~ FROM THE PASTOR ~



There are so many interruptions in our lives that come upon us unexpectedly and often with little explanation. Medical detours that disable us for a period of time can seem overwhelming. No doubt most of us have had such episodes with varying degrees of discomfort. I used to think a trip to the dentist and the prospect of having a cavity and the

dreaded drill was a big thing. Or the times I had an earache or bruised knee; a pulled muscle or back ache; a queasy stomach or heartburn. All these interruptions seem so trivial now as I enter my seventh week of physical therapy to get my right shoulder muscles working again after my surgery. However, as discomforting as this medical odyssey has been for me I haven't forgotten how fortunate I am to have such good care, loving parishioners, my Servite brother Fr. Luke, and an anxious staff ready at any moment to lend a hand.

The human factor is certainly at work. It's hard to pray when you hurt. Concentration is difficult. For me the lack of sleep sapped much of my resistance to self-pity. It seems so dramatic from where I am now as compared to those first days six weeks ago.

I believe I did a pretty good job staying convinced that the healing hand of Our Lord and the intercession of our Servite Saints and Blesseds were and still are at my side. Even though saying prayers was difficult, I never completely lost my ability to pray. It makes no sense for a person of faith to neglect the one sure help in the healing process: trust in God.

Our Lord wants to help. We need to do our part. I think of a humorous tale told by Father Anthony De Mello, the Jesuit teacher, story teller, and spiritual writer. He writes: A devout religious man fell on hard times. So he took to praying in the following fashion: "Lord, remember all the years I served you as best I could, asking for nothing in return. Now that I am old and bankrupt I am going to ask you for a favor for the first time in my life and I am sure you will not say no. Allow me to win the lottery." Days passed. Then weeks and months. But nothing happened. Finally, almost driven to despair, he cried out one night, "Why don't you give me a break, God?" He suddenly heard the voice of God replying, "Give me a break yourself! Why don't you buy a lottery ticket?"

While we are on the topic of healing, I received word that Bishop Kevin Vann will celebrate the "World Day of the Sick Mass" in honor of Our Lady of Lourdes on Saturday, February 9, 2013 at 10:00am at St. Columban Church in Garden Grove. The Mass will include ceremonies for anointing of the sick, laying on of hands, blessing of caregivers hands and blessing with Lourdes water. This invitation is extended to the sick here at St. Juliana and caregivers. I hope to attend and concelebrate.

This Tuesday, January 22nd we will commemorate the 40th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision Roe v. Wade to legalize abortion. There is a small flyer in the bulletin. Our parish Masses for that day will be celebrated for an end to abortion and for the 55,808,387 and counting lost lives.

Our monthly financial report is in the bulletin this week. I am grateful to all who contributed to the Retired Religious collection, \$11,001 and the Christmas collection, \$42,950. Your Christmas gift surpassed last year's by \$1,887.00.

The celebration of Easter is early this year and of course that means that Ash Wednesday is also early on February 13th. We

received our Catholic Relief Services *Operation Rice Bowl* rice bowls and we will distribute them on Ash Wednesday for you to take with you. Every year Catholic Relief Services helps millions in need. Every year, the Catholic community in the United States assists more than 100 million of the world's poorest people through CRS, with innovative, long term solutions to poverty, hunger, drought and disease, and with emergency crises relief. 75% of our donation to CRS Rice Bowl supports Catholic Relief Services' programs around the world. 25% supports local hunger and poverty alleviation efforts in our Diocese of Orange. More information will be shared closer to the date.

My thanks to all who support our monthly second collections at Mass. You have been so generous, patient, and cooperative. Next Sunday our collection will go to help our parish school.

Our SRE program under the direction of our Faith Formation Director, Mike McHenry, has resumed classes after a long Christmas recess. This Wednesday, January 23rd, Mike has a "Parent Night" scheduled at 6pm in Parish Center rooms 1&2. Parents are urged to attend. Mike always has an informative program planned that is designed to help parents and their children as they grow together in their Catholic faith.

We extend a very "Happy Birthday" this Monday, January 21St to Manuel Gonzalez, our parish school principal. May he continue to be blessed with good health and dedication to his vocation as principal, husband, father and friend.

The pastoral council met last Wednesday to discuss the final draft of the Pastoral Plan which outlines our goals and strategies for 2013 based on our parish Mission statement and Vision for the future. The council has been working diligently on this project for almost two years. The plan will be professionally printed and distributed to all parishioners by February 15th.

The flu season has arrived in many parts of the United States. Media reports indicate that it is on its way to California which up to now has escaped some strains. So far we have not received any directives from the Diocese on sharing the "Exchange of Peace." So until then, we will continue to use appropriate gestures of peace to one another. If you feel a little achy or think you might be getting a cold, please alert your fellow worshipers and refrain from contact. That is just common sense. All of our Eucharistic ministers have been alerted to use the hand sanitizers in the sacristy. I believe we are acting sensibly. Frequent washing of hands is a prudent precaution during the flu season.

Recently, I read three missives found in the Pastoral Council suggestion box in the back of church. If the suggestions contained are reasonable, then I make sure we evaluate them and act appropriately. If the suggestion forms are not signed enabling us to contact the person making the suggestion, then they are not considered. Since these were not signed, sorry to say, they will not be considered. This directive is only fair since we want to be able to involve the person or persons in the suggestion being made. For example, one time a suggestion was to replace the carpet in church. Since the suggestion wasn't signed I had no way of asking the person how we would pay for it.

A parting thought from Hugh Gibson: "Most of us have a pretty clear idea of the world we want. What we lack is an understanding of how to go about getting it."


