



FROM THE PASTOR



My birthday this year was exceptionally happy for me. Your cards, generosity, and the thoughtfulness of the school children, school staff, and parish office personnel spoiled me for the day and I enjoyed every minute of it. The celebration was a reminder to me of how fortunate I am to have the support of so many parishioners at a time when health issues keep side-lining me. While I continue to perform

my duties as pastor, my energy level is greatly diminished. Father Luke, as you would expect, is more than patient and compassionate. He has stayed by me during my shoulder surgery and recuperation and now with my cardiac rehabilitation. Never complaining and offering to do more than his share of ministry. He is my Servite brother and confidant. I value his advice and support which he shares so graciously.

I received a letter recently from a friend of Hildegard Mills, the wonderful lady who donated the church organ in memory of her father who was an organist and was removed from his teaching position during the Nazi regime in Germany. He died of a "broken heart" and Hildegard wanted to celebrate his talent as a church organist and teacher. Hildegard had been sick for many months and moved from Morningside to Park Vista for nursing care. While she had many friends at Morningside, Al and Jean Esser kept us informed of Hildegard's health and were instrumental in arranging for a memorial service here at St. Juliana's. I was to be the celebrant but due to my own illness and an unplanned trip to Urgent Care, Deacon Gerhard stepped in and conducted a Liturgy of the Word funeral service. The letter I received came from a Morningside resident by the name of Ahanawake Sevier who knew Hildegard. I would like to share the letter with you. It reads: "Dear Father Frank, I am so sorry circumstances gave you so much anguish Tuesday. Now, Wednesday, I trust you are relieved on both counts. The doctors did their job and your body did its'. Deacon Gerhard Stadel conducted the services for Hildegard in an admirable manner and with great compassion. Not being Catholic and with hearing aids that needed a tune-up, I blithely stood or sat and bowed my head at the appropriate time. It was a lovely service and such a delight to again hear the organ played for Hildegard. That reminds me of another story about her father. During the latter part of World War II, the Biblis parishioners were permitted to hold services and Herr Laubner (Hildegard's father) was told he could once again play the organ. French prisoners, who had been billeted on the outskirts of town, were allowed to attend. The German soldiers guarding them, were not interested in staying and went outside to smoke and to watch the exits. At one point during an organ interlude, Herr Laubner struck up "La Marseillaise" (French National Anthem). I don't remember if Hildegard said who stood, but the men were very touched and grateful. Should the soldiers guarding the church have known, it could have been a disaster for her family. My original intent was to have been a short, hand written Get Well note, but it got out of hand." It was this kind of character and courage that Hildegard wanted the new organ to symbolize by dedicating it to her dear father: Hugo V. Lubner.

I have been asked a number of times, "Is the church open during the day?" I reply, "Yes! The door closest to the Blessed Mother altar which opens to the parking lot is open until 3 pm every day." It is usually locked at that time for security purposes, but if enough parishioners want it open longer, it certainly can be arranged. I mention this because in Matthew Kelly's book, Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic, he writes that the first sign is: Prayer. On pages

54 & 55 he recommends that we have some guiet time every day to pray. In order to do this effectively we need a "quiet space." The church is one place that we are guaranteed quiet, especially during the day. Here is what he says. You may have read this already but it bears repeating: "If it is important to spend time in the quiet, it is also important to have quiet places to go to. In the Scriptures, when we read about Jesus going off to a quiet place, it does not say he went off looking for a quiet place. It says he went off to a quiet place. This presupposes that he knew where he was going. Perhaps while he was walking into the village earlier that day he noticed a place and thought to himself that it would be a perfect spot for some quiet time. In the same way, we all need our quiet places, places we can go to when we need to step back from the world. We need quiet places set apart from the hustle and bustle of our very noisy and busy modern lives. Again, this requires some intentionality. The world draws us toward noisy places, so quiet places can be harder and harder to find....My everyday quiet places include a number of churches and chapels close to my home, the rocking chair out on the back porch, the leather chair in my study, and the beach. Where is your favorite quiet place? When were you last there? Should you be thinking about going there more often? How would your life be different if you did?

The Stewardship Appreciation Dinner this weekend will bring together a kaleidoscope of volunteers who faithfully serve in a variety of ministries: Leadership, Stewardship, Liturgy, Service, Evangelization, Word (Faith Formation), and Community. These Seven Essential Elements of parish life constantly interrelate, each nurturing and supporting the other with the communal celebration of Sunday Eucharist at the center. As pastor, I am deeply grateful for all of our ministers. Mutual support is at the heart of our worship and outreach. Thank you so much for your abiding loyalty to the parish and openness to change and growth as we work together to improve the ways in which we minister.

