

MARRIAGE ∼ Couples planning to be married should contact a Priest or a Deacon at least six months before scheduling a date for their wedding.




THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

The new bulletin layout debuts this weekend with extended copy, pictures, graphics and color. You will notice the various headings that reflect the ministries here at St. Juliana. These designations will showcase the ministries in a more appealing and easily readable style. This is made possible by our generous advertisers listed on the back pages of the bulletin. When you patron-

ize them, please mention that you saw their Ad in the parish bulletin.

The editing of the bulletin is a work in progress. Suzie Lazuka is responsible for publishing the weekly bulletin and is in the process of learning how to maximize the expanded space. The goal of the bulletin is also to be a source of information on school happenings in more detail than previously. Our Principal, Manuel Gonzales, will be writing a column highlighting some of his duties along with school endeavors. The parish community and the school community are one cooperative ministry. There must always be open communication and support for all that happens in the church and school. It is essential for parents to support parish sponsored programs and for parishioners to be present at school events open to the public.

As we begin Catholic Schools Week this weekend, you will notice in the bulletin a schedule of events planned by the school community. These events will be an occasion to show school spirit and to involve family and friends on *Family Day* on Tuesday, January 29th.

St. Juliana has partnered with The Congregational Church of Fullerton for the past three years in hosting the Get On The Bus program. Get On The Bus brings children and their guardians/ caregivers from throughout the state of California to visit their mothers and fathers in prison. An annual event, Get On The Bus offers free transportation for the children and their caregivers to the prison, provides travel bags for the children, a photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (breakfast, snacks on the bus, lunch at the prison, and dinner on the way home)----all at no cost to the children's family. On the bus trip home, following a four-hour visit, each child receives a teddy bear with a letter from their parent and post evening counseling. This year the event will take place in the Parish Center on Saturday, March 2, 2013 at 4pm. This weekend, and from time to time, tickets will be sold after the Masses. Our parish representative is Barbara Dietterle, assisted by parish volunteers. More information will be made available at a later date.

You may notice that the designations of the parish meeting rooms have been renamed. Beginning this week meeting rooms 1, 2, 3, and 4 now have designated names. Room I is *Seven Holy Founders*. Room 2 is *St. Philip*. Room 3 is *St. Juliana*. Room 4 is *St. Alexis*. When referring to these rooms parish calendars will use the name instead of the number. For example: "The meeting for parent formation night will take place in the Seven Holy Founders meeting room." It may take some time getting use to

these new designations but in the long run their use will be more in keeping with their function and the tradition of the Servites.

January 27, 2013

Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is February 13, 2013. The schedule of Services that day will be found in the bulletin closer to the date. While receiving blessed ashes made from burnt palms is a long standing tradition in the Church, there is always some misunderstanding concerning its meaning. To have ashes imposed on your forehead is a "yes" to the traditional discipline of Lent: Fasting, Almsgiving and Prayer. As you come forward to present your forehead you may respond, "amen" or even better, "yes." It is important to truly mean it.

Once again our parish and school community will participate in "Operation Rice Bowl" during Lent. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) will provide cardboard rice bowls for you to take home and fill with your loose change during Lent as a sacrifice and financial support to the many services provided by CRS.

I want to share with you my delight and gratitude to our altar servers for their faithfulness to the ministry of acolyte. Under the supervision of Bob Cardinali and Don Stelluto our altar servers are now better trained and more reliable. Parents play a key role in making sure their son and/or daughter know the date and time of their service. Children need reminders and encouragement. Perhaps parents will remind their children to wear their altar server pin and take pride in this important ministry.

A long standing tradition in the Church has been the blessing of throats on the Feast of St. Blaise. This year the feast day falls on Sunday, February 3rd. Since it would be very difficult to bless everyone's throat on that day, we will have a general blessing and then on Monday, February 4th after the 6:30 am and 8:00 am Masses individual blessings.

I may be jumping the gun a little early as they say for Valentine's Day which is February 14th, but I read this little tid bit written by Jan Janeski from Edison, New Jersey and published in Bits & Pieces, Lawrence Regan Communications, Inc. I thought I would share it with you. Jan Writes: "The other day I was listening to the radio and a question was asked: 'How can you show that you love someone without saying a word or giving a present?' As I pondered this I was reminded of something from years ago....When my daughter Amy was in kindergarten, she saved one of her cookies from snack time for her 2-year old brother Michael every day. He would wait at the door for her to return from school with cookie in hand. On Valentine's Day three years later, Michael was in kindergarten, and they were making hearts out of construction paper. His teacher told them to write on their heart what love means to them. That afternoon Michael came home with his big red heart, and he had written on it, 'Love is when your sister brings you home a cookie.' What better answer to the question? I still have that faded heart, and it still makes me tear up just thinking about it."



The joy of love, the answer to the drama of suffering and pain,



the power to forgive offenses, life's victory over death's emptiness: all this finds fulfillment in the mystery of Christ's incarnation, in Jesus becoming human and sharing our human weakness in order to transform it by the power of his resurrection.

This Year of Faith has opened wide the "door of faith." The liturgical "door" that opens every calendar year is the solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Her Son is the Prince of Peace, thus her feast fittingly coincides with the World Day of Prayer for Peace, whose theme

this year is "Blessed are the peacemakers." Peace, writes the pope, grows from deep within each human soul as God's gift. It flowers whenever we work to build peace in the world, as individuals and as members of the human family. As January unfolds, the Sunday Gospels proclaim Jesus' "manifestations" as Savior of the world: on Epiphany, to the Gentile nations, in the persons of the magi; on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, to the people of Israel listening to John the Baptist at the Jordan; at Cana's wedding feast, to the smaller circle of disciples, as Jesus changes water into wine; finally, in his hometown synagogue, as Jesus inaugurates his public ministry by proclaiming his mission of bringing glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind, freedom to the oppressed.

Dear St. Juliana Parish Community,


Happy New Year! I hope you enjoyed time spent with family and friends. May God bless each of you in the New Year. We look forward to a renewed sense of hope in 2013.
