

### FROM THE PASTOR



I received a phone call recently from Beverly Housman, the daughter of *Audrey Daigle*. Beverly called to inform me that her 80 year old mother died and would I put a notice in St. Juliana's parish bulletin. Audrey worked for many years as cook and housekeeper for Father Bob Vidal and a short time for Fa-

ther Jude. Her husband, Chet was a handyman and worked for the parish in maintenance. Let us remember Audrey in our prayers for her many years of service to the parish.

In a recent edition of the *Orange County Register* I happened upon a short announcement that the City of Fullerton will pay \$40,000 to allow the National Guard Armory on South Brookhurst Road, which serves as a homeless shelter from December through March, to be open to the homeless population up to four weeks sooner. The money will pay costs incurred by Mercy House, the nonprofit group that operates the shelter. Our Knights of Columbus Council has served the Armory for many years. The Knights are asking for your help not only to provide comfort to the homeless but to sort and deliver clothing and other necessities. If you are willing to devote extra time to this ministry and have the means to help in this effort, please contact the office at (714) 879-1965 or Grand Knight, Brian Burley at (714) 738-8036.

On a related topic, you may have heard of the Catholic Worker, *Isaiah House*. This Catholic based outreach organization in Santa Ana is committed to nonviolence, voluntary poverty, prayer, and hospitality for the homeless, exiled, hungry, and forsaken. The volunteers are always in need of helping hands to prepare food for those who seek shelter and nourishment. The Catholic Worker movement was founded by Peter Maurin and Dorothy Day during the Great Depression to aid the destitute and unemployed.

St. Juliana parishioners made a commitment about 10 years ago to give *Isaiah House* a helping hand on every second Friday of the month in preparing the evening meal. Parishioners have graciously given their time to prepare food and contributed clothing, monetary gifts, and accessories. Unfortunately, volunteers have diminished and now the six or seven who remain find it difficult to commit every month. There are months when we only have two or three volunteers, and sad to say, sometimes none. The ideal would be to have as many volunteers as possible to take turns with at least five to six at a time on the day we are assigned.

*Isaiah House* is located in the city of Santa Ana at 316 S. Cypress Ave. Volunteers leave from St. Juliana most of the time in carpools at 3:00 and return around 6:30pm.

I urge you to consider this worthwhile outreach organization. Three and a half hours of your time is needed to help prepare the food. Monetary gifts or food donations are accepted but not necessary. All the food accessories and ingredients are already provided and a designated individual at the house is assigned to guide you in what needs to be done. The main task is to prepare salads, vegetables and fruit. The meal is then served to about forty women at the house and kitchen clean-up follows. Other volunteers serve about 150 at the Civic Center.

Please contact Barbara Dietterle, the St. Juliana Coordinator at (714) 525-2208 or Deacon Gerhard, her assistant at (714) 870-5714 for more information or to volunteer. I plan on going the next second Friday.

This will be a busy weekend with the Capital Campaign Commitment Drive, the Knights of Columbus Pancake Breakfast and I.D. Drive, and World Mission Sunday (transferred from last week). It is definitely a "hard at work" weekend and I hope you will participate with an open heart and mind.

Celebrate Halloween as a Family. Take time to help your children understand the deeper significance of the All Saints/All Souls connection. Remember that All Saints is a holy day of obligation. Attending Mass as a family will emphasize the Catholic nature of the holiday, and you can include a visit to the family cemetery plot or the graves of deceased relatives to offer prayers and remembrances.

Please support the *Renee Bondi* Concert next Saturday and the *Young Ladies Institute (YLI) Nut Sale*. Both are good causes.

### NOTES FROM MUSIC MINISTRY By Phi Tran, Director of the Youth Band

When someone tells me, "I can't sing," I often repeat a quote I heard from an enthusiastically tone-deaf priest: "If God didn't

want you to sing, he wouldn't have given you a voice. And God doesn't care how well you sing, so why should anyone else around you?" He or she laughs at me as much as that congregation laughed at his saying, for they all knew it was true. God has blessed us with the ability to give our love and gratitude to Him in the form of our voices -- and not just by speaking, but by singing.



# ISAIAH HOUSE ~ CATHOLIC WORKER

Many of you may have heard of this Catholic based outreach organization called **Isaiah House or Catholic Worker** in Santa Ana, that is committed to nonviolence, voluntary poverty, prayer, and hospitality for the homeless, exiled, hungry, and forsaken. They are always in need of helping hands to prepare food for the unfortunates.

We the parish of St. Juliana Falconieri made a commitment about ten years ago to give them a helping hand every second Friday of the month in preparing food for an evening meal. Through the years we have had a number of parishioners who graciously gave their time to prepare food and also contributed clothing, monetary gifts, and other accessories. For the past three years our volunteers have diminished to about five to seven who have a difficult time committing every month; therefore, there are months where we only have two or three volunteers, and sometimes none. We need five to six volunteers every month!

The Isaiah House is located in the city of Santa Ana at 316 S. Cypress Ave. We leave from St. Juliana Church, **most of the time in carpools**, at 3:00 p.m. and return around 6:30 p.m.

We urge you to consider this worthwhile outreach organization. We are only asking for three and a half hours of your time to help prepare the food, no monetary gifts or food donations. All the food accessories and ingredients are already provided and a designated individual at the house is there to guide us in what needs to be done. Our main tasks are preparing salads, vegetables, and fruits. We also serve the meal to about 40 women at the house and do kitchen clean-up. Other volunteers serve about 150 at the civic center.
