jesus appears as an adult, thirty years later. His "hidden" life is unknown to history but from this moment on his public life outlines the basic tenets of Christian living. The Wise men followed the "star." We follow Jesus who is the new "daystar" and the light of the world.

Every New Year brings with it a set of challenges that can at times seem overwhelming. Not every experience is new nor is every challenge daunting. Nevertheless, it is customary to think about ways to make the New Year of greater value by adopting resolutions. Thomas McSweeney in a little publication entitled, *Better to Light One Candle*, Continuum Pub. Co offers the following spin on New Year resolutions. He writes: "*Just for today: Be friendly and pleasant to all you meet, try to focus on the good in every situation, do all you do to the best of your ability, find something to praise in another rather than criticize, be grateful to be alive. Just for today: Don't complain about anything, don't compare yourself to anyone else, don't curse or use foul language, don't gossip. Just for today: Let another's opinion be more important than your own, try to include others in conversation, reach out to relieve another's loneliness or pain. Just for today: Take the time to visit Jesus in prayer; listen carefully to what he says to you and allow your conversation with him to revisit you throughout the rest of your day and night. Just for today: Start small, pray big, stay steady, trusting that the course of all of our tomorrows will be well directed and generously graced.*"

The annual Men's retreat at Mater dolorosa Retreat house in Sierra Madre is fast approaching. If a visiting priest is available to help with the weekend Masses on February 8, 9, & 10, I will plan on attending the retreat. The quiet and restful ambience of the retreat house and grounds along with the good preaching, comfortable accommodations, tasty food and prayerful devotions all contribute to a relaxing and thought provoking experience. For years St. Juliana has led the way in numbers among the six or seven other parishes in attendance. So I appeal to all the men in the parish to think about participating in this year's retreat. You will be surprised how sagging spirits get new energy; nagging problems seem more manageable; the closeness of the Lord more endearing; and feelings of a "fresh start" abound. I have good news to share with you about the appearance and structure of our weekly bulletin. This is such an exciting moment in our history and one that will help future

generations of parishioners to have at their disposal a weekly chronicle of parish life in the first half of the 21st Century.

Scott Kambak, the director of our Junior High Youth Ministry, has sent out his January-February 2013 Newsletter. Scott has many interesting activities planned for our Junior High. The January 20th ice skating party at Anaheim Ice sounds like fun. He recommends dressing warm. I had to chuckle. During my ice skating days we bundled up with heavy coats, buckled boots, woolen scarfs, leather gloves, and ear muffs as we set out to the nearest pond or playground ice rink provided by the local fire department who poured gallons of water in a round rink made of gravel and wooden beams. There were no warming booths or hot chocolate stands. I guess we had a good time skating. I was too young to notice my frozen nose, buckling ankles, and shivering torso....it was winter and we were having fun and we knew that soon we would be home, and after shedding our winter outfits, we could warm ourselves by the steam radiators in our homes and have hot chocolate.

The February Activity for our JHYM really caught my eye. On February 13th Scott has invited an historical interpreter who will present a one-man show entitled: "Stories of Cesar Chavez." One of the most inspirational civil rights leaders in history, Cesar Chavez fought to bring social justice to migrant farm workers through his philosophy of peace and hope. Parents! Please encourage your teen sons and daughters to attend.

Our vocation committee under the direction of John McElligott has met a number of times to find ways to help foster vocations to priesthood and religious life. I would like to thank all of St. Juliana parishioners for your generous support and prayers for the 2012 Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA). We received 436 pledges totaling \$193,318.00. When all the pledges are fulfilled our parish will receive a rebate from the diocese of \$84,318.00. At present we have begun our 2013 PSA pledge program. Many have given to our "Giving Thanks-Thanks a Million" Campaign to pay off the remaining balance of the loan with the diocese. That loan has been reduced significantly thanks to your consistent stewardship and the excellent oversight of our parish finance office. Soon the loan will be under one million dollars. Besides the PSA, you may also designate a donation directly to the loan campaign.

In the bulletin shelves in church you will find copies of the special December issue of the Catholic Worker. I am a little late getting them to you. I hope you will read some of the material contained in the paper.

Once again I want you to know how grateful I have been these past weeks since my surgery. Your cards, gifts, prayers and loving sentiments truly overwhelmed me. I neither expected to receive so much attention nor do I feel worthy. I fully realize that the pastor plays an important part in the stability and general well-being of the parish. During those first weeks when I was almost totally incapacitated, Fr. Luke, dear friend and brother Servite, along with our wonderful staff made sure that the parish was meeting all of our ministerial needs. Thanks also to our deacons for their extra work. My therapy is very slow and at times painful but be assured I am back to ministry full time.