The video presentation at all the Masses today will necessitate a shorter homily in order to have the widest exposure to the For Christ Forever Campaign. Some have already viewed the video during the parish general meetings. The video message of Bishop Kevin W. Vann outlines the case elements of the Campaign. The Campaign is designed to address a variety of needs throughout the Diocese. With your help we will provide funds for: The renovation and support of our future Christ Cathedral Campus; Catholic Education; Priests Retirement; 2013 Pastoral Services Appeal; and Local parish needs. I ask that you prayerfully consider the projects and ministries that will be supported by this appeal and what they are worth to our Church and our future. The success of this appeal is a vital component of our continuing ability to minister to God's people. Having seen this video, please consider your support with an open mind and heart. This is our parish, our spiritual home, but we are also an integral part of a much larger Church. If we act together as members of one family united in Christ's love, we will do great things.

Reading the morning paper recently I came across a quote that seemed to tie in with my recent birthday celebration. Written by a woman by the name of Frances Lear she writes: "I believe the second half of one's life is meant to be better than the first half. The first half is finding out how you do it. And the second half is enjoying it."

NOTES FROM MUSIC MINISTRY By Todd Helm, Music Director

We are so blessed to have many talented musicians involved in our music ministry at St. Juliana. The Spirit Group offers their talents every Sunday at 11:00. The Youth Band provides the music at the Sunday 5:00 Mass. Our wonderful choir sings regularly at 9:00 Mass. The next 2 weeks I'd like to profile the musicians who dedicate hours of time in order to enhance the liturgies at the Masses on Saturday at 5:00 pm, Sunday at 7:30 and 9:00, as well as numerous special celebrations, Holy Days, funerals and memorial services - our talented cantors. All volunteers, the cantors are also active members of our choir, which means they usually are pulling "double-duty" singing at 2 (or more) Masses each weekend. Here is a little background of 3 of these singers.

<u>Carol Blair</u> has been a cantor at St. Juliana since 2006. Prior to that, she spent 14 years as a weekly cantor at St. Mary's in Fullerton, and a cantor and choir member at St. Angela Merici. Originally from Fresno, Carol graduated from Fresno State University and spent many years singing in churches and community groups in that city. Carol was involved in the Buena Park Community Chorus until 2011 and is a 33-year employee of the Social Security Administration. She loves to sing and use her talent for the Lord who gave it to her.

Kimber Bentley Parks has been a cantor and a member of the adult choir at St. Juliana for over 20 years. She regularly cantors at her home church, Holy Name Catholic Church in Henderson, Ky, whenever she's visiting family. For the past 19 years, she has also participated in the music program at Garden Grove Seventh Day Adventist Church as a choir member, soloist and praise band member. Prior to St. Juliana, she was a cantor at St. Barbara's in Santa Ana for 10 years. She had no formal voice training until she was 30 years old, at which point she started singing soprano. One of her beloved voice teachers was Sarah McFerrin of Fullerton. She enjoys many creative activities from quilting to writing children's stories, and is married to Tim, the piano player.

<u>Teresa Raridan</u> has been a cantor at Saint Juliana for more than fifteen years. She also sings with Meritáge Vocal Arts Ensemble under the direction of Dr. Sheridan Ball. In addition to singing she serves as Secretary on the Board of Director for this organization. Teresa has worked for United Parcel Service for twenty-four years where she currently serves as a Finance Analyst.

What will we do with our portion of the campaign proceeds?

Support of Local Parish Projects

One of the major case elements of our *For Christ Forever* Campaign is the Support of our Local Parish projects.

Each parish and center in the Diocese of Orange County has been given a Total Campaign Goal, which is comprised of their 2013 Pastoral Services Appeal Goal and our *For Christ Forever* Campaign Goal.

Once a parish has reached its 2013 Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA) target in cash, 25% of the funds raised will remain at that parish for its own parish needs. 75% of all funds raised will help support our *For Christ Forever* Campaign. When a parish achieves its campaign target in cash, 50% of the funds will then remain at the parish for their own parish needs.

These Local Parish Projects can include maintaining parish and church structures, reducing parish debt, establishing endowments to generate income for the parish, pastoral ministries or schools and increasing personnel or resources for faith formation, social justice and outreach to the poor, needy and vulnerable.

St. Juliana Falconieri participation in the *For Christ Forever* Campaign:

Total Campaign Goal: \$1,287,473 2013 PSA Goal: \$109,000

After St. Juliana Falconieri reaches its 2013 PSA Goal of \$109,000 in cash, we will receive 25% of every dollar raised up to our Total Campaign Goal of \$1,287,473. Once we achieve our campaign goal in cash, we will receive 50% of every dollar raised.

Here at St. Juliana Falconieri, we have the potential to receive at least \$294,618 over the next four years.

We will use our proceeds to address the following needs:

Pay down the Parish Center Loan with the Diocese Repair the Church and Rectory Roofs

Our parish has been generous to our Diocese through the Pastoral Service Appeal in the past. Please keep in mind as you make your commitment, that the PSA will <u>not</u> be conducted separately in 2013.


waste. Raquel is very grateful to her sponsors for their help. This winter she and her children will sleep warm and dry and their belongings will be protected from mold.
