

~ From the Pastor ~



Catholic School's week ended this past Friday with overwhelming success. Our school not only has a bright future but stands out in the midst of so much change and uncertainty in day to day life as a stabilizing influence in the parish as well as in family life. My thanks to the teachers, staff, aides, school parents and parishioners who participated in the programs planned for the week.

Our Junior High program has also been a stabilizing influence in our parish. Scott Kambak's long tenure as director and animator brings needed steadiness and security to our youngsters who are bombarded almost daily by social media often in conflict with Catholic values. Scott not only provides wholesome enjoyment but educational opportunities such as the one planned for February 13th in Seven Holy Founders meeting room in the Parish center. Unfortunately it falls on Ash Wednesday evening which may affect attendance. The program features a historical interpreter who will present a one-man show entitled "Stories of Cesar Chavez." Cesar Chavez fought to bring social justice to migrant farm workers through his philosophy of peace and hope.

I was delighted to hear that the bishop's office of the Diocese of Orange has announced the date of Confirmation, May 11, 2013, for our High School students. The presiding bishop has not been selected. It would be a delightful surprise if our new bishop, Kevin Vann, presides. Unfortunately, I am told, we cannot request a particular presider. Kerry and Maura Condon along with the HYSM team are preparing our Second Year Confirmation students.

The Liturgy of the Word program adapted for children is one more way we can inspire our children to both understand and have high regard for the Word of God. While the message of Holy Scripture is often complex, this program helps the little ones to grasp simple truths. At the moment Mike McHenry is recruiting catechists to volunteer at the 9 am and 11 am Masses. It would be a genuine sadness if this "Children's Church" ministry falters and is discontinued for lack of catechists or interest. I extend my special gratitude to Donna Reinbold who has devoted time and talent to this ministry along with all the volunteer catechists.

Even though Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent lies ahead of us, it is not too early to begin thinking about the meaning of Lent and how this seasonal celebration of forty days of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving impacts our personal and communal lives as a parish family. We will be asked to say amen to the "imposition of ashes" and to really make an attempt, health permitting, to fast. There is something healthy about fasting. The spiritual benefits outweigh the inconvenience since to feel empty gives God the opportunity to fill us with good gifts. Fasting can also include change in behaviors. What behaviors, habits, thoughts, etc. do we need to fast from? It may seem like Lent is a joyless season making us feel deprived or burdened. It does have an element of sacrifice. But we are called to live bal-

anced lives. Including prayer such as daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, rosary or any private devotion along with almsgiving such as Operation Rice Bowl can offer that balance. More to come.

The field trip to tour the Christ Cathedral campus recently was attended by sixty plus parishioners. Another trip is scheduled in March and I believe the benefit of these two trips will be to help us rally around the Capital Campaign planned later on to assist us in paying for the renovation of the Cathedral as a place of Catholic worship and administration for our Diocese and local church. I would be interested in hearing from you and what you experienced. Ken Boucher has my deepest gratitude for organizing these jaunts.

The second collection on the weekend of February 16 & 17, 2013 is for the Church in Latin America. While many young people in the United States and around the world are preparing to attend World Youth Day celebrations in Brazil this year, nearly 25,000 young people between the ages of 12 and 25 in Maraba, Brazil, are unemployed and facing poverty.

Through generous support from the Collection for the Church in Latin America, the parish of Nossa Senhora de Nazare is able to provide youth with the tools they need to grow in their relationship with Christ and professionally. The parish offers a series of evangelization efforts including retreats, catechesis, training in pastoral life, and vocation discernment.

A short story that appeared in the publication Bits and Pieces published by Lawrence Regan communications, Inc., caught my attention especially at this time in my life when I am trying to balance ministry, personal living, and physical therapy to repair my right shoulder. The story goes like this: A carpenter's apprentice was beside himself when he broke his left hand. The thought of missing out on so many weeks of work began to worry him. He approached the carpenter and begged to be put to work. "But what can you do?" the carpenter asked. "Your hand is broken." "Not my right hand," the apprentice said. "I do everything with my right hand, and I can still hold a hammer.' "But what about the nail? Who will hold that?" They went on for some time like this about things that needed to be cut, sawed, or drilled. The apprentice was constantly looking for tasks he could perform with one hand, and the carpenter tried to patiently point out that in their line of work two hands, sometimes four, were almost always necessary. "But there must be something I can do." "There is," said the carpenter. "Recognize that there aren't too many things that one hand can do without the other. We all need a little bit of help in just about everything we do."

A parting thought from Marlin Finch Lupus: "We seek the comfort of another. Someone to share the life we choose. Someone to help us through that never-ending attempt to understand ourselves, and, in the end, someone to comfort us along the way."


