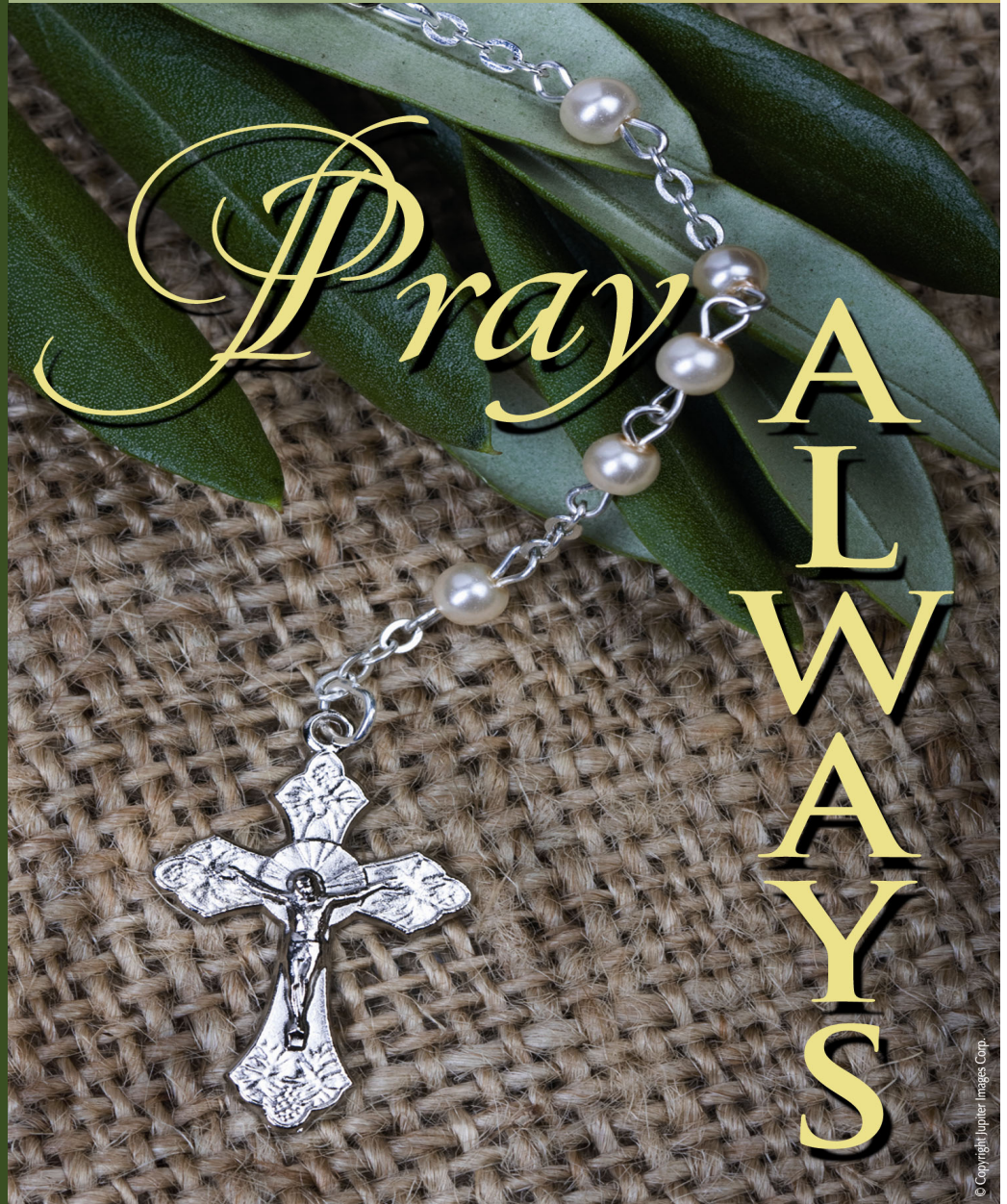

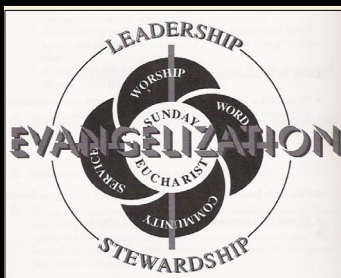

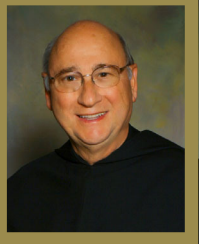

However, the DVD player worked well and the images were clearly seen. What I especially like about everyone's attention was the sincerity and willingness to listen and learn more about this exciting Campaign. Father Henri J. M. Nouwen in his book, *A Spirituality of Fundraising* writes: "Fundraising is also always a call to conversion. And this call comes to both those who seek funds and those who have funds. Whether we are asking for money or giving money we are drawn together by God, who is about to do a new thing through our collaboration (see Isa. 43:19). To be converted means to experience a deep shift in how we see and think and act. To be converted is to be clothed in our right mind, to come to ourselves the way the younger son did when he was starving far from his true home...Fundraising as ministry involves a real conversion."

Our high school ministry team conducted a very successful day-long retreat in the Parish Center last Sunday. The retreat was preceded by a day-long retreat on Saturday for the leaders. About 35 leaders participated along with 82 students in the first year program. The day concluded with the 5pm Sunday Mass with students, leaders, and team members worshipping together. Maura and Kerry Condon along with their auxiliary staff have excelled in creating a youth program that far exceeds the expectations of the Diocese. We are very proud of our religious and academic programs here at St. Juliana. Mike McHenry, Director of Faith Formation, is working diligently to schedule adult educational programs that are varied and far reaching. I am genuinely grateful for the active participation of the Knights in the life of the parish and all they do, especially when it is Festival time and at other parish events. NOTES FROM MUSIC MINISTRY

I enjoy attending Mass in the summer months when the choir is not singing as it allows me to approach the liturgy from the perspective of a member of the assembly. It is at this time that I can reflect on decisions I have made regarding hymn selection, listen to the balance of sound of cantors and organ, and see if there are any improvements that I can offer to enhance the music of the Mass. Something that has frustrated me when I am sitting in the congregation is not knowing which of the three Eucharistic Acclamations we are going to sing at the consecration. When I am in the choir, I am fully prepared, since the choir has a weekly musical Mass Guide with details of everything that is to be sung. To help remedy this, you may have noticed the additions to the hymn board with the first few words of the Acclamation. I hope this assists you with your singing of these beautiful responses. Thank you to Mark Augustin for making these signs.

On Sunday, October 27 at the 9:00am Mass, we will be singing music with a gospel flair. You will hear the extra energy of an electric bass and piano/organ duets, contemporary settings of hymns, and the choir offering the high-energy anthem "Until I Found The Lord" by Andre Thomas. If you enjoy this style of music, I invite you to join us on the 27th. If you prefer the more traditional music selections, you may want to attend Mass at 7:30am or Saturday at 5:00pm.

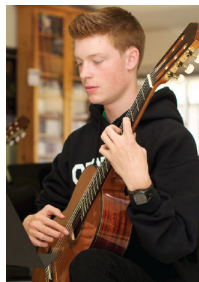
