A blessed New Year to you! It was so good for me to be able to participate in the Christmas Masses as I continue to recuperate from right shoulder surgery. The beauty of the Christmas Masses is wonderful to celebrate with an entire community of faithful parishioners, as we have here at St. Juliana Falconieri. When I had originally injured my shoulder, I was

deeply concerned that I would not be able to celebrate any Christmas Masses with you. What a joy it was for me to be able to be with you for at least the couple of Masses I celebrated. The joy of Christmas and the gift of the birth of Our Lord were present and alive in our midst at every celebration! God blessed me with the strength to celebrate Mass. How beautiful the celebrations were!

I am still on the mend. I am moving forward with my physical therapy three times a week. The pain is not as intense now and the swelling in my arm has gone down, but I am still very sore. I do wish I could sleep. To be sleep deprived is probably one of the hardest aspects of my recovery - there is just no position that I am able to find a deep, sound rest. Please continue to pray for my complete recovery as I slowly get back into my ministry and am able to celebrate Masses more often with you.

Excerpt from J.S. Paluch Building Blocks - Year C splendid magi, all sparkle and dash and solemnit

The splendid magi, all sparkle and dash and solemnity, march right up off the pages of Matthew's Gospel and into our churches today. Matthew alone tells us this grand and seductive story so that we might see the light and know that the child these magi visited is the fulfillment of prophecy, the king of the world that stretches to the magi's home country and beyond, right down the ages to us.

We too see and understand anew. Like the magi, our patron saints for this day, we see in the newborn child the king of the universe and light of the world. Like the magi, we find in ourselves a new faith and a new life. Like them, we return to our home by a new route.

We are asked to come away from this festive season ourselves renewed and awake to the presence of God among us. We are asked to find God where God is to be found, to be attentive and surprised and ready to bow down in adoration and to offer our gifts.

LIGHT OF THE WORLD

Excerpt from Sunday By Sunday - Year C Lectionary
We believe that Jesus is the Light of the World. To say this about Jesus is to say something about ourselves. Christ's light is meant to illuminate every corner of the earth and gather all people together. Today's scriptures reveal what that means.

In the Gospel story of the magi from the East we see Jesus, even as an infant, gathering people of differ-



ent religions and races to his light. The magi bring the child their finest gifts and tell others of the light that they have seen. The reading from Ephesians reminds us that all Christians are "members of the same body, and copartners" in divine life. There ought not to be divisions among us: all should gather together under the light of Christ. Finally, Isaiah paints a picture of what the people of God, the church, should look like. We are to reflect the Light of the World so that all nations can walk by Christ's light and rulers by his shining radiance. When we do, all people will be gathered to Christ, bearing their finest gifts and "proclaiming the praises of the LORD."


GOLD, FRANKINCENSE, AND MYRRH



The gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh portend the manner in which Jesus' light is to spread to the whole world. Myrrh, a perfume used for burial, foreshadows his death. Gold is a gift for royalty and frankincense signifies holiness. Together they indicate that, through his suffering and death, Jesus will become both the afflicted King, in whose service we are to

offer our gifts to the afflicted, and the eternal Priest, whose sacrifice we are to make known as the source of light uniting Christians and all humanity.

By our unity, our lives, and our witness, we are to reveal that Jesus Christ is indeed the Light of the World.
